It All Comes Out In the Wash

My husband, David, and I met in AA and were married three years ago. In May of this year, we went to Oklahoma City, so David could have a liver transplant. The transplant and the two years leading up to it were difficult for both of us, and although I attended meetings as regularly as I could and talked to people whenever possible, something was missing. I was not as close to God as I should be, and I was not getting to as many meetings as I needed. While David was in the hospital, our health insurance was cancelled, and our dog died. I was beginning to feel as if God didn't like me anymore.

A few days later, I took my clothes out of the washer only to find big bleach splotches all over them. An almost-new pair of khaki pants looked especially awful. After everything I had been through, this little thing was the straw that broke the camel's back. I cried, screamed, and yelled. Why had I suddenly become God's favorite thing to pick on?

When I calmed down, I decided to soak the pants in bleach, because it couldn't make them any worse. I soaked them for an hour, rinsed them, and put them in the dryer. When I took the pants out, I couldn't believe it. They were a soft yellow color. They were beautiful. It was hard to believe it was the same pair of pants.

When I walked through the doors of AA, I was like those pants. I had big splotchy places on my soul. I felt as if I were ruined and useless. I was sure I was of no earthly value to anyone, especially God. As I began soaking in recovery, everything (the meetings, my sponsor, the Steps, and the Traditions) worked together to bleach the stains on my soul away. As I learned to care about other people, God, and myself, I began to notice a change in me.

One day I walked past a mirror in a restaurant and did a double take. I did not recognize my own reflection. I hadn't changed much physically. I had lost ten pounds, but I was basically the same--except for my eyes. There was life in my eyes, a fire and excitement for living I had not seen in them since early childhood.

As I looked at my yellow pants that day, tears came to my eyes, and the pain and fear of just a few hours earlier were washed away. I had been so busy focusing on the blotches (Would my husband die? How would we pay our bills? Was it my fault the dog died?) that I had almost forgotten the bleach. The answer to all my worries was as close as my next prayer. I had spent so much time complaining about God picking on me that I hadn't taken the time to ask for his help.

Concept Three's short version reads, "To insure effective leadership, we should endow each element of AA--the Conference, the General Service Board and its service corporations, staffs, committees and executives--with a traditional 'Right of Decision.'"

In other words, so that everyone in service can function efficiently, each is entrusted with a Right of Decision.

However, none should abuse this privilege by: 1) failing to consult the proper people for advice regarding a major decision; 2) delaying to make a report describing the outcome of an important AA vote; or 3) exceeding one's clearly defined authority. If any of the above situations should occur, there are ways to remedy it. For instance, if services at Grapevine, Inc. or World Services, Inc. founder, the trustees can appoint better directors and hire better workers; if the trustees exceed their authority, the delegates can censure them; and if the General Service Conference functions poorly, the AA groups can elect more effective delegates.

Membership to the CFC is open to any AA member. We want to be of assistance to CFC Representatives from local groups as you serve as the link between your group and the CFC, providing an important communication exchange.



The purpose of the CFC is to:



1. Assist and coordinate the efforts of individual AA members and groups m San Antonio who want to carry the AA message to inmates.

2. Provide AA literature to inside AA members and groups. (Big Books, 12 and 12's, and Daily Reflections.)

3. Facilitate a "sponsor by mail" service to offer inside AA member's written communication with outside members, which is especially important if there is no AA meeting in their facility. The correspondence is handled though a Post Office Box, so personal information and anonymity are protected.

4. Provide outside AA contacts for inside AA members who are about to be released from their facility and help aid their transition to free world AA meetings.

5. Serve as a contact for correctional facility administrators to encourage cooperation and communication.

 Inform outside AA members and groups of the vital need for CFC volunteers via regular CFC meetings, workshops, and attendance at area events.


We know many are excited about the International Convention and eager for detailed information. As the time gets closer, additional information about the Convention and Detroit, our host city, will be provided.


