

Home Group Topics - a series of articles of home group interest

"Crosstalk" in meetings

Does AA have an official description of what exactly constitutes crosstalk? Is it prohibited in AA?

There is no one rule that prohibits "crosstalk" in AA. Many groups have strong customs against crosstalk.

How does your Home Group handle crosstalk?

Here are some of the samples of crosstalk we found in our research

- People speaking out of turn, interrupting someone while they are speaking.
- Giving direct advice to someone in a meeting (unsolicited) about what a member shared.
- Embarrassing lecture to a member during the meeting.
- Interrupting a member and telling them what they see as right or wrong.
- Members frequently interrupt one another for joking comments.
- Using share time to tell someone else what they should be thinking, what you think of them ("You're doing a
 great job,") what they should do or not do.
- Members commenting under their breath (for everyone to hear) after someone else shares such as mmm
 hmmm, oh yes i can relate to that, rude noises, oh such a pity etc.

Some results of crosstalk in meetings we found In our research

- Cross talk may be hurtful to a member, shifting total focus onto a person.
- Newcomers need to feel safe in AA meetings.

Thoughts on The Topic

We need to remember that new members (or others attending an open meeting) do not necessarily understand what we mean when we say "no cross-talk during the meeting." Some may be very eager to share and will respond during another person's share. Others may be very opinionated (possibly angry) depending on past experience or their possible lack of desire to attend the meeting (court ordered, family pressure, etc.).

How do we as members help our newcomers understand the term crosstalk?

Every Group is Autonymous - Tradition Four

The ultimate arbiter of the subject is the individual group which is free to follow its own customs. What is considered quite proper


