In the spring of 2008, we became an open discussion meeting where the chairperson brings a person who introduces the topic which is then discussed. We meet on Thursday nights at 8 pm at the Episcopal Church of the Reconciliation, 8900 Starcrest, two stop signs north of Loop 410 on the right. I have been a part of this group since it's first meeting and it became my home group when I was elected as Central Office Representative in February 2006. I served that position for two years as well as Alternate GSR and later as GSR (2008 and 2009) and currently serve as Alternate DCM for District 17. We do a lot of service work at Club 12 and Weekend in SA and we hosted TXSCYPAA in 2006. We invite you to come join us each Thursday evening for a great discussion meeting and fellowship. <u>Families in Recovery</u>: I like my home group because there always seems to be an atmosphere of joyousness and laughter. This is especially true prior to and right after the meeting.

Families in Recovery is a serious meeting striving to stay within the rules, regulations and tradition of an open AA meeting. But my experience with this group has shown that serious AA does not have to exclude laughter.

Families in Recovery meets in a church just off San Pedro/281 and Nakoma. After attending one of these open AA meetings, the head pastor of the church, with tears running down his cheeks, replied when asked, "What's wrong, why are you so sad?" by group members.

The preacher's response was, "I would give anything in the world if I could get as much spirituality as I experience here in my church sanctuary on Sunday mornings." by Wm Ray M, (2/6/85) home group member

Freedom Group: I moved to San Antonio with 2 weeks of sobriety. Not an action recommended, but it's part of my story. The first thing I did was call Central Service Office. I was put in contact with a wonderful lady who told me about her home group and offered to give me ride to their next meeting. Her home group was the Freedom Group. Freedom meets at the Abiding Presence Lutheran Church located at the corner of Oak Shadows and 281 North. At that time we met in the choir room behind the kitchen in the church. It was a thriving meeting with some great long term sobriety and service orientated members. Just before my 2 year sobriety birthday I was a elected GSR of the group. I served in this position for the full term and while I loved the group and the service I also discovered the AA community at large. At 5 years sober I married a wonderful man with 9 years of sobriety who lived in another area of town. For the next 10 years I shifted home groups among several marvelous groups, but kept going back to Freedom every year to get my sobriety chip.

In my experience, groups have personalities and ebbs and flows about them. This is one of the marvelous things about AA groups. Freedom is once again my home group because it's where I feel at "home". Several of our active home group members were at my first meeting there. Some of the home group members have moved to San Antonio from other parts of the country and have made Freedom their home group, still others "discovered AA" during my time away from the group and of course still others are relative newcomers. We still meet at Abiding Presence, but now it's in one of class rooms in the school building attached to the main building. The group has added meetings over the years and now instead of 2 weekly meetings we have 5 meetings a week. Freedom meets Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday evenings at 7:15PM and there is a women's meeting at 10:30AM on Saturday. Any and all of these meetings still feel like home to me. This is where I am among people that have seen me grow and evolve during my own sobriety. This is where I am held accountable and responsible. To quote another home group member, this is where I go to "see my people". If you find yourself in the north central part of town, please come by and see us. We'd love to see you as we all "trudge the Road to Happy Destiny" by Lynn J, home group member


