Central Service Office Representatives Meeting Minutes

Monday, June 16, 2008, 6:00 P.M.

Opening: Casey B. opened with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.

Introductions: New COR – Rob from Young and Done

Approve Previous Month's Minutes: Minutes approved as presented.

Announcements: See CSO website for announcements. Debbie talked about Sobriety Fest, July 5th, 3:00 till whenever at the Goliad Group - 12 Steps to Freedom. Reagan talked about Dist 17 Quarterly Sharing Session of SAMSO Aug 9th from 1:00 to 4:00 @ Serendipity. Donna – 11:00 meeting, 12:00 Pot Luck, 1:00 Tradition Workshop, Saturday June 21st at Serendipity. Reagan announced she is still working on the special needs survey and needs them in by the first Sunday in July.

Financial Report: Linda reported that for May, CSO showed a low income probably due to the fact that much of the merchandise was packed away during construction, as well as the new accounting procedure taking effect. New accounting procedure shows the expenditures as they are paid, not as they occur.

CSO Board Liaison Report: Char reported the Board decided to keep the whole space of the new office. Leeda has resigned from the Board because she missed two meetings and the Board has appointed Suzanne M. to replace her. Also, Brian has resigned to devote more time to law school and will be replaced as well. If you would like to nominate someone, you may pick up a nomination form from CSO. Requirement to be on the Board is five years of continuous sobriety. The following items are needed for the new space: bookcase, conference table(s), glass countertop display case.

Telephone Service Report: No report given.

Archives Committee Report: Paul reported that the recorder has been purchased and already have people lined up to give their oral history. He is still waiting on release form to be approved by lawyer. If you have anyone you would like to suggest for an oral history, call Paul @ (210) 826-2571. These persons should have had an impact on local AA. Call Paul as well if you would like to help put together visual displays.

Outreach Committee Report: Felipe reported that he, Casey, and Char had a meeting to discuss the Outreach Committee. They decided we needed a 5 to 7 member committee to help organize the outreach effort. It is suggested that every COR attend at least one different meeting per month to try and recruit new CORs and to sell subscriptions to the Nightcap. Current Nightcap expenses are running around \$1,400, and current Nightcap income is running around \$300. Meeting will be held the second Monday in July at 6:00 PM at CSO. Char will send a letter to groups that CSO has an address for to outline these items.

Old Business: None

New Business: Nominating committee to oversee Board elections in Nov. will be Donna from Serendipity, Paul, and Debbie from Goliad.

There was lively discussion about Board representation at COR meetings. Concerns were that the Board's CSO liaison had not been present at a COR meeting in over six months. It was pointed out that there was always representation from the Board present at COR meetings through Linda or Char. It was decided to send a note to the Board chairman that we would like official Board representation at our meetings.

Donna from Serendipity was nominated for chairperson, nomination was seconded and she was elected unanimously.

Paul was nominated for Vice Chairperson, nomination was seconded and he was elected unanimously.

Chris from Colonies North volunteered to continue, self nomination was seconded and he was elected unanimously.

Passed the Seventh Tradition basket. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

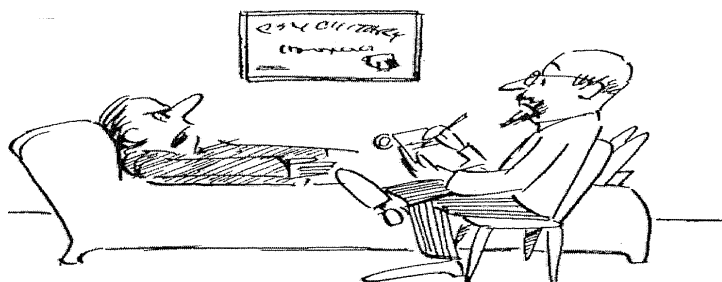
