Busy sponsoring guys ... busy taking care of my wife ... busy making a living ... just busy. That's been too long for me to use the excuse even to myself. So, as I sit to write this, my excuses are all gone. Karen is snoozing in her recliner; the lawn mower is charging; and it's Memorial Day – a day to remember those who have given the full measure for the rest of us. As I remember those who have given for me, I think of my sponsor, and those who have gone before me in A.A. I got sober a couple of blocks from the headquarters of Strategic Air Command, and they were all veterans. They were men you can depend on in hard times. They could also be depended to share their gratitude for their sobriety with me.

You might well ask what any of that has to do with the Coffee Pot Group in San Antonio. Well, the group started with a resentment and a coffee pot, as so many of them do. And as so many other groups, if the group never gets beyond the resentment, the coffee pot is not enough to keep it going. We have to move on from there, or the meeting will die, just as resentments kill alcoholics. Like any other group, we come from different walks of life – people who would not normally mix. We have different views of what the Big Book means, and you will hear those divergent views in our meetings, because we are still small enough to use a round-robin format, so that everyone has an opportunity to share, and usually everyone does have that opportunity.

Having said that, the group has just elected its first GSR and alternate. The group conscience is transferring from the long-time members to the group conscience, and that is exciting. It will lead us to new levels of discussion, with the attendant disagreement that comes with them, and if we continue to wait for God's will to go forward, because there is no looking back, and for that I am grateful. by Mike C, home group member

Chance of a Lifetime

About a year ago our Southwest Texas Area 68 Delegate Char asked me if I would like to be her guest when she went to the General Service Conference in New York the first week of May this year. I immediately said, "Yes!" I didn't think about how much it would cost or if I could get off work or anything else – just what an incredible opportunity it was. I was so excited, but it was a year away.

Time did pass and the day came for me to fly to New York. I arrived at the Crown Plaza Hotel on Times Square, New York City last Saturday afternoon. After settling in the room I shared with Char, I had dinner with her, three other delegates from our region, and our Southwest regional trustee Conley B (rotating out at the end of the conference – the new SW regional trustee Clayton V. would be elected that Wednesday.)

I was able to attend to a "1728 meeting" Sunday morning - so named from multiplying 12 x 12 x 12. The purpose of the "1728 meeting" is to explain the 12 traditions and 12 concepts to the Class A, non-alcoholic trustees of the General Service Board. (There are 7 Class A, non-alcoholic trustees and 14 Class B, AA trustees.)

After that I walked around the hotel and Times Square a bit, did a little shopping, and then went to the welcome and orientation meeting for guests of the delegates given by the South East New York (SENY) Area 49. They explained the sight-seeing opportunities for the week and took us in small groups to buy weekly Metro cards for unlimited subway and bus rides. All the guests received lanyards that said "61st General Service Conference" just like the delegates' lanyards!

I went to a dinner Sunday evening for delegates, trustees, GSO staff, and guests like me. I sat at a table with Char and past Class A (non-AA) trustee and chairman of the board Leonard Blumenthal and his wife Linda, also a friend of AA. I had met Leonard at a Southwest Regional Forum in Denver about four years ago, and he *almost* talked Char and me into going to a remote regional forum in Moose Factory, Ontario, Canada in February the following year! One has to take three different modes of transportation to get there, the last being dog sled over an ice bridge! Leonard is an interesting man who keeps a case of Big Books in his car. Because he was a Class A (non-alcoholic) trustee he could and can announce his association with AA. So many people come to him for help or for help for a loved one and he gives them a Big Book and takes them to a meeting. We are truly blessed to have such wonderful non-alcoholic friends of our fellowship. We heard five 10 minute AA talks by two panel 60 delegates, a regional trustee from Canada, GSO staff member Mary C (Cooperation with the Professional Community desk) and Billy N, a director of AA World Service, Inc., who is speaking at our Texas State AA Convention June 24-26 this year. All the speakers were excellent.

Monday morning I took off on my own to visit Stepping Stones. I walked seven blocks to the subway at 42nd and Broadway, taking subway shuttle to Grand Central station where I caught a train to Katonah. I had no idea how to do any of this, so I kept asking questions and that's how I got where I was going. I had lunch at the Katonah Restaurant that I found out later Lois and Bill had frequented. Until recently there was a waitress there who used to serve Lois who passed away in 1988.

I was the only one visiting Stepping Stones that day, so the guide let me roam on my own and I listened to all the recordings on both floors — about 10 recordings by Bill and Lois on each floor. Then the guide took me up the hill to "Wits End" where Bill wrote *The Twelve and Twelve* and *AA Comes of Age*. She took my picture at Bill's desk as well as at the kitchen table where Ebby sat and shared his experience getting sober with Bill.


