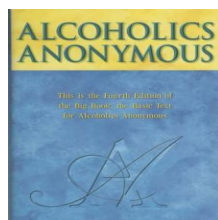
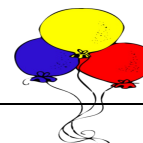

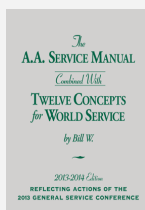

There is time available on the weekends and some daytime hours during the week for a member to host a “Joe & Charley Big Book Study.”

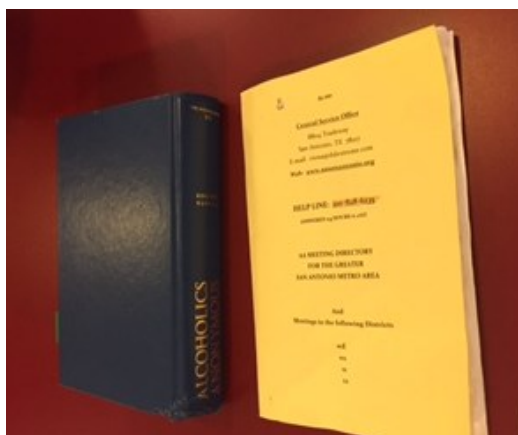
