Wheelchair Accessible?**

Please assist us by informing your Central Service Office of your current accessibility status.

At your meeting place:

- \* Is there designated parking for disabled persons?
- \* Is there a ramp for wheelchair access, when entrance requires the use of stairs?
- \* Do the doorways have a minimum clearance of 32 inches and thresholds lower than 3/4 inch?
- \* Are the hallways at least 36 inches wide?
- \* If there is an elevator, are the call buttons 48 inches or lower?
- \* Is the elevator entrance at least 36 inches wide, with a 51 inch deep and 68 inch wide car.
- \* Is there a 36 inch wide, obstacle-free path to the bathroom?
- \* Are the bathroom stall entrances at least 32 inches wide; is the stall at least 56 inches deep by 60 inches wide?
- \* Is the toilet seat 17 to 19 inches from the floor?
- \* Does the toilet stall include grab bars?

A.A. co-founder Bill W. wrote in *The Language Of The Heart* (p. 15) that “It should be the privilege of each individual A.A. to cloak himself with as much personal anonymity as he desires. His fellow A.A.s should respect his wishes and help guard whatever status he wants to assume.” It is thus up to each individual to decide how anonymous he or she wishes to be, at any level below that of the public level. Giving your last name in an A.A. meeting is not “breaking” A.A.’s Tradition of anonymity.

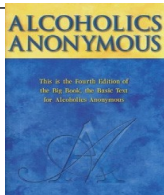

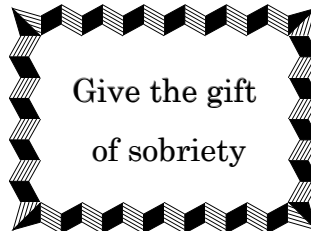

## ***CSO Board of Trustees - time to elect !***

***The nominating committee for the CSO Board of Trustees election will soon convene and begin the process of choosing nominees for the annual election of CSO Board of Trustees.***

***Come to the next CSOR meeting to begin this process.***

Trustees are elected at the November General Membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1<sup>st</sup>. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee. Additional nominations may be made by members at a General Membership Meeting. All nominees must be qualified; and all must have agreed to serve.

### **Qualifications:**

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of alcoholism or other addictive disorders; or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.



**Tradition Ten (long form)**



No A.A. group or member should ever, in such a way as to implicate A.A., express any opinion on outside controversial issues - particularly those of politics, alcohol reform, or sectarian religion. The Alcoholics Anonymous groups oppose no one. Concerning such matters they can express no views whatsoever.
