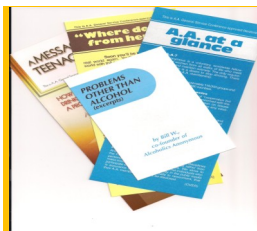

### *CSO Board of Trustees*

*The nominating committee for the CSO Board of Trustees election will soon convene and begin the process of choosing nominees for the annual election of CSO Board of Trustees.*

*Come to the next CSOR meeting to begin this process.*

Trustees are elected at the November general membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1<sup>st</sup>. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee. Additional nominations may be made by members at a general membership meeting. All nominees must be qualified, and all must have agreed to serve.

#### Qualifications:

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered AA group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of Alcoholism or other addictive disorders; or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where AA meetings are regularly held.

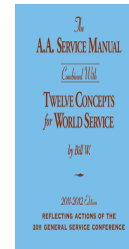

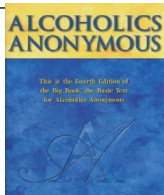

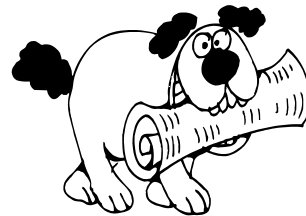

We can place copies on the “free” literature shelf and give copies to the CSOR Meeting for distribution.
