Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge or panic comes—postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.



Find out about the special holiday parties, meetings, or other celebrations

given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.



Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.

Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember—"one day at a time."



Spirituality and Relapse

We recognize who is God and who isn't. That means we stop pretending to be our own Higher Power. We stop trying to control life and begin living it.

We accept ourselves as children of God, worthy of dignity, respect, and recovery. We have value because our Creator says so.

We practice the principle of Anonymity, putting principles ahead of personalities. This means that we are equals in a fellowship of men and women, neither above nor below others. We do not change the way we act because of personal likes or dislikes, but act according to the principles of our program: honesty, openness, willingness, and fellowship.

We accept life on life's terms. We do not struggle to force people, places or things to be different than they are. We may continue to work for achievement, change, and to build up others, but we don't fight against others to achieve what we want.

We surrender to the care of our Higher Power. We let go of defiance. We do not require God to justify Himself to us, or explain why He has allowed things to happen. We do not bargain with God to let us become social drinkers. We make no excuses for ourselves, nor do we blame others. Instead, we commit ourselves to God's care.

We learn to trust God, and the program of recovery, for a positive outcome in life. We fulfill our responsibilities, and trust God for the outcome.

We are of service to others. God has given us the gift of recovery, but we are given it for a purpose: We are here on earth to serve others. By passing on the gift of recovery, we get to keep it for ourselves.

We remain in the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous and we continue to work the steps in our lives, so that we will be using the tools God has chosen for us.

We pray, which is speaking to God, and meditate which is listening, so that we may know and do God's will. We remember the past, and cultivate gratitude in our hearts for the gift of recovery.


