What 12 Step Volunteers do

What does a 12-Step volunteer do?

12-Step volunteers work hand-in-hand with the San Antonio Helpline and Central Service Office. They do everything from talking to a practicing alcoholic about AA to taking an out-of-town visitor to a meeting. Whereas Helpline volunteers take the initial call and disburse it, 12-Step volunteers do the actual "leg work".

How does the process work?

When someone calls either the Helpline or Central Office, the individual is asked for their first name and zip code. Then, the 12-Step list is consulted, and depending on whether it is a man or woman, the appropriate person in that zip code is contacted and given the information. The 12-Step volunteer then contacts that person.

Will I be continuously doing 12-Step calls? I'm not sure if I have that much time to volunteer!

No, most of the time you will just be talking to them on the phone and then perhaps meeting them at a meeting. However, there are times when it could be necessary to get another person and actually go out and do a 12-Step call. You will only be contacted if someone calls from your zip code, so you could go for months without receiving a call.

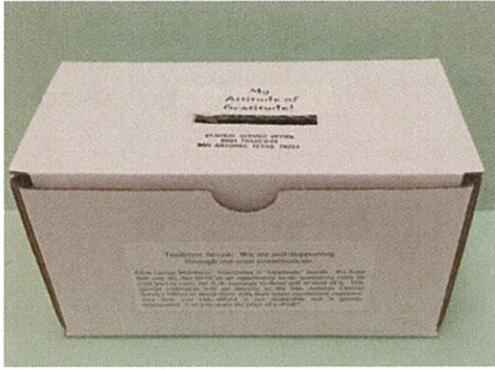

The Office Manager of the Central Service Office shall serve as secretary of the Board of Trustees, will participate in its meetings as a nonvoting member, and will maintain its official files at the CSOSA address.

Board of Trustee Qualifications:

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of alcoholism or other addictive disorders, or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.

Nominating Committee

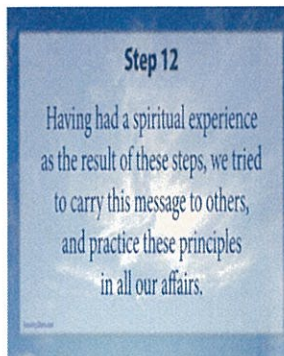

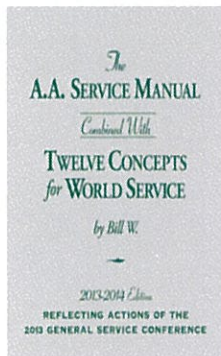

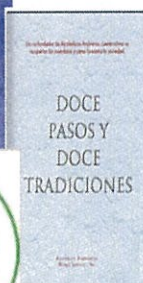

REQUIREMENTS OF THE CSO BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEMBERS

There are seven elected Trustees. Four elected in even numbered years. Three elected in odd numbered years.

Board members must have five years or more of continuous sobriety prior to nominations. The trustees serve two year terms on the Board.

Board of Trustee meetings are held once a month on the Thursday before the third Monday at 6:00pm. Attendance is required. Missing two consecutive meetings may forfeit your position on the Board.

The Board of Trustee primary duties are:

- Developing policies for the operation of the CSOSA
- Develop and oversee CSO budget
- Non-voting member of all Board Committees
- Oversee hiring and job performance of Office Manager
- Voting member of the CSOR Meeting
- Attend functions of the Central Service Office
- Additional assignments as determined by the Board Chairperson

Additional assignments may include:

- Board Chairperson
- Vice Chairperson
- CSO Rep Liaison - monthly meeting 3rd Monday of month with CSOR's
- Events Coordinator
- Financial Advisor – meet monthly with Office Manager and 3rd Monday of month with CSOR's
- Hispanic Intergroup Liaison – monthly meeting with Hispanic Intergroup
- San Antonio Inter-District Liaison – monthly meeting with Inter-District
- Archives Committee Liaison – Monthly meeting with Archives Committee
- Education

Each of these assignments do require some additional time and effort. It is not a full or part time job though. And they are opportunities to be involved in areas of AA you may have little to no knowledge of. These assignments are kept for one year and then reassigned the following year. You will serve in two capacities total.
