Step 10: *"Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it."*

This is a step that I do daily as long as I choose to stay healthy and grow spiritually. This will be a lifetime practice. This step took some time for me to apply it to my daily living. It did not come easy. At first it seemed cumbersome and time consuming. It is about being aware of my actions and their consequences. To stop the tornado that my emotions can create before it gets in my way of living peacefully.

The daily review means that each day I will answer these questions. Was I resentful, dishonest or afraid? Do I owe anyone an apology for something I have done or said that day? What could I do better tomorrow? I actually write those five questions down and answer them.

The Pandemic came this year and changed my world. Everyday there is a challenge to maintain serenity, to avoid being rude to those who have a job to do and do not meet my expectations of how they should be doing their job. Learning to have empathy for all who are losing their loved ones in the middle of this pandemic and those who cannot visit with loved ones, and all of the other that is going on in our world today. It can be a scary place right now. This step helps me to change how I live my life and correct my mental attitude.

Tradition Ten Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the AA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

This is one of my favorite traditions. Having belonged to other organizations that publicly expressed opinions I sometimes disagreed with, I was relieved when I was a newcomer to find that AA stayed out of such controversies, and I was not obliged to support or defend any AA social, political, or religious view. Moreover, I saw that not adhering to Tradition Ten might easily lead us to violate other traditions. Public arguments about outside issues could divide rather than unify us, restrict the autonomy of our groups, divert us from our primary purpose, and lead us to anonymity beaks – all of which would damage AA and hinder our ability to carry our message of hope to the still suffering alcoholic.

But, what about when AA itself is criticized and especially if there is little basis for the criticism?

Shouldn't we defend AA? Apparently not. As Bill W himself said,

"Almost without exception it can be confidently estimated that our best defense in these situations would be no defense whatever — namely, complete silence at the public level. Unreasonable people are stimulated all the more by opposition. If in good humor we leave them strictly alone, they are apt to subside the more quickly."*

Over the years, my sponsors have suggested I try applying this same principle of no defense when personally criticized, and it has helped me avoid many unnecessary conflicts in my family, workplace, and community. So, I remain as grateful today for this tradition as when I first came into AA.

Concept 10 – **Every service responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority** – the scope of such authority to be always well defined whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws

Concept X challenges our ability to match service responsibility with equal authority so that a trusted servant can fulfill the well-defined tasks expected of that member. It is always important to carefully select members of committees, elected officers, or any other doing the work of AA so that we have the best qualified.

This is the main reason we need to choose our trusted servants with thought and prudence. They act for us, occasionally make decision for us. This is in their job description. Above all they are going the extra mile for us and deserve our support.

DR. BOB EXPLAINS HIS UNDERSTANDING OF AA ANONYMITY

(Dr. Bob And The Good Oldtimers: Pages 264 & 265)

"As far as anonymity was concerned we knew who we were. It wasn't only A.A., but our social life. All of our lives seemed to be spent together. We took people home with us to dry out. The Cleveland group had the names, addresses, and phone numbers of all the members," said Warren. "In fact, I remember Dr. Bob saying,

'If I got up and gave my name as Dr. Bob S., people who needed help would have a hard time getting in touch with me.'"

Warren recalled, "He [Dr. Bob] said there were two ways to break the Anonymity Tradition: (1) by giving your name at the public level of press or radio; (2) by being so anonymous that you can't be reached by other drunks."

In an article in the February 1969 Grapevine: "Dr. Bob on Tradition Eleven," Volume 25, Issue 9, D. S. Of San Mateo, California, wrote that Dr. Bob commented on the Eleventh Tradition, "We need always maintain personal anonymity At the level of press, radio and films," as follows:

"Since our Tradition of Anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English Language that to maintain Anonymity at any other level is definitely a Violation of this Tradition."

"The AA who hides his identity from his fellow AAs by using only a given name Violates The Tradition just as much as the AA who permits his name to appear in the press in connection with matter pertaining to AA."

"The former is maintaining his anonymity ABOVE the level of press, radio and films, and the latter is maintaining his anonymity BELOW the level of press, radio and films---whereas the tradition states that we should maintain our anonymity 'AT' the level of press, radio and films."

Ernie G. of Toledo, commenting on what he saw to be an increase of anonymity within A.A. today as compared with the old days, said, "I made a lead [trip to bring the message] over to Jackson [Michigan] one night, and everybody's coming up to me and saying, 'I'm Joe; 'I'm Pete.' Then one of the guys said, 'Safe journey home. If you get into any trouble, give me a buzz.'

Later, I said to the fellow who was with me, 'You now, suppose we did get into trouble on the way home. How would we tell anyone in A.A.? We don't know anyone's last name.' They get so doggone carried away with this anonymity that it gets to be a joke." I had a book [evidently one of the small address books compiled by early members or their wives] with the first hundred names--first and last--telephone numbers, and where they lived.

Dr. Bob's views on anonymity remained clear in the recollections of Akron's Joe P. [The Dartmouth grad]. Though it was not the custom in the mid-1940's to give A.A. talks to anyone except drunks, Joe noted, a few members formed an unofficial public information committee that started to speak to Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs throughout the state.

Spirit of Service Workshop Summary Report

The annual service workshop hosted by San Antonio Inter-Service (SAIS) on September 27th was a great success with 47 participants in this first “online” workshop. Attendees will tell you that service activities continue to flourish in San Antonio in the face of the new challenges resulting from COVID-19. All 7 active service committees (coordinated by CSO or SAIS) participated this year. Presenters discussed their committee’s mission, shared experiences, reported on current service activities and identified opportunities for those interested in getting involved in service. Highlights included Virginia’s account of calling the Helpline, Tami’s insight into the ways groups can get involved in preserving Archives, Amanda’s enthusiasm for developing the Communications committee, Ned’s empathy for the still suffering in Correctional Facilities and dedication to serving them, Matt’s favorite selections from the Grapevine’s digital archive, Deborah’s engaging traditions-focused discourse on the work of PI/CPC in our community, and James’ report on the ever changing face of Treatment Facilities committee work during the pandemic. Kudos to Grapevine/LaVina committee members Chris, Christina, Marcus, and Matt who demonstrated unity in their successful co-presentation and for putting a new spin on the traditional Grapevine Workshop (check it out on 10/17).

AA service is alive and well in San Antonio! Our trusted servants have turned this public health crisis into an opportunity to identify new ways to reach out to fellow sufferers in need of AA’s message of hope. Thanks to their efforts and the financial support of contributing groups, everyone in the sponsor by mail program received a Grapevine subscription. Big Books and other literature have been shipped to chaplains who will distribute them to AA members behind the walls, where we cannot currently visit. Topic-specific audio AA meetings are being recorded on DVDs and reproduced for all 212 units of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - our local CFC has successfully engaged all 4 areas of Texas to contribute to this project. As a result of a persistent effort by Billy, a virtual Big Book study now routinely meets on Tuesdays at Haven for Hope. Treatment centers have started to reach out again with requests for literature and remote meetings. PSAs have been sent to local media. The hand of AA is there! It is an honor and privilege to be a part of it and bear witness to our common solution in action. If you have an interest in service, come join us. 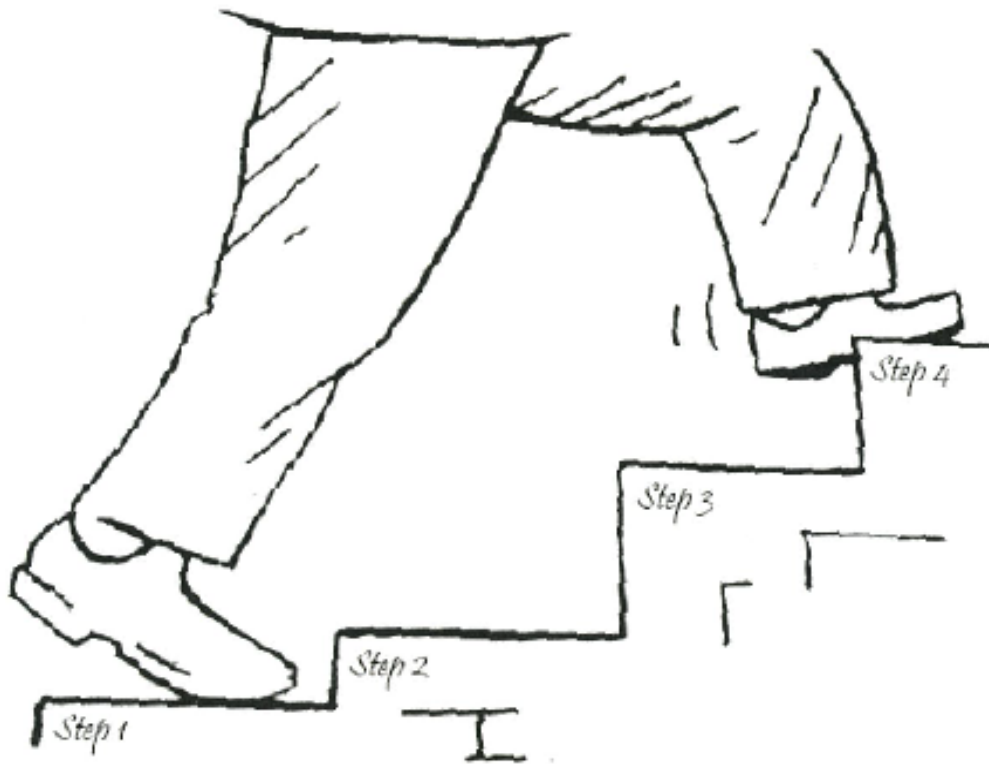

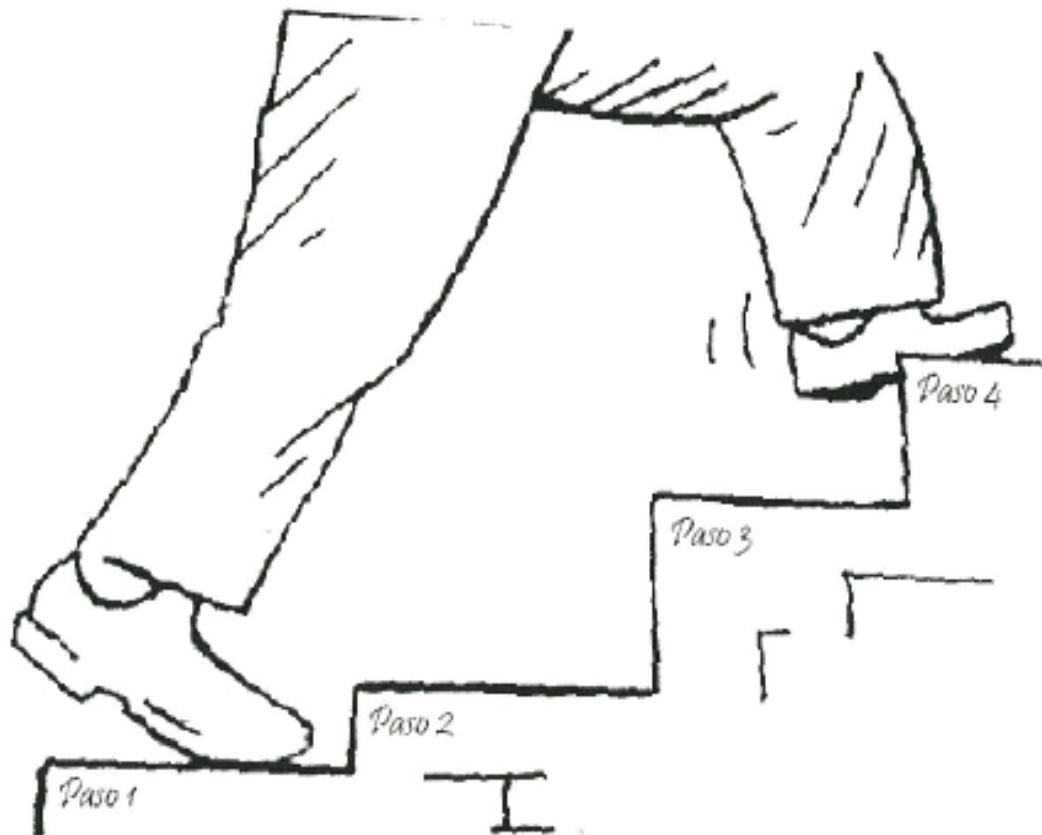
