



Home Group Topics - a series of articles of home group interest

What exactly is an informed Group Conscience?

How does an informed group conscience differ from a group opinion or a majority vote, or a business meeting?

This is an interesting approach

The group conscience is the collective conscience of the group membership and this represents substantial unanimity on one issue before definitive action is taken.

The term "informed group conscience" implies that pertinent information has been studied and all views have been heard before the group votes.

How is this achieved?

This is achieved by the group members through the sharing of full information, individual points of view, and the practice of A.A.'s principles. To be fully informed requires a willingness to listen to minority opinions with an open mind.

On sensitive issues, the group works slowly, <u>discouraging formal motions</u> until a clear sense of its collective view emerges. Placing principles before personalities, the membership is wary of dominant opinions. Its voice is heard when a well-informed group arrives at a decision. The result rests on <u>more</u> than a "yes" or "no" count, precisely because it is the spiritual expression of the group conscience.

There are two ways to arrive at a group conscience.

The competitive way: lets the person with the loudest voice to push his/her ideas across, take a vote and come up with a "majority decision". This is not an informed group conscience.

Group members come together in mutual trust to arrive at a group decision, not an individual personal triumph.

A suggested way: is for the GSR to make an announcement that two weeks from tonight, or a month, there will be a group conscience meeting on a given subject. The GSR will read, explain and give out copies of the subject you be asked to go home and talk about it, think about it, and pray about it - and you'll vote at the group conscience meeting on the appointed night.

A cooperative and informed group conscience calls for facts or presentation on both sides of a question. The meeting should not be thrown open for general discussion. This would allow the more vocal members to set the debate. It is suggested that the Chairman call on every member in turn, allowing 2-3 minutes for each to speak. No member should speak a second time until all have had their turn. This gives even the quietest person an equal chance. The Chairperson expresses his opinion only after all the others have spoken.

It is important that the minority voice always be heard; but it should be remembered that while minority sometimes Is right, it is just as often wrong. Unless the minority voice is decidedly persuasive or logical, it should be considered in its proper light - as a minority voice.

One of the things we keep track of at the Central Service Office are events and dates. We keep a calendar of events happening in and around San Antonio and the metro area. The calendar is printed in the Nightcap and can be emailed to you at any time. Also, You can call at any time to verify a date for an event. Other entities ask us for "Whats Happening" when they plan their events.

It is our hope that tracking this information will enable us all to plan around one another allowing us to adhere to Tradition four.

FLYERS

The CSO will automatically print 10 copies of any flyer you send us for an AA event. We will include those events in our "Whats Happening in San Antonio" monthly booklet, give a copy to each CSOR for their Group, and include them on the aasanantonio.org website.

If you need more flyers we can print those for you at a minimal cost. New printing prices will be posted in the January Nightcap.

The price for printing is different for black and white vs. color, also for two sided printing. Folded catalogs and booklets that are stapled are another cost. For more information about printing, call our Office 210-821-6325.

You may drop by and pick up as many of the "Whats happening" for your group as you like each month, at no cost.

It is recommended that the background for your flyer not be a dark color. When printing a flyer dark colors cost more in ink, And, they do not print as nicely. It is ok when we post on the website. If the flyer is over 25% about raffles, we will not post on the website or in the Nightcap. Raffles for cash come under the Gambling law in Texas, more information is available at our Office about the Texas law on raffles and cash prizes. Flyers in word are ok. When we post them on the website, we will convert to a PDF file.


