

The Alamo Heights Group

From The Nightcap-Volume One October 1972

Alamo Heights Group: "Mark Your Calendar"

"On October 16 (Monday Night) the Alamo Heights Group celebrates the sixteenth anniversary of its first meeting in the same month of 1956.

Its members issue to <u>all</u> an invitation to attend its meeting that night to help celebrate this milestone. One of the speakers will be Bishop Everett H. Jones who played a vital role in bringing A.A. to San Antonio over 25 years ago.

Meeting place is St Luke's Episcopal Church located at Devine Road and Corona (just north of Olmos Park) where the first meeting was held. This first meeting resulted from planning on the part of Betty L., a parishioner of St. Luke's and its then Rector who were assisted by Doc B. of the Central Office. Although an open discussion group was planned and has been the format ever since, the first meeting in October 1956 was a speakers meeting and was attended by approximately thirty members from Group Twelve, Olmos and other groups. Two of the speakers were John C. and John O. During the first two years the attendance at Alamo Heights varied from seven to twelve and then began to grow. Present meetings average close to the fifty mark!

The first big celebration of it founding was held in 1959 and was a public meeting with well over 200 present. Every year since then the anniversary meeting has

been a speaker's meeting with lots of refresehments and fellowship.

Several of the original group are now deceased, among them Joe and Harriet C. and Clyde W., but the present G.S.R., Mary Lou G. is one of the original members. Some of the past Secretaries and/or G.S.R.'s are Gener and Merle D., Mary F., Fred H., Amerlia P., Harold S., Gayle M., Kate R., Carl and Christi H., Margaret L. and Mary Lou G., among many others, most of whom remain active in the group.

Another speaker will be Ransom P. of Fayetteville, N.C. with 23 years sobriety. He is the brother of Adele M. and is coming here just for this celebration.



SWTA 68 is in good hands for Panel 68 and what a great opportunity we got to experience at the Regional Forum as we watched OUR trusted servants work hard on our behalf to help us all gain a better understanding of how the General Service Office works and how the G.S.B. operates. We watched and learned as these trusted servants graciously handled ALL of our questions and concerns and helped us all to understand the status of current events, including sorting out the issues regarding the original manuscript ownership. The take home message is this: there are no secrets - more will be revealed as resolution progresses and the information on the case is legally able to be shared. I personally am grateful that we have a process in place in which I can trust and that our voices on the matter are heard.

As I write this article this morning I am filled with gratitude to have experienced this life changing event serving as your Delegate. I've just returned home from another service filled weekend starting with an opportunity to give the delegate report to the Linguistic District 14 in Laredo on Saturday (thank you Mario for your assistance and translation) followed by the opportunity to facilitate the San Antonio Inter-District inventory on Sunday. Both of those service opportunities have further deepened my understanding of the autonomy that rests within the Groups and the Districts and that it is the Groups and the Districts where action is producing changes....we as an Area are here to serve, not govern. Much like the General Service Conference was born partly because of the idea that the changes in A.A. must come from all of us in A.A. and not just a few, I have watched this same spirit pervade at the District and Group levels. I see a wave of action continuing to move forward as we at the Area level continue to grapple with the ideas that have come from our Group and District members: that we have a need to recognize Accessibilities as a potential new committee, that Treatment and Accessibilities should be separate committees, and that our Area may benefit from conducting a Treatment Facilities Conference hosted by the local Districts. We have all also learned much as we have watched our friends in Austin and San Antonio grapple with the concerns that come out of the fact that service in large metropolitan areas does present unique challenges and solution may look different. Local autonomy and the local informed group conscience process will continue to prevail in ongoing solutions to these concerns. And although the pace at which changes in Alcoholics Anonymous comes at any level maybe painstakingly slow, there are always good reasons why. As Bill W said "the good is often the enemy of the best". Truly by the time we make any 'final decisions'; we've all come to a better understanding of just what the needs are; what may be the best way to move forward; and then God continues to provide the way. Area 68 is in good hands in these next two years...I look forward to be able to watch the continued growth and development of our Area as we continue to serve Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole.
