A DEBT I OWE

In Jan. '03 I entered the Patrician Movement for treatment. I had been to AA before, so I began to go the meetings that were brought in from various groups. That's where I met Ben. The meetings gave me hope.

Six months later, in June, I was released from treatment but could not get the electricity turned on in my home for another 30 days. I checked into a motel on the Austin Hwy. All those old feelings of loneliness and fear returned. I decided to go for a walk. Within a block, I found myself standing between two bars. The music and laughter were calling me inside. In that same moment, I realized that there was a pay phone right in front of me and it HAD a phone book! I opened the book and it fell open to the "A's" and Alcoholics Anonymous. I made the call. Of all people to answer the help-line that day was Ben and I knew I could tell him what was going on. He asked me where I was and said to wait right there that he was sending someone to pick me up. In a few minutes a car full of men arrived to take me to Club 12 to a meeting. I stayed there for 3 meetings and someone gave me a ride home.

That was 7 years ago. I have continued to go to meetings. In fact, the first 4 years, I rode a bus to meetings. I have a sponsor that helps me work the steps, have a job and a car and I have had that Spiritual Awakening that we all want and have started trying to give something back. Now, I carry the message to Laurel Ridge Treatment Center every Thursday and answer the AA help-line for a four hour shift every Wed. These little jobs have helped me pay the debt I owe to AA and always give back more than I can give. God has entered my heart in a way that is indeed miraculous. Today, I was at CSO (San Antonio) answering the help line and Ben walked in. My heart was filled with joy as I was able to tell him my story and that this program WORKS when one alcoholic helps another. Hope to see you all at the 2010 International Convention.



Archives Committee Report: none


Outreach Committee Report: none - There is no outreach committee chair. No volunteers came forward.
