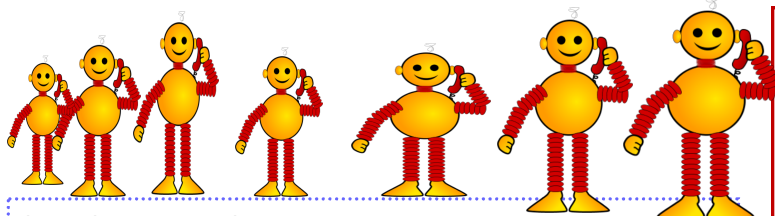
Things We Cannot Change

We maintain a list of AA members who are willing to make calls to persons looking for help. These people call our helpline and ask to talk with someone about their drinking, or they call our helpline and want to know how to stop drinking. They need to talk with an alcoholic who has stopped drinking, a member of AA.

One alcoholic talking to another alcoholic.

Our members who sign up on the Twelve Step List do not always go out to the *caller's residence*. They do not always *meet with the caller personally*. If one of our AA members decides to be on the Twelve Step Call List, they understand that the choice of *personal contact with the caller* is entirely their choice.

We need three things for our Twelve Step Call List.

Can you help us?

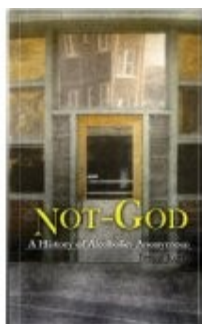
1. We need a person who will call the list and talk with the AA members on the list. Cleaning up the information. Make changes to the list
2. We need local AA members in San Antonio and the Metro Area to be on the list.
3. We need AA members from other towns to sign-up to be on the list. Surprised? Your Central Service Office Area Helpline serves many towns. When a caller calls it might be from a hundred miles away. We serve as far away as Junction, Del Rio, Pearsall, San Marcos and Seguin.

CONTINUED from the May Nightcap

It was Easter time 1941, and Jones was scheduled for a week of Lenten preaching in the Bayou City. He determined to get more information about the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous, that was claiming a fifty percent recovery rate among its members initially, and another twenty five percent after a couple of slips.

He located the Houston AA telephone number and called for a representative to meet him at the Rice Hotel upon his arrival in Houston.

Jones was quite impressed with his visitor's frankness, as he had introduced himself as, "I'm George, an ex-drunk". So the Reverend invited him to come to San Antonio to meet with the group at St. Mark's church.

Back in San Antonio, while the good priest was digging away at a backlog of details that had piled up in his absence, George, unbeknownst to the minister, was being wined and dined by some of his former San Antonio newspaper cronies.

Before you could say 'King For a Day' George was bundled aboard a bus headed back to Houston, taking with him any hopes for a meeting.

Tradition Six (long form)

Problems of money, property, and authority may easily divert us from our primary spiritual aim. We think, therefore, that any considerable property of genuine use to AA should be separately incorporated and managed, thus dividing the material from the spiritual. An AA group, as such, should never go into business. Secondary aids to AA, such as clubs or hospitals which require much property or administration, ought to be incorporated and so set apart that, if necessary, they can be freely discarded by the groups. Hence such facilities ought not to use the AA name. Their management should be the sole responsibility of those people who financially support them. For clubs, AA managers are usually preferred. But hospitals, as well as other places of recuperation, ought to be well outside AA-and medically supervised. While an AA group may cooperate with anyone, such cooperation ought never go so far as affiliation or endorsement, actual or implied. An AA group can bind itself to no one. freely discarded by the groups. Hence such facilities ought not to use the AA name. Their management should be the sole responsibility of those people who financially support them. For clubs, AA managers are usually preferred. But hospitals, as well as other places of recuperation, ought to be well outside AA-and medically supervised. While an AA group may cooperate with anyone, such cooperation ought never go so far as affiliation or endorsement, actual or implied. An AA group can bind itself to no one.

Interview With the Author of "Physician, Heal Thyself!"

Fourth in a series of articles on authors of Big Book stories

DR. EARLE

Dr. Earle's story "Physician, Heal Thyself!" appeared in the Second and Third Editions of the Big Book. Dr. Earle was interviewed by telephone at his home in California by a Grapevine staff member.

Continued from May Nightcap

Now, do I think there is a supreme being, a God? Sure I do. Of course. But do I have any religious beliefs? No. Religion demands that you do certain things and my life in AA isn't like that. AA is a very loose-jointed organization. People say there is only one way to work the program. That's crazy. We talk about the "suggested" Steps, which are guides to recovery, not absolutes. Chapter five of the Big Book says "no one among us has been able to maintain anything like perfect adherence to these principles." If we had all the members of AA standing here, everyone would have a different idea what AA is all about. Bill's idea was different from Dr. Bob's, yours will be different from mine. And yet they're all based on one thing and that is: don't drink, and use the Twelve Steps in your own way.

Do you sponsor people differently now than you did years ago?

I don't think I do. Maybe these days sponsees tend to talk about not only their drinking but a little more about the relationship problems, and so we get into conversations about their wives or sweethearts and some emotional problems.

So whatever changes you find in AA, you're not uncomfortable with them?

Well, some AA groups have turned into kind of psychological forums and that isn't AA to me. Maybe it is, I don't know. But here's the way I feel about it, correct or incorrect: AA is my family, and every family has a mix of people in it. Every family has people who are braggarts who think they know everything--every family does. Every family has people who whine all the time--every family. And every family has people who go out and do very well and succeed at the art of living. So when I hear the whiners--well, they're kind of a bore, but on the other hand, a family always has boring whiners in it.

Did your marriage change after you got sober?

Oh my God, yes--I've been married four times. I was sober about fifteen years before I got divorced the first time. I'd been married thirty years. It was a marriage that was not very successful. My wife and I went on different paths, but we were victims of the idea that good boys and girls don't get divorced. Finally I said to Mary, "You know, I think we ought to get divorced," and she said, "I think so too. We don't have much in common." So we had a very sensible, quiet, straight-forward divorce. But you can't hang from the rope for thirty years and not miss it when it's cut down. So, after that I got married twice for very short times to two very fine women, good friends of mine today. Then I had a long time when I wasn't married and then I met my current wife and we've been married fifteen years. She's sitting right here, by the way, working on the computer.

Is there any Step that is a particular help to you?

“Join the Action!”

Many of you have already heard that SAMSO (San Antonio Metropolitan Service Organization) has changed its name to **San Antonio Inter-District**. It is actually not a new name since SAMSO was called “Interdistrict” when it started in January 1993. Our purpose remains the same: *to carry the AA message through coordination of service activities among the districts in the metropolitan service area in accordance with the Traditions and Concepts for World Service of Alcoholics Anonymous.*

The name change is only one of the recommendations that came out of the inventory held on Saturday, May 2 and facilitated by the Southwest Texas Area 68 (SWTA 68) Delegate James H. Attendees answered 13 questions adapted from the group inventory questions found in AA’s pamphlet, “The AA Group.” We took note of what San Antonio Inter-District (or as it was called at the time, SAMSO) was doing well and what we could do better. Several recommendations were made and the Inter-District began taking action on those suggestions at the May 17 general meeting.

One of the main recommendations was to improve communication and coordination of effort among individual AAs, groups, districts, service committees, Inter-District, and our SWTA 68 – all so we can better carry the message to still-suffering alcoholics around our city. A number of good ideas were mentioned to facilitate this improvement. And like all good ideas, people are needed to implement them. That is where you and I come in.

So if you are not already involved, I invite you to become a part of getting the message out to more and more alcoholics in San Antonio, many of whom have never heard of Alcoholics Anonymous. Ideally, every group in San Antonio would have a General Service Representative (GSR), as well as, a representative to each service committee. However, if you cannot commit to regular participation in one of these committees, then consider attending committee meetings when you can and taking information back to your group members on how to get involved. Most service opportunities can be either a regular weekly/monthly commitment, or they can be a single service event for those with changing schedules.

So ask yourself, “What service committee is for me?” Then, come “Join the Action!”
