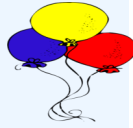

We have found that many of the groups that meet in churches are not receiving the mail we send.

There seems to be a disconnect between your group and the church office that receives your mail.

Mailing a package to your group can cost as much as \$3. That amounts to over \$300 on a simple mail-out to your groups. We need to spend your 7th Tradition money that you contribute to the Office carefully. To do that, We need your group's help with a good mailing address and two contact telephone numbers.

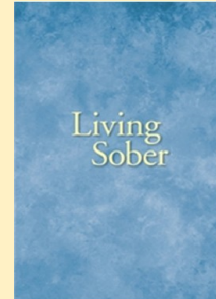

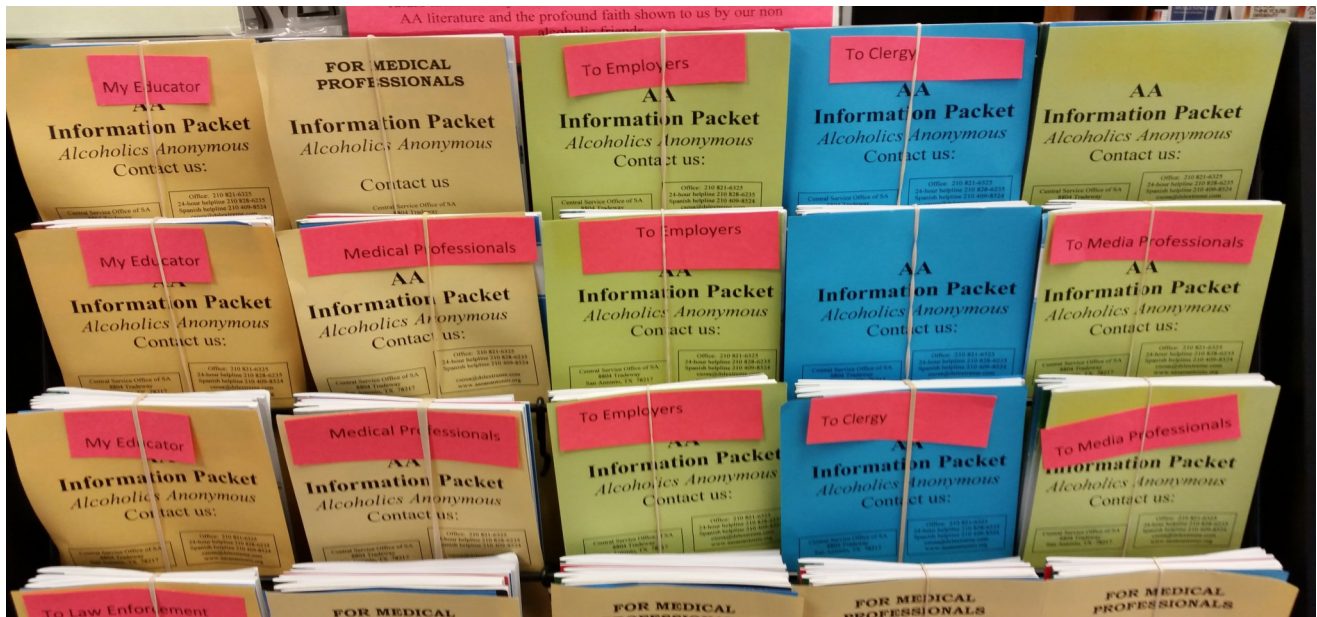

Your Group & Understanding Anonymity at the Group Level



We may use last names within our group. At the same time, we respect the right of other members to maintain their own anonymity however they wish, and as closely as they wish.

Some groups keep a list of names and telephone numbers volunteered by their members, and may provide phone lists—but for the eyes of the group members only.

We repeat no one's personal sharing made in A.A. meetings. The word “anonymous” in our name is a promise of privacy. Besides, the only story of recovery we can truly share is our own.

In our personal relationships with non-alcoholics - and with those we think might have a problem with alcohol - We may feel free to say that we are recovering alcoholics (without divulging the names of other A.A. members), although discretion is recommended. Here our openness may help to carry the message.

We refrain from videotaping that special A.A. talk or meeting which might receive exposure at the public level. And, as the 1980 General Service Conference recommended, it is wiser that talks by A.A. members be given in person, in view of the temptation when videotaping to place personalities before principles and thus encourage the development of a “star” system in Alcoholics Anonymous.

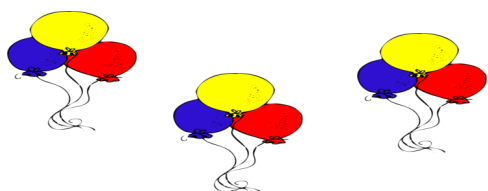

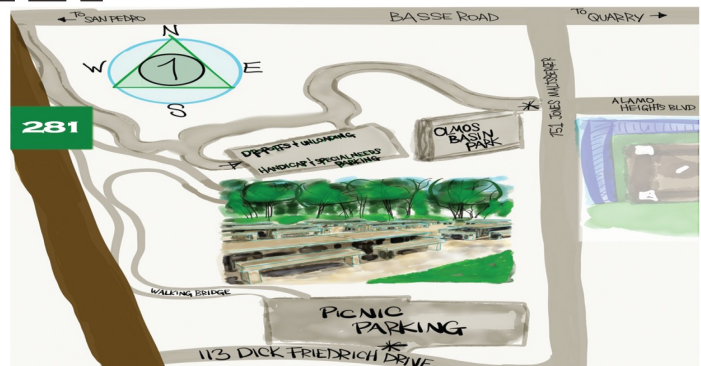

Highlights from A.A.W.S.

Frequently Asked Questions About A.A. Literature

A.A. members read a lot, drawing hope, help and inspiration from the wide range of A.A. material published by A.A.W.S. and the Grapevine. However, a question that has popped up frequently from some of the fellowship's more eagle-eyed readers concerns the book *As Bill Sees It*, and the many quotes contained within it:

Q. Why are some of the quotes in *As Bill Sees It* different from their original sources, and why were Bill's words changed?

A. As he did with so many things in A.A., Bill anticipated the concerns this might raise, adding the following information in the book's Foreword: "This volume includes several hundred excerpts from our literature, touching nearly every aspect of A.A.'s way of life." He then notes the sources of most of the material from which the book's content was chosen, principally the Big Book, Twelve and Twelve, and Grapevine, and explains "Because the quotations used were lifted out of their original context, it has been necessary in the interest of clarity to edit, and sometimes to rewrite, a number of them."

So, for all the A.A. readers out there who have been wondering who had the gall to change Bill's writing, it was Bill himself!

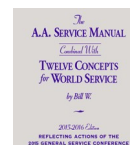
