WHAT IS A CENTRAL OFFICE

A central office (or Intergroup) is an AA service office that involves partnership among groups in a community—just as AA groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. A central office is established to carry out certain functions common to all the groups—functions which are best handled by a centralized office—and it is usually maintained, supervised, and supported by these groups in their general interest. It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the AA message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

GRATITUDE

When I first came into the program, I heard the word gratitude and I wasn't sure of the meaning of it. I thought it meant to be glad for something. Over the last 11 years I have learned that it means more. I'm glad that God and the AA fellowship have shown and kept me on the path of sobriety. I'm grateful I can reach out to others and help them whether they are a newcomer, or another AA member in need. We are all suffering, some more than others. I enjoy working with others. One of my favorite paragraphs is in the Big Book (pg164) "Abandon yourself to God as you understand God. Admit your faults to him and your fellows. Clear away the wreckage of your past. Give freely of what you find and join us. We shall be with you in the Fellowship of the Spirit, and you will surely meet some of us as you trudge the Road of Happy Destiny. May God Bless you and keep you—until then."

Another favorite passage is the 3rd Step Prayer (pg 63). "God, I offer myself to Thee—to build with me and to do with me as Thou wilt. Relieve me of the bondage of self, that I may better do thy will. Take away my difficulties, that victory over them might bear witness to those I would help of Thy Power, Thy Love, and Thy Way of life. May I do Thy will always!" Gratitude to me means that I'm thankful for those who have started the AA way of life, who continue it today, and will carry it in the future. I'm grateful we have people who are willing to step to the plate and do service work..

For the last 6 months I have been trying to form a Central Service Office (CSO) Outreach Committee without much luck. If you are service minded, I could use you. We are visiting groups to keep up awareness about the Central Service Office and the services CSO provides. Please consider being 'a part of ' this vital committee. We need lots of help as there are 150 groups in the greater San Antonio Metro Area and some groups only meet once a week. Through experience I have learned gratitude is an action word. ARE YOU UNAPPRECIATED?

If you are an especially active and hard working member of Alcoholics Anonymous, and you are going along, day after day, un-honored, unrecognized and unsung—may I congratulate you?

No higher mark of appreciation could be paid you than to be taken for granted. That means that you are accounted as an inner member of the inner circle, your service naturally expected, no problem about you suspected which might require solicitude or special attention.

Of course, such a regard is not very thrilling. The person doesn't live who doesn't like to be appreciated. But this is the way it usually is in Alcoholics Anonymous. The most genuine, the sincerest mark of appreciation is to be taken for granted.

Beware of lavish attention, constant expression of your value, and overflow of thank-you's.

It may be that you are an exception to the above rule and are just lucky. But it is more probable that people are either not quite sure about your staying in line, or that your reputation for sensitiveness is well known and its demand simply being met.

There are few places where just being ignored is such an honest tribute as in Alcoholics Anonymous.

THE AA GROUP

What is an AA group?

As the long form of Tradition Three clearly states, "Our membership ought to include all who suffer from alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wish to recover. Nor ought AA membership ever depend upon money or conformity. Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an AA group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation."

Some AAs come together as specialized AA groups-for men, women, young people, doctors, gays and others. If the members are all alcoholics, and if they open the door to all alcoholics who seek help, regardless of profession, gender or other distinction, and meet all the other aspects defining an AA group, they may call themselves an AA group.

AA groups are encouraged to register at GSO, as well as with their area, district, intergroup or central office.

How do you become an AA group member? "The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking." (Tradition Three). Thus, group membership requires no formal application. Just as we are members of AA if we say we are, so are we members of a group if

we say we are—and we keep coming back.
