CSO Board of Trustees

The nominating committee for the CSO Board of Trustees election will soon convene and begin the process of choosing nominees for the annual election of CSO Board of Trustees.

Nomination Information Forms are available at the CSO office. Filling out this form is the first step of the process for election.

Trustees are elected at the November general membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1st. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee. Additional nominations may be made by members at a general membership meeting. All nominees must be qualified. and all must have agreed to serve.

Qualifications:

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.


Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of

alcoholism or other addictive disorders, or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.

They are authorized by the groups to handle our over-all public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principal newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.
