**Accessibilities:** This new committee meets online each third Sunday and is currently refining their purpose statement. Most of its initial work will be focused on getting accessibilities information to the CSO. We encourage all members to attend the monthly meeting and share ideas.

**Archives:** San Antonio Archives is currently working on the "Things We Cannot Change" tribute to members we have lost during the pandemic. As always, we can assist in collecting the oral histories of Old Timers and group histories. This committee meets the first Thursday of the month online at 6 pm.

**Corrections (CFC):** The Texas Department of Criminal Justice is starting to allow in-person meetings at correctional facilities, but it is a slow process to get our schedule back on track, and we are looking for willing volunteers. Recently, the CFC committee created DVDs that can be viewed in prisons while maintaining member anonymity. We have completed over fifty hours worth of material, with much more planned. ## MONTHLY EDUCATION LIAISON REPORT

## CENTRAL SERVICE OFFICE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Some A.A. members must take prescribed medication for medical problems, including mental health problems. As a sober and active A.A. members, no doubt some of us have seen and heard other members give medical advice, with best intentions, about which medications one should or should not take. I thought it would best to use this opportunity in this Education Report to address the issue of medications and other drugs and A.A. World Services' advice on such. These paragraphs are sourced from A.A. World Service approved literature, specifically a pamphlet published in 2018.

Cooperation with the professional community has been an objective of Alcoholics Anonymous since its beginnings. Professionals who work with alcoholics share a common purpose with Alcoholics Anonymous: to help the alcoholic stop drinking and lead a healthy, productive life. As noted in the introduction, some A.A. members must take prescribed medications. However, our experience indicates that the misuse of prescription medication can threaten the achievement and maintenance of sobriety. Some suggestions below are offered to help A.A. members find the right balance and minimize the risk of relapse:

- No A.A. member should "play doctor"; all medical advice and treatment should come from a qualified physician.
- As an A.A. member, be completely honest with your doctor and yourself about the way you take your medicine. Let your doctor know if you skip doses or take more medicine than prescribed.
- Let your doctor know at once if you have a desire to take more medicine or if you have side effects that make you feel worse.
- Be sensitive to warnings about changes in your behavior when you start a new medication or when your dose is changed.

Experience suggests that while some prescribed medications may be safe for most non-alcoholics when taken according to a doctor's instructions, it is possible that they may affect the alcoholic in a different way. It is often true that these substances create dependence as devastating as dependence on alcohol. It is well known that many sedatives have an action in the body similar to the action of alcohol. When these drugs are used without medical supervision, dependence can readily develop.

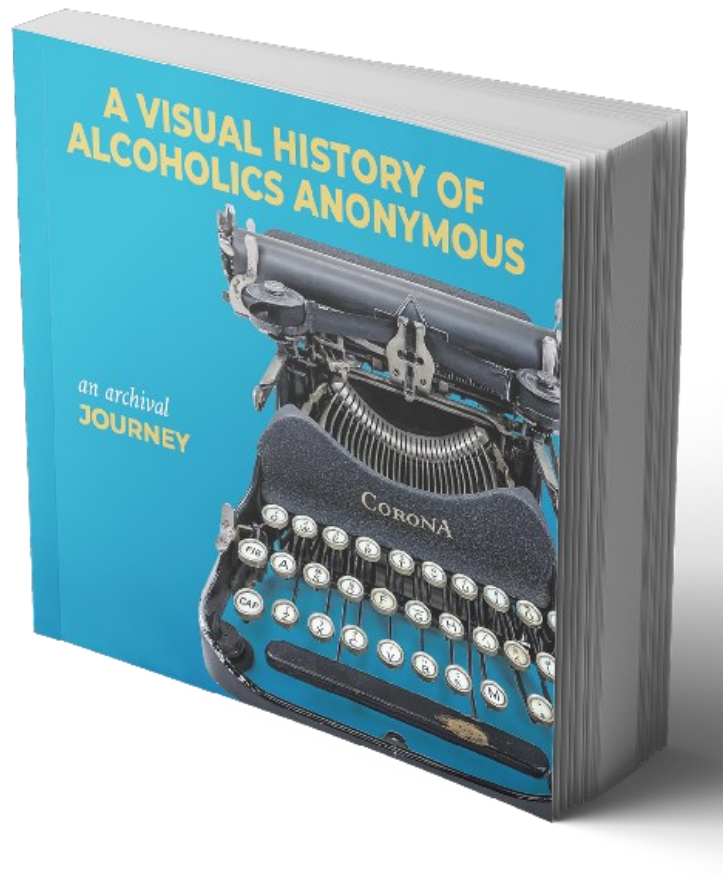
A.A. World Services recognizes that alcoholics are not immune to other diseases. Some of us have had to cope with depressions that can be suicidal; schizophrenia that sometimes requires hospitalization; bipolar disorder, and other mental and biological illnesses. Also among us are diabetics, epileptics, members with heart trouble, cancer, allergies, hypertension, and many other serious physical conditions. Because of the difficulties that many alcoholics have with drugs, some members have taken the position that no one in A.A. should take any medication. While this position has perhaps prevented relapses for some, it has meant disaster for others. A.A. members and many of their physicians have described situations in which depressed patients have been told by A.A.s to throw away the pills, only to have depression return with all its difficulties, sometimes resulting in suicide. We have heard, too, from members with other conditions, including schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, epilepsy, and others requiring medication, that well-meaning A.A. friends discourage them from taking any prescribed medication. Unfortunately, by following a layperson's advice, the sufferers find that their conditions can return with all their previous intensity. On top of that, they feel guilty because they are convinced that "A.A. is against pills." It becomes clear that just as it is wrong to enable or support any alcoholic to become readdicted to any drug, it is equally wrong to deprive any alcoholic of medication, which can alleviate or control other disabling physical and/or emotional problems.

It's important for members who are struggling with issues other than alcoholism to understand that A.A. approves of and encourages cooperation with medical professionals to address these issues. In fact, page 133 of the Big Book reads, "*God has abundantly supplied this world with fine doctors, psychologists and practitioners of various kinds. Do not hesitate to take your health problems to such persons.*" If you feel you are struggling with issues other than alcohol, AAWS encourages you to seek medical advice if possible. If you feel you are abusing prescribed or over-the-counter medication, please seek medical help and be honest with your doctor (probably let your sponsor know too!). I am not speaking on behalf of anyone other than myself and I am just sharing approved literature from A.A.org – thank you for reading!

**THINGS WE CANNOT CHANGE: MEMBERS REMEMBERED**

I remember all of them and what they taught me and what they gave me. Harry, Billy, Rudy, Leonard, Tim, Jerry, and many more after all these years – these old timers each contributed to my sobriety and my emergence as a decent human being. I felt their losses as much as any mentor or family member in my life. What they gave to me I try to pass on to others, because that's what I've been instructed to do. Where would our program be without these voices in our heads still guiding us each and every day?
