## **CENTRAL SERVICE OFFICE BOARD**

### **DUTIES OF TRUSTEES**

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall perform such duties as are necessary to carry out the purposes stated in the articles of incorporation of CSOSA, and to achieve the purposes specified herein above, and as directed from time to time by members at a general membership meeting.

Trustees are specifically charged with developing the policies for operation of CSOSA.  
The trustees shall be ex officio nonvoting members of all Board committees.

### **NOMINATIONS OF TRUSTEES**

The Board of Trustees shall consist of seven (7) elected members. Four (4) trustees shall be elected in even-numbered years and three (3) in odd-numbered years.

**This year in November we elect three (3) Trustees.**

Trustees are elected at the November general membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1<sup>st</sup>. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee as provided in paragraph C of this section. Additional nominations may be made by members at a general membership meeting (CSOR Meeting.)

All nominees must be qualified as set forth in Section VII and all must have agreed to serve.

### **QUALIFICATIONS FOR TRUSTEES**

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of alcoholism or other addictive disorders, or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.

**The purposes of CSOSA shall be to:**

Maintain an office for the support of Alcoholics Anonymous activities in the San Antonio Metropolitan Service Area (SAMSA). SAMSA includes A.A. districts whose groups meet in the City of San Antonio and surrounding area at the time of this statement of purpose. These districts may change from time to time.

Provide a central telephone listing under the name "Alcoholics Anonymous" and an office address under the name "Central Service Office" in order to receive and respond appropriately to inquiries from persons seeking information

Purchase and sell literature, sobriety tokens, and other merchandise of help and interest to A.A. groups and individual members, as approved by the Board of Trustees. Items may be sold to the general public and to institutions, as well.

Maintain and publish a directory of A.A. meetings in SAMSA.

Publish a monthly newsletter to keep A.A. members informed of A.A. activities.

Maintain current records of all funds received and disbursed by CSOSA, and produce monthly financial statements, and other reports as directed by the Board of Trustees.

Support committees and activities of A.A. in SAMSA, as directed by the Board of Trustees.

Interestingly, no one is exactly sure why that month was originally chosen, though its connection with Thanksgiving seems obvious.

Gratitude Month has, since the 1940s, been November and our shared thankfulness over the years has taken many forms and will continue to do so as our membership widens.

Gratitude. We all know it serves us best when it's kept alive, in our individual lives and in our group conscience. Realizing this, countless A.A. groups over the years have used the month of November to open the door of gratitude even wider. It's a sure way of insuring a continued healthy sobriety, group unity, and to avoid complacency and stagnation.

Many groups observe Gratitude Month by holding Traditions meetings and taking up special contributions to the Central Service Office by passing the "Gratitude Box". Gratitude Boxes are available at the CSO Bookstore.

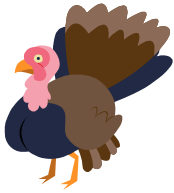

The job of the GvR and RLV is to familiarize members with the Fellowship's international journal, The A.A. Grapevine, and its bi-monthly Spanish-language magazine La Viña, and the enhancements to sobriety the magazines offer. The magazines contain

articles written by A.A. members based upon their personal experiences; discussion topics; regular features, and a calendar of special A.A. events. Representatives will then receive quarterly mailings containing order forms for the magazine and for books, audio and other Grapevine items. GVRs and RLVs can also register online at the Grapevine website: [www.aagrapevine.org](http://www.aagrapevine.org). Make out magazine subscription checks to the Grapevine, Inc.

*Literature representative:* The group's literature representative makes certain that A.A. Conference approved books and pamphlets, ordered from the General Service Office, or purchased from the local intergroup (central office), are on hand for meetings and properly displayed. Group literature representatives can obtain information on their responsibilities by writing to the literature coordinator at G.S.O. Regular communications are sent to literature representatives from G.S.O. The A.A. Guideline for Literature Committees is also a valuable resource.

For A.A. literature and subscriptions to the A.A. newsletter *Box 4-5-9*, checks should be made out to A.A. World Services, Inc. Many A.A. groups purchase bulk subscriptions to *Box 4-5-9* (in units of 10) for distribution to their members, thus providing them regular communication with A.A. in the U.S., Canada and countries throughout the world.

## Spellbound By AA: An Interview With Nell Wing—June 1994

### Continued from the October Nightcap

I'm especially grateful that Bill so strongly believed in preserving AA's experience. He knew the importance of getting things done, and had a special gift for timing. I often think, suppose he hadn't possessed certain leadership abilities--where would AA be now? Maybe some little sect, who knows? I think it was destined. I think the Higher Power set this up, I really do. The fantastic success of AA is like a big puzzle and there are pieces that you know fit in but you just don't know where until you look back into the past.

How has being so close to the Fellowship affected you?

Well, I always like to say I'm on the outside looking in. About a week after I first came to the office, I attended an open AA meeting at a meeting hall on 41st Street. I remember a gentleman sharing his story and I found myself weeping--while everyone else was laughing! Right from the start, I was spellbound by AA. One person helping another who had a similar problem--that was as stunning an idea to me at that time as it is now.

Over the years, I've gained some spiritual gifts myself. Most nonalcoholics who are familiar with AA feel the same sense of growth.

Hanging around with a bunch of drunks for this long--it can only go up from here!

I'll tell you something, I don't know people who have lived and learned and reacted to life like AA members. I've been taught--and I'm grateful. Every morning when I wake up, I express gratitude for what's happened to me.

## Nell Wing

Nell Wing started work at the Alcoholic Foundation, 415 Lexington Ave, NYC. Starting as a typist earning \$32 a week (\$300+ in 2007 dollars), she stayed for 36 years. (*Grateful to Have Been There* by Nell Wing page 15, *Getting Better Inside Alcoholics Anonymous* by Nan Robertson page 67)

She was the Administrative assistant and secretary to Bill Wilson, the founder of A.A., in New York City from 1947 until 1982. Nell was also the 1st archivist for A.A. GSO from after Bill's death until she retired. After that, she traveled the world, often speaking at A.A. functions. She worked with Lois at Stepping Stones until Lois passed in 1988, an association that lasted 42 years.
