Where do Central Service Offices Fall in the A.A. Service Structure?

Who knew that Intergroups/Central Office representatives met annually for a conference? I had zero idea. To be sure, that means our dependable Central Office managers (Jim and Virginia B.!) participate annually to learn what other central offices are doing to help carry the A.A. message. The first Intergroup/Central Office/A.A.W.S./A.A.G.V. Seminar (great title, right?) was held in 1986 with 98 representatives from 82 Intergroups attending! The purpose of the seminar was to provide a forum for discussions and solutions to those who work the A.A. frontlines - answering the A.A. Hotline in every city, managing the websites, selling A.A. literature, chips, etc. These conferences have continued to take place annually for thirty-five years, with the primary theme being how can the various Central Offices help carry the message of A.A. in their area. Every city and metro area in the U.S. generally has at least one Central Office like ours (now numbering over 500). They are responsible for maintaining and updating the meeting roster, stocking literature and chips, keeping the community informed, managing the website and MUCH more.

However, there is a slight issue, these offices and representatives are not *technically* part of the General Service Conference in New York and don't fall in the official G.S.O. Service Structure, per se. While both service entities fulfill the same mission – aiding suffering alcoholics – there are times when different perspectives and lack of communication may seem at odds and hinder A.A.'s primary purpose. In September 2020, the Des Moines, Iowa central office hosted a virtual ICOAA (Intergroup/Central Office A.A.) seminar. Quoting directly from the seminar, "ICOAA and G.S.O. really should be partners, we have way more things in common than we do differences, but we need to tell G.S.O. what we are doing and G.S.O. needs to tell us. It's a two-way street." "One of the pain points we've experienced for years is one-way communication with New York. Several decisions are made at the General Service Conference that impacts our offices," says the San Francisco Intergroup manager.

So, this begs the question, why are Intergroups and Central Offices not officially represented at the General Service Conference? After all, structurally, intergroups predate the creation of G.S.O. and the A.A. Service Structure. Not to mention, Intergroups and Central Offices are the ones generally implementing the decisions made at the G.S.O. level. They are really the A.A. boots-on-the-ground doing 12-step work in every city and community! Central Offices have long talked about lack of representation at G.S.O. There are liaisons between the two that exchange information and ideas, but sometimes things get lost in translation (especially with alcoholics).

A statement from a G.S.O. member reads, "Nobody argues that we don't have the same job of carrying the message, and A.A. World Services understands that Intergroups feel they are not being heard. We are taking actions to demonstrate that we are listening to their concerns. If there is a common theme from this recent seminar, it's this: to discover what is possible when we really start working together, understanding our differences and making them work for A.A. as a whole."

Perhaps now that A.A. is changing, for example with the introduction of thousands of online meetings which are NOT going away, probably ever, now is the time for the best communication possible between all service entities. There are those that wholeheartedly believe the service structure must remain as-is and strictly believe central offices are not "part of A.A." I disagree. I tend to think the best solution is for the ICOAAs to be allowed to send a delegate to voice their concerns at G.S.O. each year in New York – this will, in my opinion, help us serve our primary purpose with direct communication and coordination. Carrying the A.A. message is our ONLY OBJECTIVE, we ought to consider every single opportunity and angle we have!


