SAMSO Makes Sense (San Antonio Metropolitan Service Organization)

"When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand Of AA always to be there. And for that: I am responsible" *

While AA appears to be structured as most large organizations are, it is actually just the opposite. Most organizations take direction from the top down; in AA, the organization runs from the bottom up. We've all heard that the individual is the most important person in AA, and that is true. Without one drunk

sharing with another, we would not have a fellowship that extends across the globe. This is the basis of the twelve steps of the program. These steps provide a suggested path to recovery.

Individuals form AA groups that take their direction from a group conscience that does what it feels must be done to carry the message. Groups, while autonomous, are guided by the twelve traditions of AA that were created to protect the whole from the parts and to insure that AA would be there when someone needs help. This —bottom upll structure was designed to have every grateful, recovering drunk involved and participating in the future of the fellowship.

Each AA group is part of a District. Districts normally consist of 10-20 committees to carry the AA message and to reach out the hand of AA to those who still suffer. The committees focus on specific activities and populations, providing a contact point and information source for those areas. Each district forms committees to help carry the message and staffs those committees with interested group members.

The committees mirror those established by the General Service Conference in 1951. They include the CFC (correctional facilities committee) to carry the message to those incarcerated; the TFC (treatment facilities committee) that focuses on hospital and rehabilitation facilities; the PI/CPC (public information/cooperation with the professional community) that lets people who may refer clients to AA know just what it is that we do (and don't do); Archives to collect, preserve and share our history; Bilingual to expand the communication effort; Grapevine and LaViña to encourage use of the AA newsletter in carrying the message; and any other committee that might be needed in a particular area to make sure that the hand of AA is present when needed.

These Districts form an Area that elects a delegate to take their views to the Annual General Service Conference in New York. The Conference is the collective Group Conscience of AA as a whole. Issues and concerns raised by individuals and groups are considered, evaluated, and acted upon by the members attending the General Service Conference. The General Service Board consisting of AA World Service, GSO, Grapevine, and La Viña manage and implement the collective will of the Conference.

The system works quite well and offers everyone a chance to implement the 12th step and permits groups to engage in service work as suggested in Tradition 5. However, when Districts are close together in a tight geographic space, such as a large city, a unique situation occurs. For example, San Antonio has seven active districts and more than 100 groups working to carry the message to a fixed number of locations that are not evenly divided throughout the city. Rather than have each district create and staff its own outreach committees, the Districts in San Antonio have joined together to support one organization, the San Antonio Metropolitan Service Organization (SAMSO) that monitors and supports an interdistrict committee structure coordinating AA service activities city-wide. In other words, instead of seven individual district committees reaching out to the confinement facilities, SAMSO coordinates the activities of one committee that is supported by all the groups in San Antonio. This frees resources and doesn't overburden any individual group or district, and it gives the agencies reaching out for AA support one contact to deal with. The SAMSO concept is a simple way to conserve resources and insure that the hand of AA is always available when someone reaches out, SAMSO makes sense.
