Ruth's Prayer

Sober since 1944

Ruth O. of Toms River NJ passed away on Sunday April 22, 2012. She was 97 years old & had just celebrated 68 years of sobriety on April 14. Sober since 1944, It is possible Ruth had the longest living sobriety of any woman or man at the time of her death. She also knew and helped Dr. William D. Silkworth, who wrote most of "The Doctor's Opinion" in the Big Book.

Within a few months after she got sober, at a meeting in Brooklyn NY, she was given a business card by another AA member. On one side of the card was the Four Absolutes of the Oxford Group (Absolute Honesty, Absolute Unselfishness, Absolute Love, and Absolute Purity) and on the other side of the card was the following prayer. She recited it daily and shared it when she spoke. It has come to be known as "Ruth's Prayer"

Thank You, dear God, for another day,
The chance to live in a decent way,
To feel again the joy of living
and happiness that comes from giving.
Thank You for friends who can understand
and the peace that flows from Your loving hand.
Help me to wake with the morning sun,
With the prayer today, "Thy will be done."
For with Your help I will find the way.
Thank You again, dear God, for AA.

HOW? By contributing to a fund the Central Service Office (CSO) has set up for Archives Contributions. Fundraisers are in the works; however, individuals and groups may contribute now. We have estimated that approximately \$8,000.00 will be needed for the project at this time.

WHAT IS IT? We have established a dedicated room at CSO to showcase our San Antonio AA Archives. Funds are needed for table displays, wall displays, and a listening center that will be devoted entirely to the S.A. Fellowship (now and in the future) to hear the voices of our old-timers.

WHAT ARCHIVAL MATERIALS DO WE ALREADY HAVE? Various books & pictures; an original set of the first four years of the AA Grapevine (donated by Tony F. of Victoria); the original testimonial of the Lasker Award; correspondence with the General Service Office from the 1940s; correspondence and other items from the 2010 International AA Convention in San Antonio, etc. We also have pledges from local members to display some of their personal archival material.

WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR? Our San Antonio history book, AA in SA, was completed in 2006; documenting forever the founding and growth of Alcoholics Anonymous in San Antonio. Archivists from AA in Northeast and Northwest Texas were invited to San Antonio in 2010 to help us sort through and catalog our material. Everything has been put in protective sleeves and photographed.

We are now ready to display our history.





We can place copies on the "free" literature shelf and give copies to the CSOR Meeting for distribution.
- Need contact information for an AA entity, stop by and check out the bulletin board or the free handouts on the shelves in the Fellowship Room. There is a notebook that holds information regarding conferences and events outside of the city.

The free literature shelves have flyers, booklets, and pamphlets with information about AA events and services.

- Drop off some flyers about your group's activities. You can make copies to distribute, by printing them here at the office. Copies are 5¢ a page to print.
- Free Pamphlets are available for your group or your service project. Pamphlets are in English and Spanish.

The <u>Picture Board</u>: Put a picture of yourself and/or others on our picture board. Anonymity Suggests that everyone in the picture agrees to have this posted on the picture board.

<u>Computer Service</u>: There is a computer with word and excel you may use to type group treasurers reports, minutes, or committee reports. You may make copies of these reports for 5¢ a copy.

The Fellowship Room is available to meet your sponsor, sponsee, or a Twelve Step Meeting.
