Notes to our Fellowship

There are many ways that we can carry the message to the alcoholic who suffers.

We notice our service committees are doing that on a daily basis. Below are the service committees in San Antonio. They are under the umbrella of the San Antonio Interdistrict Committee. They are part of the San Antonio District Committee's responsibility.

Each committee meets separately to conduct their business, most on a monthly basis. The Grapevine Committee and the Correctional Facilities Committee meet on even months of the year.

Then the committees come together as a group at the San Antonio Interdistrict Committee to report to the Groups through the Groups Representatives, the GSR, Alternate GSR, or if your group does not have a particular representative, perhaps a member comes to gather the "service" information to take back to the Group members.

As a member of A.A. you are encouraged to attend any service committee meeting and make yourself aware of the various opportunities there are to participate in your own sobriety by carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Or, you may wish to take the message to a Professional who works with alcoholics. This work is what The PI/CPC Committee (Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community does)
