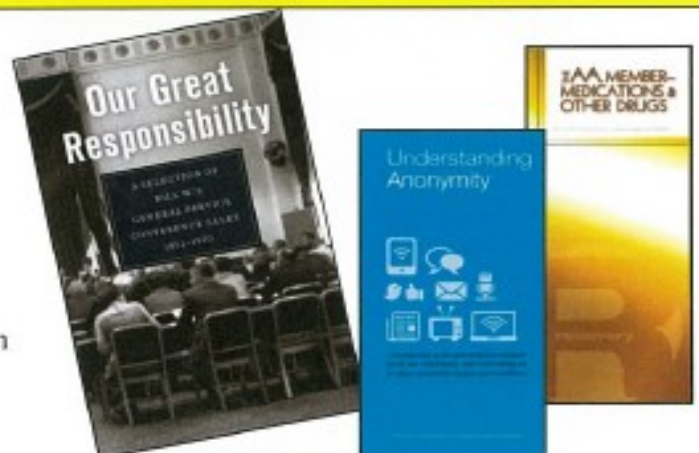

# A GUIDE TO BEST PRACTICES FOR A DIGITAL 7TH TRADITION

---

Online meeting spaces make it difficult to “pass the basket.” Some groups have set up digital contribution accounts with services like Venmo, PayPal, Google Pay, etc. to deal with this problem. Now might be a good time to review an essential piece of AA literature, “Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix.” Each group is autonomous and might consider taking a group conscience on whether digital contributions are an option, and which platform (or mix of platforms) best suits their groups’ needs. But first, why collect 7th Tradition for an online meeting?

## **Our regular meeting locations still have operating expenses...**

Our meetings facilities may rely on our regular rent to help pay their rent, utilities, and employees. Meeting supplies will still be needed when our meetings reopen – coffee, paper products, literature, refreshments. And after an extended closure, we may experience a large influx of people who are motivated to re-join the fellowship in person.

## **Central Office and the General Service Office still have operating expenses such as...**

Websites – which we may now rely on more than ever!

Phone lines, rent and insurance on office space

Utility and other ongoing expenses

Paid Special Workers who deserve our continued support. Their compensation is crucial to their ability to serve us.

## **Our Districts and Areas and H&I still have expenses**

Regular expenses to support the work of committees and events that will take place when the crisis has passed are still there.

Web services support for groups

Expenses for venues for events that have been cancelled may still need to be met, since any income from the event won’t be there to support the pre-payment of reservations, cancellation fees, etc. The expense of re-arranging for venues to reschedule events is very real.

Let’s continue to support these folks during the crisis.

We realize that even though the immediate need for virtual connections is relatively inexpensive, the real expenses of our fellowship continues. Please consider continuing to practice our 7th Tradition and make contributions to the service entities that support your group.



***Step 6: "Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character."***

We must be willing to continue the process of thorough self-examination that we started in Step 4, and to continue discussing our findings with trusted others as we learned in Step 5. We must be willing to reconsider all of our habitual thoughts and behaviors in light of the character defects that we are beginning to recognize: are we really being nice, or are we being passively aggressive? We must be willing to acknowledge the harmful consequences of some behaviors and attitudes that we've learned to rely on, such as acting out anger to get our way. And we must be willing to keep an open mind to learning new and better ways of doing things, and in letting others show us how.

How do we know that we're willing?

By doing it.



***Tradition 6: An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose***

Tradition Six also enjoins the group never to go into business nor ever to lend the AA name or money credit to any "outside" enterprise, no matter how good. Strongly expressed is the opinion that even clubs should not bear the AA name; that they ought to be separately incorporated and managed by those individual AAs who need or want clubs enough to financially support them. We would thus divide the spiritual from the material, confine the AA movement to its sole aim, and ensure (however wealthy as individuals we may become) that AA itself shall always remain poor. We dare not risk the distractions of corporate wealth. They have become certainties, absolute verities for us.

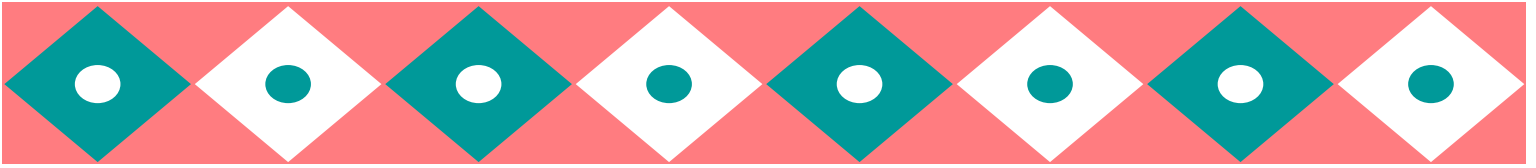
Thank God, we AAs have never yet been caught in the kind of religious or political disputes which embroil the world of today. But we ought to face the fact that we have often quarreled violently about money, property, and the administration thereof. Money, in quantity, has always been a baleful influence in group life. Let a well-meaning donor present an AA group with a sizable sum and we break loose. Nor does trouble abate until that group, as such, somehow disposes of its bankroll. This experience is practically universal. "But," say our friends, "isn't this a confession of weakness? Other organizations do a lot of good with money. Why not AA?"

Of course, we of AA would be the first to say that many a fine enterprise does a lot of good with a lot of money. To these efforts money is usually primary; it is their lifeblood. But money is not the lifeblood of AA. With us, it is very secondary. Even in small quantities, it is scarcely more than a necessary nuisance, something we wish we could do without entirely. Why is that so?

We explain that easily enough; we don't need money. The core of AA procedure is one alcoholic talking to another, whether that be sitting on a curbstone, in a home, or at a meeting. It's the message, not the place; it's the talk, not the alms. That does our work. Just places to meet and talk, that's about all AA needs. Beyond these, a few small offices, a few secretaries at their desks, a few dollars apiece a year, easily met by voluntary contributions. Trivial indeed, our expenses! Nowadays, the AA group answers its well-wishers saying: "Our expenses are trifling. As good earners, we can easily pay them. As we neither need nor want money, why risk its hazards? We'd rather stay poor. Thanks just the same!

*Concept 6 On behalf of A.A. as a whole, our General Service Conference has the principal responsibility for the maintenance of our world services, and it traditionally has the final decision respecting large matters of general policy and finance. But the Conference also recognizes that the chief initiative and the active responsibility in most of these matters should be exercised primarily by the Trustee members of the Conference when they act among themselves as the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.*

What this Concept is teaching me once again, that the responsibility of Alcoholics Anonymous belongs to the Groups, the Group elect their representatives who elect an Delegate and the Delegates with the Trustees make up the General Service Conference. This conference is designed to represent all Groups and make sure their voice is heard. However, the Conference does recognize the day to day operations of the Fellowship rest with the Trustees. The Conference does review decisions made by the Trustees and can and occasionally does override them. This is another example of how Bill and the old timers set the structure in place to make sure AA is well represented and no one Group has a “seat of power”

No matter how unreasonable others may seem, I am responsible for not reacting negatively. Regardless of what is happening around me I will always have the prerogative, and the responsibility, of choosing what happens within me. I am the creator of my own reality. When I [review my day], I know that I must stop judging others. If I judge others, I am probably judging myself. Whoever is upsetting me most is my best teacher. I have much to learn from him or her, and in my hearts, I should thank that person

#### ARCHIVES FOR NIGHTCAP

In February I approached two women after a meeting to ask if they had any interest in providing their oral history to add to the SA Archives. The matching looks of shock and dismay on their faces said everything I needed to know. I, too, had no idea what it meant to give an oral history until I spent more than six months sitting in Archives Committee meetings and absorbing endless amounts of information.

An oral history is YOUR story, recorded by a trained member of the archives committee and added to a digital library. It differs from a speaker meeting in that it is an intimate one-on-one setting where you share your testimony and experience of AA. Every recorded oral history is available at CSO for members of the fellowship to listen to at their leisure. The San Antonio collection dates back to 2008 with more than 100 testimonies.

If you or a friend in the program have more than 30 years of continuous sobriety, are over 75 years old or in compromised health, please make contact with someone on the committee. By joining our efforts to collect these testimonies, you are helping to conserve AA history for the present and future generations.

## CSOR MINUTES-MAY 2020

### Board Liaison – Susan

New Web site is about to launch – new features and will be able to print out directories from the web page. The board was able to review the site and was very happy with it.

The Board voted – to accept a PPP loan (\$13,000 at 1% interest). It was a decision that had to be decided that night. There were 4 in favor and 2 against. Declining votes were David and Tamara.

Cindy questioned about the vote. Jim accepted the loan and now the groups need to decide whether to keep the money or give it back. Oscar stated that this was considered a loan, not a contribution. It is not a gift. Bruce: this is a business loan to keep CSO running.

Karen: this is a prudent reserve in case we need it eventually.

Eric: Is CSO hurting for funds? Jim: no are okay right now. We have no idea what the future is going to bring. There's no money coming in right now. Weekend in SA brought in good funds last year. Do we have money in savings? \$50,000 is in savings.

### Financial Report - Don

Money is down 10% for April. There have been \$2,000 sales out of CSO last month - \$12,000 last year. There's uncertainty as to how long this will go. The money will be held in a separate account in the event it is needed for salaries and others.

Bruce: when budget was configured for this year did not consider that the weekend in SA will happen.

Cindy – the bottom line, is this a violation of tradition for outside contribution. Called for a vote – but the groups need to direct the CSOR's for a vote.

Bruce – it is a loan, not a contribution. Paula agrees.

David voted against because this is bordering on outside contributions. Tamara voted against it due to outside contributions.
