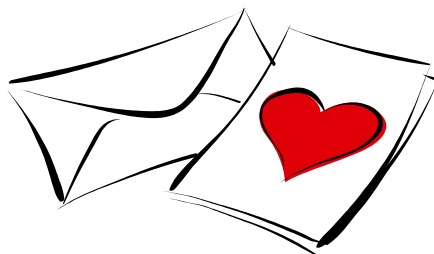

A.A. IS NOT A RELIGION

John Keats once asked the question, "Do you not see how necessary a world of pains and troubles is to school an intelligence and make it a soul?" How many of us are now living graced lives, lives that were once lost and without hope. Today, when I look around this room and the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous, the image I see is not the dark shadow of hopelessness but a bright light of hope.

The question that follows is: How did this come to be? How did a people so blind to their own selfishness suddenly find the ability to see themselves honestly for what and who they were and what they could become? How has it happened that men and women who could not walk through this world without the crutch of alcohol find themselves standing firmly on their own strong legs? What gave them the ability to hear the words of a stranger, when the voices of their loved ones fell on deaf ears? From what source have these same people found the ability to speak so openly and honestly about what has happened in their lives?

The language we use in Alcoholics Anonymous varies according to each of our life experiences, including our religious affiliation and occupation. Perhaps this varied language is part of why many outside the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous believe it to be a religious organization. They hear us talk of finding a "power greater than ourselves" which will solve our problem. They hear us pray the Serenity Prayer and watch many groups close with the Lord's Prayer. We speak of [God conscience, spiritual experience and spiritual awakening; being reborn, walking hand in hand with the spirit of the universe, the fourth dimension of existence and the fellowship of the spirit.] (*Alcoholics Anonymous*, pp. 13, 567, 63, 75, 25, 164) To one who had no experience with A.A., it would either make you believe we are some sort of religious organization or that you needed to bring your Ouija Board with you to a meeting.

Whatever the ceremonies of the groups themselves, or whatever the vernacular of the individual A.A. members may be, our Twelve Traditions set us apart from all religious organizations. The complete freedom of our membership to believe or not to believe in anything, including a divine power or deity, marks a spiritual freedom not often found in the organized religions of the world. We have no plan of salvation, no hierarchy or system of governing our membership, we can't even say when someone is a member and when they are not; as soon as they say they have a desire to stop drinking they are in, period. We don't affiliate with any particular religion, but we sure like to meet in their basements. There are no cathedrals in A.A., only the cathedral of the human spirit. Our home groups usually

reside in the low-rent economy, with many of our landlords telling us they don't want our money and we give it to them anyway. And speaking of money, as active alkie we were often spendthrifts, but as recovered alcoholics we are tight with the cash. Just try for more than a buck in the basket and you'd think you had just asked for the mortgage. Yet even that's ok; because we always seem to have enough, and in the end it really doesn't take much to do what we do.

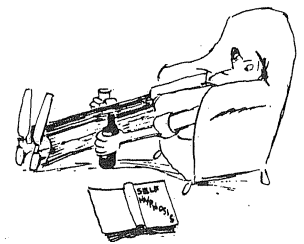
What we do is stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety. Here lies the greatest confusion and contention with our detractors. It's in the results—we really are not supposed to be sober, and certainly not living full and joyful lives. The jail didn't do it. The wife couldn't make it happen. The judge gave it a gavel slam. The psychiatrists took their best shot. The boss hung us out to dry. The preacher told us to get out and we ourselves had finally given up after every imaginable remedy. It was all supposed to work and it all failed. Each member of A.A. "Describes in his own language and from his own point of view ... what has actually happened in their lives. (Ibid, p.29) The evidence is simple - the mute speak, the lame walk, the deaf hear, and the blind see. Outside observation aside, we are not a religious organization because we say we are not.

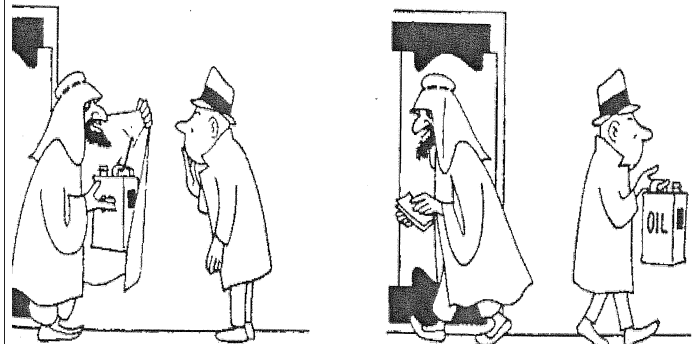
