MY HOME GROUP

We would like to run a series of articles about the groups in our greater San Antonio area. These groups are found in the cities and towns of Bandera, Blanco, Boerne, Buda, Canyon Lake, Castroville, Center Point, Comfort, Cotulla, Devine, Driftwood, Dripping Springs, Floresville, Fredericksburg, Gonzales, Hondo, Ingram, Jourdanton, Junction, Kerrville, Kirby, Kyle, Lake Hills, LaVernia, Lockhart, Luling, Lytle, Medina, New Braunfels, Pleasanton, Poteet-Strawberry, San Antonio, San Marcos, Seguin, Selma, Spring Branch, Stonewall, Universal City, Waelder, and Wimberley. Your article should be about a half a page, single spaced, and can be an informative article, historical, or just how you feel about your home group and what it does for your sobriety. The **Woman's Big Book Group** meets every Wednesday night at 7 p.m. in the Alamo Heights Methodist Church on Basse Rd. Our group is both expansive and close-knit, committed to supporting one another and the larger AA community. Our involvement in AA in San Antonio includes volunteering for the annual Club 12 Christmas dinners, putting on the Saturday breakfast for the annual Club 12 anniversary, and regularly organizing an AA workshop called "A Day in Recovery." We also take a meeting several Mondays a month to the "Women at the Well" recovery house. The Woman's Big Book Group celebrates our annual anniversary on the last Wednesday in July by bringing in a speaker, opening up the meeting to both men and women, and providing snacks, cake, and coffee to all our visitors. Opportunities for service within the group and in the larger community are presented at almost every business meeting, and we view these opportunities with gratitude and enthusiasm. We have a regular weekly attendance of 20 women and an updated phone list with the contact information of more than 70 women who periodically attend our meetings. What continues to appeal to me about the Woman's Big Book is that almost every range of sobriety is represented in the group, from newcomers to long-timers. Each member is committed to recovery and to continuing to grow in sobriety through the steps and service.

The format of the meeting is to read through the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous a paragraph at a time, with each person commenting on the paragraph they read. Others are encouraged to comment on the paragraph as well. We continue around the room in order, reading one paragraph at a time, until the hour is up. The fourth Wednesday of the month is birthday night, at which we eat a piece of delicious home-made cake and read through the tradition of the month from the Twelve and Twelve. After the reading, we open up the meeting for discussion of the tradition. In months that have a fifth week, the chairperson chooses a story to read from the back of the book.

This structure and format provide for a home group grounded in the primary purpose of all AA groups--to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. However, the Woman's Big Book Group brings a unique flavor to this standard AA recipe. For example, at the end of every meeting, the chairperson hands out chips to those celebrating sobriety milestones for that week, which is not unusual for AA groups in the area. The chairperson then reaches into the box, pulls out a light pink poker chip, and waves it around expectantly. These chips are given out to anyone who has had a miracle that week or needs a miracle. To me, these "miracle chips" represent hope and are an affirmation of faith in the power of God to work miracles in recovery. We also give out another kind of poker chip, this one black and to be picked up if a person has a resentment. They are to take the "resentment chip" home, pray for the object of their resentment for two weeks (or longer) and return it after the resentment has been lifted. Some members have suggested changing our name to the "Miracle Chip" Group, which would not be the first name change, having previously had the name "Foxy Ladies."

For fellowship, some of us frequently meet before the meeting or go out afterward. On the monthly birthday night, the group as a whole shows up at 5:30 that evening to a restaurant chosen by the person or persons celebrating that month. We pass around a card to sign, the person's sponsor presents them with the chip at the end of the meeting, and we eat more cake. :-). Besides having the privilege of celebrating my anniversary the past two years with the group, one of the most memorable experiences for me was when a storm blew through Alamo Heights right after the meeting. Five of us who had stayed behind talking were left waiting for it to blow over for about 45 minutes. I spent that time talking with four other women I had just met in the last year, all of whom made me feel as welcome as if I had been regularly part of the group for much longer. The women make an effort to get to know one another and talk about what is currently going on in their lives. They share about how they live their recovery on a daily basis, whether going through losing a job or finding a job... two of life's many situations that we in the Women's Big Book group respond to by picking up a pink miracle chip!

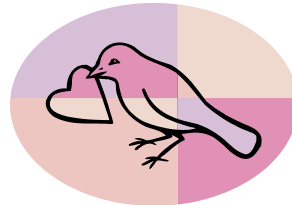

CLOSING: Sydney lead the group in the closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

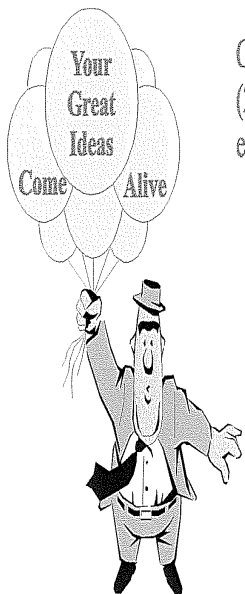

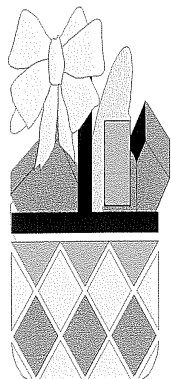

The Amazing Paradoxes of A.A.

...reprinted from "The Professor and the Paradox", 2nd, Edition Big Book

We Suffer To Get Well: *There is no way to escape the terrible suffering of remorse and regret and shame and embarrassment which starts us on the road to getting well from our affliction.*

We Surrender To Win: *On the face of it, surrendering certainly does not seem like winning. But it is in A.A. Only after we have come to the end of our rope, hit a stone wall in some aspect of our lives beyond which we can go no further; only when we hit "bottom" in despair and surrender, can we accomplish sobriety which we could never accomplish before. We must, and we do, surrender in order to win.*

We Die To Live: *When we work at our Twelve Steps, the old life of guzzling and fuzzy thinking, and all that goes with it gradually dies, and we acquire a different and better way of life. As our shortcomings are removed, one life of us dies, and another life of us lives. We in A.A. die to live.*

We Give Away To Keep: *That seems absurd and untrue. How can you keep anything if you give it away? But in order to keep whatever it is we get in A.A., we must go about giving it away to others, for no fees or rewards of any kind. When we cannot afford to give away what we have received so freely in A.A., we had better get ready for our next "drunk". It will happen every time. We've got to continue to give it away in order to keep it."*

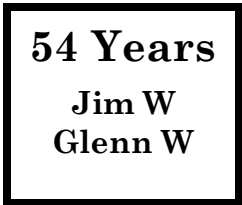
