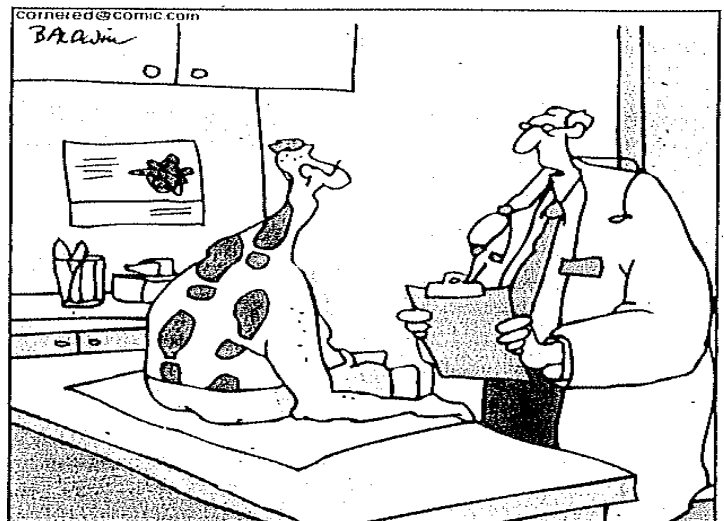
"BUT FOR THE GRACE OF GOD"

After having found himself in a Sanitarium, an alcoholic, desperate and confused, implored upon God to manifest Himself. Suddenly his room would light up and he would experience a peace and tranquility he had never known and was able to go to sleep. The biggest miracle of recovery is that the program is made to reduce the selfish, self centered, egotistical nature of the alcoholic, using unity and the common welfare, a simple spiritual tool unknown to Mankind.

Since the spirit can reach a harmful level of selfishness that can even be deadly, the alcoholics have recognized it as a sickness of the soul. Brought together by circumstance and not by virtue, we are all one with this all-powerful Spirit which we know as God. The alcoholics have found Salvation for themselves which is already in their past, that may God show the world His unconditional love.

Rod suggested having GSR's stress at their meeting the importance of having COR representation for their groups.

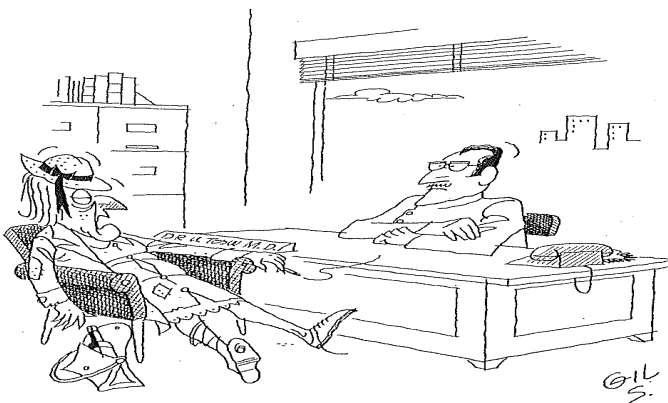
COR's are recommended to go to other groups and ask for representation.

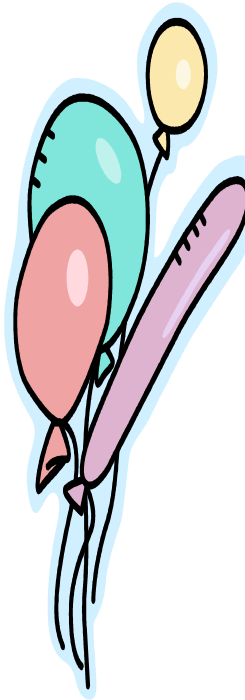
