# JANUARY 2021 | OLDTIMERS! Doing my best

As the COVID-19 lockdown continues, she stays connected and looks for ways to reach out

During this challenging COVID-19 lockdown, I have experienced a taste of what it's like to be in a remote community. All of our live, in-person AA meetings stopped. There were no diners or coffeehouses for hanging out before and after our meetings. We couldn't visit one another. Does this mean I live in a remote community?

I know our situation is temporary. Access to the abundance of our physical AA meetings at all hours will return. Until then, I have many privileges even during this pandemic. Luckily I have wonderful technical devices for reaching out and receiving help. I can read; I can write; I can listen to speaker tapes. And I have my Grapevine—our "meeting in print."

I've been sober quite a while now—yet I am still one drink away from a drunk. The practice and experience of relying on God and trying to practice these principles as best I can encourages me to keep the faith—especially now. How difficult it must be for many newcomers during this pandemic. I remember feeling as remote as an island when I was new and for quite a while after.

I try to remember our Three Legacies during this challenging time...

Unity: I am doing my best to reach out to others in our virtual meeting who are having a much harder time than me. I also try to put myself in the shoes of those who, under normal conditions, face barriers to hearing and carrying the AA message. I try to be mindful of the situations that might limit access, of the challenges of members speaking other languages, of alcoholics in nursing homes, of single parents who struggle with childcare, of those who can't find us, and of the loners who need a connection.

I think of prison inmates whose meetings can no longer be brought in by fellow AA members. From my own experience in service, I know how much these members look forward to AA meetings and how much they need them.

Service: I continue to pray to be helpful to the new person. As our cofounder Bill W. expresses in the chapter "A Vision for You," more will be revealed. God has guided me into service in ways I could not imagine on my own. I just have to stay open to God's creativity. "Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs." My affairs these days also include being mindful and listening to doctors and not putting anyone in danger through my actions. Meditating in the morning opens me in ways to be spontaneously helpful and thankful as opportunities arise.

Recovery: Sobriety is a gift, a miracle. One day at a time, I continue to rely on the God of my experience and understanding. To maintain this relationship and cultivate the AA way of life, I try to stay in fit spiritual condition. I can even be grateful for my shortcomings and failures, which bring me closer to God and others.

My morning prayers and meditation and my nightly review frame each day in the gift of 24 hours without needing to drink. My connection with a power that can keep me sober, especially now, under any and all conditions, gives me a sense of peace.

And on days when that peace is lost, as happens, I can share that experience with others, and maybe help someone else. Staying sober is a life-or-death proposition for me.

#### **Archives: Oral Histories**

We are ten months deep into a global pandemic. I know; this is not shocking to any of you. COVID-19 has seeped into the fabric of our lives. We wear masks at grocery stores and read countless signs about keeping our distance in public spaces. Even once safe AA has been impacted. Many meetings now take place virtually from our living rooms. For those gathering in-person, many meet outdoors with faces half covered and others sit far away from each other amidst the faint smell of disinfectant.


In one way or another, 2020 has been a year of change and loss for all of us. There has been change in our routines and loss of loved ones and winter traditions. We lost several people this year in our own AA community. Some of their stories went with them; tales of AA history lost to all, and we will likely lose more people—whether to this global pandemic or to time itself. Death will greet all of us at the end of this journey, but it does not have to take our stories with it. It does not have to take our history. We can preserve the laughter your group felt after staying up all night making sandwiches for a conference. We can record the tears your group shed after your meeting place closed. We can detail the anger over the informed group conscience vote you still disagree with. We can capture the words and voices and stories of your old-timers. I know sometimes it is hard to grasp the need for such measures when the lives of those we love still burn so brightly in the spaces we share, but if this year has taught me anything, it is that life is fragile and the time to preserve these stories is now.

One way to do this is through taking an Oral History where we record an interview with someone about their history in AA, preserving their experience, strength, and hope for those who have yet to "sit all the way down" in a meeting. During 2020, the Archives committee has been using virtual platforms and creativity to record stories before they are lost. 
