



Now there are certain things that A.A. cannot do for anybody, regardless of what our several desires or sympathies may be.

Our first duty, as a society, is to insure our own survival. Therefore, we have to avoid distractions and multipurpose activity. An A.A. group, as such, cannot take on all the personal problems of its members, let alone the problems of the whole world.

Sobriety — freedom from alcohol through the teaching and practice of the Twelve Steps is the sole purpose of an A.A. group. Groups have repeatedly tried other activities, and they have always failed. It has also been learned that there is no possible way to make non-alcoholics into A.A. members. We have to confine our membership to alcoholics, and we have to confine our A.A. groups to a single purpose. If we don't stick to these principles, we shall almost surely collapse. And if we collapse, we cannot help anyone.

To illustrate, let's review some typical experiences. Years ago, we hoped to give A.A. membership to our families and to certain nonalcoholic friends who had been greatly helpful. They had their problems, too, and we wanted them in our fold. Regretfully, we found that this was impossible. They couldn't make straight A.A. talks; nor, save a few exceptions, could they identify with new A.A. members. Hence, they couldn't do continuous Twelfth Step work.

Close to us as these good folks were, we had to deny them membership. We could only welcome them at our open meetings.



He hoped we would be able to help them with their convention.

Office Manager's report: Tomi BA – CSO booth brought in \$993.66 from the State Convention. 2 calls have come into the office from conventions asking for an AA meeting to be made available. The office sent out an email blast and received 40 favorable responses. The first Convention will be in October and expects 2000 people the second in November that is expecting 6000. As more information come in on this project more will be revealed. Parking meeting space etc.... We think this will become a group service program. This is exciting as we grow in carrying the message. Tomi asked us to go to the office Website and see the new changes. Ted an AA member found important missing information. See its front page. Name of store and hours of business. A link to the Hispanic Intergroup was added. Registration for Day in Recovery is available. A Donation button for scholarships for Weekend in SA that will be tracked.

Billy S. –Treatment Facilities Workshop June 25, 2017 hosted by Serendipity. He went over the speakers and the panel that will talk about both the pros and cons in their experience. He passionately expressed the importance of our carting the message since many of us are alumni from Treatment Centers. There are two more treatment Centers in the works and 33-37 meeting a week in San Antonio.

Still without a Group Historian and a short explanation of this position was given. On Thursdays from 10-2pm volunteers can come to the office and work with Tami in Archives. The secretary has resigned due to a work conflict and this position is available.


