CENTRAL SERVICE OFFICE BOARD

QUALIFICATIONS FOR TRUSTEES

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of alcoholism or other addictive disorders, or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies. Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.

DUTIES OF TRUSTEES

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall perform such duties as are necessary to carry out the purposes stated in the articles of incorporation of CSOSA, and to achieve the purposes specified herein above, and as directed from time to time by members at a general membership meeting. Trustees are specifically charged with developing the policies for operation of CSOSA. The trustees shall be ex officio nonvoting members of all Board committees.

The Board Chairperson assigns each Board Member to one of several board assignments.

NOMINATIONS OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees shall consist of seven (7) elected members. Four (4) trustees shall be elected in even-numbered years and three (3) in odd-numbered years.

This year in November we elect three (3) Trustees.

Trustees are elected at the November general membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1st. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee as provided in paragraph C of this section. Additional nominations may be made by members at a general membership meeting (CSOR Meeting.) All nominees must be qualified as set forth in Section VII and all must have agreed to serve.

What Trusted Servants Do We Need? The Home Group

General service representative (G.S.R.)

Working via the district and area committees, the G.S.R. is the group's link with the General Service Conference, through which U.S. and Canadian groups share their experience and voice A.A.'s collective conscience.

Sometimes called "the guardians of the Traditions," G.S.R.s become familiar with A.A.'s Third Legacy—our spiritual responsibility to give service freely. Usually elected to serve two-year terms, they:

• Represent the group at district meetings and area assemblies.

• Keep group members informed about general service activities in their local areas.

Receive and share with their groups all mail from the General Service Office, including the newsletter *Box 4-5-9*, which is G.S.O.'s primary tool for communicating with the Fellowship.

G.S.R.s also may assist their groups in solving a variety of problems, especially those related to the Traditions. In serving their groups, they can draw on all the services offered by G.S.O. (see p. 30)

An alternate G.S.R. is elected at the same time in the event that the G.S.R. may be unable to attend all district and area meetings. Alternate G.S.R.s should be encouraged to share the responsibilities of the G.S.R. at the group, district and area levels. (See *The A.A. Service Manual,* Chapter 2, "The Group and its G.S.R.," for further information.) *Financial Support:* Current experience indicates that many groups provide financial support for their general service representatives to attend service functions.

Continued from the September Nightcap

What were Bill's depressions like?

Most times you didn't know he was going through it. His depressions came and went. Sometimes, not often, but occasionally, when he was dictating to me in the office, he would just put his head in his hands and weep for a bit. The worst of these depression bouts were between 1945 and 1955. What he accomplished, AA-wise, despite his depressions, is a miracle.

So many people wanted Bill's advice--not just AA and Al-Anon friends, but nearby neighbors at Bedford Hills. They'd ask if they could come over to Stepping Stones, and Bill always said yes to everyone.

To get away from the phone ringing and all the people, Bill and Lois would often go away in the middle of the week--to their "hideaway," they called it, a small rented cottage ten or fifteen miles away. Lois would write and work on A1-Anon matters and Bill would catch up on correspondence and memos regarding current AA projects.

Then, once a year they often took an overseas trip, usually in the fall, and in the spring would take a trip around the United States and Canada, visiting AA friends and discussing AA matters. Harriet, the housekeeper, would pick up their mail and I'd go through it to see what needed to be answered right away and what could wait for their return.

Bill seems to have taken every opportunity possible to communicate--through memos, letters, Grapevine articles, the Big Book, the "Twelve and Twelve," traveling around, talking to groups and at special occasions. . .

Yes, he was a terrific communicator! And he felt intensely the need to share his plans for AA's future and to receive endorsement of them--despite the often feisty opposition from some.

Right here, I would like to mention the Grapevine book, *The Language of the Heart,* for I think it's a most valuable book. If you want to know what Bill W. was all about, read that book!

Did you do any work in terms of archiving Bill's numerous Grapevine articles?

For *The Language of the Heart?* No. But for the General Service Office, yes. Grapevines, newsletters, and Conference Reports were among the first items I started collecting for the Archives project in 1955.

Tell us about working in the Archives of the General Service Office.

I wanted the Archives started, as did Bill. My father, who valued history, had a huge library at home, and after college I took a course in library science and liked it. I always thought that it was very important to preserve AA history, preserve how it started and how it grew--to remember the mistakes in order to avoid future ones. It certainly was important to Bill, but it was hard to get others to understand the need for setting up an Archives. In Europe, in the fifties, archives were thought to be very important, but were not generally considered so here in the United States. We're a "now" people; we don't always think about the future in terms of preserving the past.

In 1954, a fellow named Ed B. was hired to help Bill with his writing projects. Ed was a wonderful guy--a writer, a criminologist, and just newly sober--but he didn't think it was important to preserve all the material we had collected and researched. Our desks were opposite each other and I'd watch him going through pamphlets and letters, throwing many of them in the wastebasket. I'd say, "Hey, Ed, we can't throw all this away." I knew from experience that each of Bill's letters contained at least five different ideas! Ed had had a laryngectomy --so he'd write out a note, "No, that's not important anymore." I didn't argue, but after he left work at four o'clock, I'd take everything out of the wastebasket and put it all safely away in storage boxes until I could sort it out.
