ARCHIVES CORNER

I was told in order to stay sober, get involved in the workings of AA. I joined the archives committee before I had two years of sobriety, not knowing anything about what they do. In the past year and a half I've learned a little bit more about the archives committee and am still learning. I try to listen and understand during our meetings and help out when I can.

One task I've helped with is to transcribe oral histories of oldtimers. Doing this showed me the importance of documenting the history of our past generations. The first history I transcribed was from a man, Larry Y, who had been sober longer than I've been alive. He spoke of things I haven't heard in the meetings, such as 1. "If you ain't interested in what we got my Big Book says you need to go drink some more" 2. "take the steps, not work them." 3. "the reason we're all in AA is we don't want to die drunk." Larry Y died sober last year and even after death he helped keep me sober and helped me understand the importance of the archives committee. Thank you Larry.

My commitment to our fellowship remains, I am grateful for the trust I have been given. An Archivist is charged with the care of the physical and intellectual integrity of our history.





Dear A.A. friends,

We in A.A. – here at G.S.O., along with the rest of the world – continue to experience an unprecedented situation. Without question, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our Fellowship, including our organized service structure, is facing enormous challenges, locally and globally. For many of us, the most prominent example is that, for the first time in the 85-year history of our Fellowship, we are navigating the lack of face-to-face meetings. While we have found creative ways to allow for the vital interaction between one alcoholic and another, and welcoming newcomers daily, it is clear that the health crisis has other farreaching consequences.

As we all adapt to the present reality of digital meetings, the question now is, "How do we responsibly practice self-support, our Seventh Tradition?" As we can no longer pass a physical basket, we are working to find ways to support the Fellowship at all levels, from our groups to Intergroups and Central Offices, from our Districts and Areas to the General Service Office itself.


The reality is that even though meetings, Twelfth Step services and operations have shifted to a virtual environment, expenses continue to accumulate during this crisis, which underscores the importance of practicing the Seventh Tradition. Through this crisis, however, we have witnessed the many ways in which the entire A.A. Fellowship has come together to provide ongoing support. Among them:

- Many home groups are still paying rent even though their meetings cannot convene.
 They are also providing online meetings on platforms that may have associated costs.
- Intergroup/Central Offices are still stocking needed literature and fielding Twelfth Step
 calls, redirecting A.A. members and those looking for recovery to online meetings.
- Area-level committees are working to keep channels open between the Fellowship and the delegates and board members that make up our General Service Conference, as well as to do public information, corrections and other service.

BEHIND THE MASK EXTENDING THE HAND OF A.A. DURING COVID

On Saturday, June 6, 2020, the Public Information, Cooperation with Professional Community of San Antonio Inter-Service held a video workshop to address the challenges that our groups are facing during the current pandemic. 51 members of our fellowship joined us, for the nearly 2-hour presentation, to explore how we, during times of social distance, can effectively extend the hand of A.A. to the newcomer.

Discussion centered around three questions. How do we enhance and maintain the newcomers' experience online, and in the rooms, during and after the meeting? Are we considering how guests and newcomers feel about social distance safety? Can prospective members find meetings?

As we navigated these questions our four panelists, Donita S. -Area 68/Panel 70 PI/CPC Chair, Aggie M-J. -GSR Morning Grace Group, Bill S. -GSR Turning Point Group, Dene H. -GSR Mostly Agnostics Group, provided insight and possibilities while sharing their experience, strength and hope. The membership in turn offered suggestions and guidance through their Group Conscience experiences. One of the most important pieces of information gleaned from the workshop was the need for accurate and updated information regarding your groups. It is important that your meeting dates, times and locations are properly recorded with CSO. The information that you provide is used to update the website and the meeting app and assists the newcomer in locating your meeting, whether it is a face to face meeting or an electronic meeting, utilizing applications such as Zoom or Google Meet. If they can't find you easily, they might easily remain lost!

Step 7: "Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings."

Step Seven is the shortest step and the one I feel most often overlooked or paid lip service. This is the step where we are instructed to make direct contact with our Higher Power. It requires willingness and true humility. Becoming aware of character defects in Steps five and six is humbling in itself. We carry that humility as we turn to our higher power and on our knees ask to have those imperfections taken from us. The seventh step prayer is powerful and covers all aspects of our being. Notice it says "all of me, good and bad." It's not simply about our negative traits. Humility takes over as we open our lives and our eyes to this power greater than ourselves and come to truly pursue a closer relationship. This step requires action. The character defects will not magically be lifted away. We must demonstrate willingness to change our actions, reactions and behaviors. Then with the help of our Higher Power make those changes in our daily lives. We ask for His action but we must do the footwork.

Tradition Seven: "Every AA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

The Traditions checklist includes this question which we might all ask ourselves: Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) (also Area 68 and Inter Service) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when I tanked in a barroom?

Much has been written and discussed about this Tradition in the past several months – from the strains on all our entities with lower than average (67%) contributions due to a lack of "live" meetings and unemployment. Additionally, GSO has drawn down the prudent reserve by \$3 Million, due to the cancellation of the International Convention, which will be off-set by higher literature prices if contributions aren't sufficient to repay it.

I know that no matter what, I always found the money to drink. It was #3 line in my budget after rent and utilities. Is my 7th Tradition contribution to the Fellowship responsible for my life today ranked that high in today's budget, or does it come in somewhere underneath entertainment? Has my budgeted amount increased over time as have my other bills? Do I fully understand how my contribution is used to carry the message?

I have full faith and confidence that my Higher Power will see us all through this, but I know that if I am really practicing this program, then I am not leaving it up to "someone else" to solve the financial issues. My few little dollars that I mail to GSO, CSO and my home group make me feel that I am a part of AA. I am helping to save a seat for the still suffering alcoholic just as someone did for me. If nothing else, our "crisis" has resulted in many more people becoming much better informed about AA and that is a good thing! Keep the conversation going!



Concept VII

The Conference recognizes that the Charter and the Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby fully empowered to manage and conduct all of the world service affairs of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is further understood that the Conference Charter itself is not a legal document: that it relies instead upon the force of tradition and the power of the A.A. purse for its final effectiveness.

This Concept attempts to clarify the relationship and "balance of powers" between the Conference and the General Service Board. "This . . . may look like the collision of an irresistible force with an immovable object." On the one hand, "the board is invested with complete legal power over A.A.'s funds and services; on the other hand the Conference is clothed with such great influence and financial power it could overcome the legal rights of the board. "Thus, the practical power of the Conference is, in the final analysis, superior to the legal power of the board. This superior power derives from the traditional influence of the Conference Charter itself; from the fact that the delegates chosen by the groups always constitute more than two-thirds of the Conference members"; and finally from the ability of the delegates to cut off financial support by the groups. "Theoretically, the Conference is an advisory body only; but practically speaking, it has all the ultimate power it may ever need." The Conference "recommends" — though its recommendations have the force of directives to the board. The board executes these recommendations. The board does have the legal authority to veto a Conference recommendation — but in actual practice, it never has done so. As Bill tactfully puts it, the trustees "simply refrain from using their legal right to say 'no' when it would be much wiser, all things considered, to say 'yes.'

"If . . . the Conference will always bear in mind actual rights, duties, responsibilities and legal status of the General Service Board, and if the trustees . . . will constantly realize that the Conference is the real seat of ultimate service authority . . . neither will be seriously tempted to make a 'rubber stamp' out of the other . . . In this way, grave issues will always be resolved and harmonious cooperation will be the general rule."

No matter how unreasonable others may seem, I am responsible for not reacting negatively. Regardless of what is happening around me I will always have the prerogative, and the responsibility, of choosing what happens within me. I am the creator of my own reality. When I [review my day], I know that I must stop judging others. If I judge others, I am probably judging myself. Whoever is upsetting me most is my best teacher. I have much to learn from him or her, and in my hearts, I should thank that person


