STAY IN THE SOLUTION: In late March or early April of 2003, a small group of the Oak Hills Group members began meeting at the La Hacienda Outreach building on Data Point right off Wurzbach: since the Oak Hills group had been given information that the lease had come to an end. Some of the members decided to follow and join the Oasis group at 8607 Wurzbach across the street from Oak Hills. Still others decided to start another group on their own.

The man that actually spearheaded the venture was Rudy G (who now lives in Mexico). Rudy had approached Barry A of the La Ha Outreach with a request to start a noon meeting that would meet 7 days a week. Barry agreed and gave us a room, loaned us a coffee pot, even supplied the coffee and extras. Among the first members who were instrumental in forming the group, were Steve Z, a regular supportive member along with James L and Adrieanna. Cliff M, a frequent visitor, was usually picked up by Rudy or Adrieanna. The group grew slowly; and at the first group conscience, there were many names suggested for the small group.

Because they were dedicated to topics out of approved literature, and because many of the members had much experience with relapse (which we attributed to misinformation; we came up with "STAY IN THE SOLUTION" or SITS. In August of 2003 La Ha moved it's facility to 8600 Wurzbach, Suite #700-702, and has been there ever since. The group is active in service work and has been an active supporter of the Central Service Office and all the other parts of the AA service structure. There are too many people to name, but some of special mentioned in the early development of the group are Yolanda C., Donna M, Jesse G, and those already mentioned. We are a full active group. We have 1. Step & Book Study, 2. Beginners Meeting. 3 Discussion meeting (literature based) 4. Speaker Birthday meeting. 5 A monthly Group Conscience. God has turned this into a flourishing message carrying group of ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS.

<u>TURNING POINT</u>: Turning Point is my home group. I started going when Jim and I moved back to San Antonio from Northern Virginia in 2005. It has grown from 1 meeting per week to 5. This group means connection to me. We take meetings to Laurel Ridge; have an amazing woman bake treats almost every week...not just birthday night; have an annual chili cook off that I swear is rigged! We have a diverse group of people and each meeting has its own personality. The conversations and laughter are so loud before the meeting starts; the chairperson has to get pretty creative to get our attention. That's the best! There are so many wonderful groups in the San Antonio area but I "keep coming back" to Turning Point to stay connected with AA. To quote a long standing member, "they're my tribe".
