The Fellowship Room is open all day from 9am to 5pm Monday through Friday.

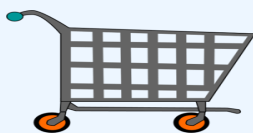

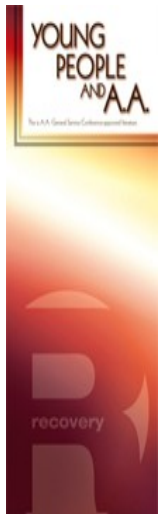

Your Group in The Digital Age



Is anybody listening?

Most of our AA meetings have a reminder to shut off or silence the cell phones before the meeting begins.

There is always one left on. Always one that rings and the person gets up and starts talking as they head for the door. Do you wonder if it's an emergency, or maybe the member is on call for the AA Helpline. You give them the benefit of the doubt. It's kind that they take the conversation outside.

Do members go into another room close by and everyone gets to hear the conversation anyway. A conversation you would prefer to not hear.

You are chairing the meeting and when you look up half of the room is filled with attendees staring at their cell phones and typing away. Do you wonder why you are bothering to chair the meeting?

Your Group has invited an AA member to share their story from the podium. The speaker is started by the loud musical tones emanating from a cell phone.

Sitting next to you is the Secretary of the Group. As soon as the meeting starts they put their cell phone in their lap and begin to play a game.

Sitting in an area business meeting a GSR plays candy crush on their cell phone in their lap for all to see.

What are we saying to the newcomer who watches us in our meetings. What are we telling the visitors about our AA program. When we state to turn off the cell phone or silence it, are we good examples applying the principles of carrying the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Or not. Do we consider Tradition One, "Our common welfare comes first; personal recovery depends on A.A. unity." Is the cell phone distraction any different from the two members who sit and whisper back and forth during the meeting. That's been happening for a long time before technology arrived in AA.

One meeting leader explained when she started the meeting that one hour away from your cell phone games and texting is not too much to give up for a sober life. Do we need to add to our readings?

In today's digital age it is hard to determine if a member is reading their Big Book on their cell phone or on their tablet. Members use these devices to Look-up a definition for a word in the Big Book, adding to the meeting and their sobriety. There is a lot of good in technology. How to manage the good in groups is the question.

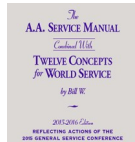

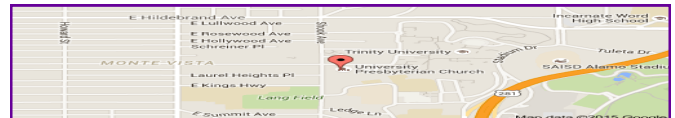
