ARCHIVES CORNER

Archives

In 1935 there was Bill. Then Doctor Bob. Shortly, the man in the bed. The fellowship grew slowly, one recovering drunk at a time. Eventually, there was a small growing group in Akron and a similar bunch in New York. They all knew they had to codify this miracle if they were going to help others stop. But there were so many opinions and ideas (among drunks?). In 1939, after much haggling and back and forth, our beloved Big Book was printed, describing and preserving a word of mouth approach to sobriety.

According to Bill, “Every one of the new developments (in A.A.) has, lying just underneath, an enormous amount of dramatic incident and experience – stories galore. The hard thing to lay hold of is the atmosphere of the whole proceedings and the anecdotal material that will make the early experience alive.”

Even with a Big Book and 12X12, it has been long-timers passing on the program one alcoholic to another that has kept thousands sober. But Bill early on recognized the need to preserve the history of the process to keep outsiders from defining our fellowship, because sometimes non-involved observers tell a story with a biased perspective.

In 1957, Bill said: “We are trying to build up extensive records which will be of value to a future historian. It is highly important that the factual material be placed in our files in such a way that there can be no substantial distortion. We want to keep enlarging on this idea for the sake of the full length histories to come.”

In January 1971, the General Service Board formed the trustees' Archives Committee. Its mission was “to give the fellowship a sense of its own past and the opportunity to study it (and) keep the record straight so that myth does not predominate over fact.”

Your CSO Archives Committee is committed to the same goals. We meet on the first Thursday each month. We would love to have you join us to help us carry on those efforts. Call me at (210) 508-7682 to get involved.

Step 11 "Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out

This is a great step, first, because it brings us into a prayer life. Back in step #3, we made a decision to turn our life and will over to the care of God. In step #11, we receive our orders!! Let us break this step down and discover how it is both simple and profound. We are seeking something, seeking to improve our conscious contact with God. What does that mean? To me it means He is not in the far blue yonder, beyond reach, but right here, close where I can talk to Him and listen to Him (the Bible states that He is closer than hands and feet, and that is most close!). So, I am seeking to make this contact through Prayer and Meditation. What does this mean? To me, Prayer is talking to God, and Meditation is listening to Him! The good Lord endowed us with one mouth and two ears, which should suggest something to us!! We are enjoined – **"Be Still"** – and that is how we should be while listening! The answers surely will come if we but listen. Now, the step tells us what to pray for.

"Only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out." Since we submitted ourselves and turned our will and life over to the care of God in phase #2 – now we ask for His orders and strength to carry them out. We are promised that He will never expect anything from us that He won't give us the power to execute.

Now then, do you see any place in the step thus far to suggest we pray for sobriety? Of course not, and it is absolutely unnecessary – you HAVE sobriety. **Thank Him for it** – but it is pointless to pray for what you already have. **The 11th step states very plainly how to pray and what to pray for!!**

Tradition 11

Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films."

So the Eleventh Tradition stands sentinel over the lifelines, announcing that there is no need for self-praise, that it is better to let our friends recommend us, and that our whole public relations policy, contrary to usual customs, should be based upon the principle of attraction rather than promotion. Shot-in-the-arm methods are not for us — no press agents, no promotional devices, no big names. The hazards are too great. Immediate results will always be illusive because easy shortcuts to notoriety can generate permanent and smothering liabilities.

More and more, therefore, are we emphasizing the principle of personal anonymity as it applies to our public relations. We ask of each other the highest degree of personal responsibility in this respect. As a movement we have been, before now, tempted to exploit the names of our well-known public characters. We have rationalized that other societies, ever the best, do the same. As individuals, we have sometimes believed that the public use of our names could demonstrate our personal courage in the face of stigma, so lending power and conviction to new stories and magazine articles.

But these are not the allures they once were. Vividly, we are becoming aware that no member sought to describe himself in full view of the general public as an AA, even for the most worthy purpose, lest a perilous precedent be set which tempt others to do likewise for purposes not so worthy.

We see that on breaking anonymity by press, radio, or pictures, any one of us could easily transfer the valuable name of Alcoholics Anonymous over onto any enterprise into the midst of any controversy.

So it is becoming our code that there are things that no AA ever does, lest he divert AA from its sole purpose and injure our public relations. And thereby the chances of those sick ones yet to come.

To the million alcoholics who have not yet heard our AA story, we should ever say, "Greetings and welcome. Be assured that we shall never weaken the lifelines which we float out to you. In our public relations we shall, God willing, keep the faith."

Concept 11

In Concept XI, Bill explains in great detail the inner workings of the daily operations of A.A. – as it was in 1962. As A.A. has grown and changed, many of the descriptions would be different today, and some of the issues that are addressed are no longer relevant. Still, the full text is valuable as an historical document, and many of the principles still apply.

Underlying our service structure, there is another, internal structure consisting of the non-trustee members of the trustees' committees; the non-trustee directors of the two operating boards, and the executives and staff members.

"Members of this group," declares Bill, "not only support the leadership of the trustees: they share leadership with them."

Just how do we share leadership effectively? How are our other workers to interact with each other?

In Concept XI, Bill envisions both delegation and cooperation. He describes the composition, functions and relationships of 1.) the standing committees of the General Service Board, 2.) its subsidiary operating boards, 3.) the General Service Office and 4.) the A.A. Grapevine

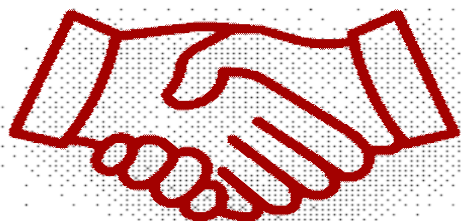

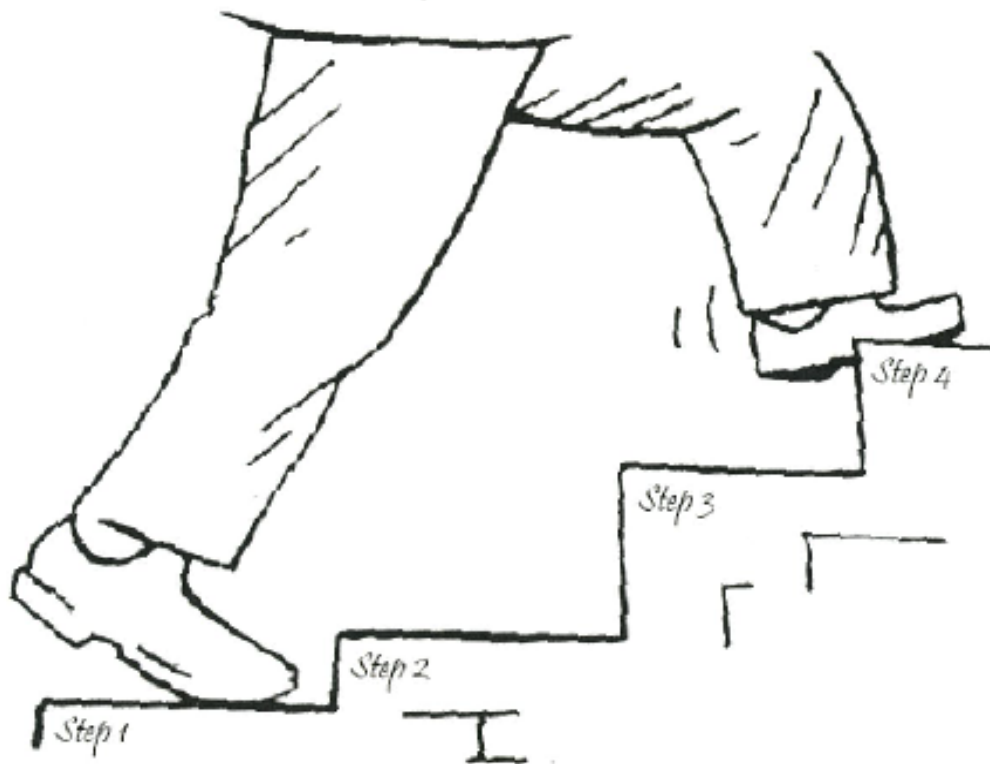
