22.2 % of San Antonio’s population is over 55 years old, according to the 2014 US Census.

53% of our AA membership is over 51 years old, according to the Alcoholics Anonymous 2014 membership survey. (P-48)

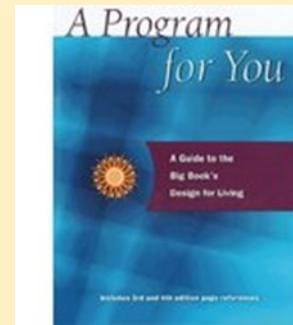

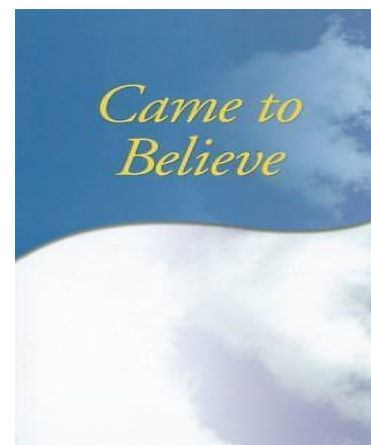

In my own experience, a spiritual awakening was not *found* by seeking it. Others claimed spiritual belief came with sobriety, and I wanted that belief so desperately that I almost missed it altogether.

Then a series of adversities set in. It seemed everything I had was swept away. My emotional stability was so tested that a couple of times I considered suicide.

But at no time was a drink considered, even though craving for the taste of liquor hit me momentarily at times. However, the First Step and I have always been great friends. I repeated it every five seconds and thanked God each day for my sobriety – the only grace, maybe, for that day.

Gradually, I began to see another part of me emerging – a grateful me, expecting nothing, but sure that another power was beginning to guide me, and direct my ways. And I was not afraid.

Then, as this power began to unfold new selves within me, a greater understanding of my fellowmen began. With a new awakening each day – new strengths, new truths, new acceptance of A.A. people and people not in A.A. – a new world opened up. And every day it still does.

The adversities, loneliness, sickness, losses, and disappointments mean nothing now. I'm happy, because I came to believe – not only in God, but in the goodness in everyone

Central Service Office Board of Trustees

Your Central Service Office of San Antonio

The nominating committee for the CSO Board of Trustees election will soon convene and begin the process of choosing nominees for the annual election of CSO Board of Trustees. This is a committee of the CSOR's (Central Service Office Representatives, who are members of your Home Group, elected by your Home Group to represent you as a member of AA in San Antonio AA Groups.

This process will begin at the September CSOR meeting by the Nominating Committee presenting a list of AA members who wish to stand for this position. The Nominating Committee is elected by your Home Group's CSOR in January.

There will be an election for three (3) Board of Trustees.

Trustees are elected at the November general membership meeting to serve for two (2) years beginning the following January 1st. Candidates for trustee shall be named by a nominating committee. Additional nominations may be made by members at a general membership meeting. All nominees must be qualified and all must have agreed to serve.

Qualifications:

Any person nominated as a trustee must be a member of a registered A.A. group and must have achieved at least five (5) years of continuous sobriety during the five (5) years prior to nomination.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an employee or member of the governing board of any agency licensed for the treatment of alcoholism or other addictive disorders, or operated for education concerning such disorders. This restriction also applies to members of advisory boards of such agencies.

Any person serving, or nominated to serve, as a trustee shall not be an officer or director of a club where A.A. meetings are regularly held.

DUTIES OF TRUSTEES

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall perform such duties as are necessary to carry out the purposes stated in the articles of incorporation of CSOSA, and to achieve the purposes specified herein above, and as directed from time to time by members at a general membership meeting. Trustees are specifically charged with developing the policies for operation of CSOSA.

The trustees shall be ex officio nonvoting members of all Board committees.

The Board of Trustees may contract for the services of a paid Office Manager who, in turn, may hire additional paid employees as necessary. These additional paid employees shall be wholly under the direction of the Office Manager, but may not be discharged without prior consultations with the Board of Trustees. Direct supervision of the Office Manager will be exercised by the Board of Trustees. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees, his designate, is acknowledged as the conduit by which the Board of Trustees exercises its direct supervision of the Office Manager.

Each trustee shall have only one (1) vote in matters addressed at a general membership meeting, regardless of his other status as a District Committee Member or representative of a group.

In the general membership meeting next following the trustee meeting, actions taken in trustee meetings shall be reported in summary form, specifying the numerical results of any votes taken with each trustee being named as to the position taken on each issue. Any board action is subject to veto by a majority of the members present.

The trustees are expected to carry out their duties to CSOSA without conflict of interest or the appearance of conflict of interest. Specifically, no trustee should appear to benefit from any decision involving CSOSA in which he or she is involved, that no individual member or group appears to be favored by CSOSA actions, and that no individual member or group appears to be favored by CSOSA actions, and that all actions taken by the Board as a whole or its individual trustees in the name of CSOSA, are inspired by the principles and the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous.

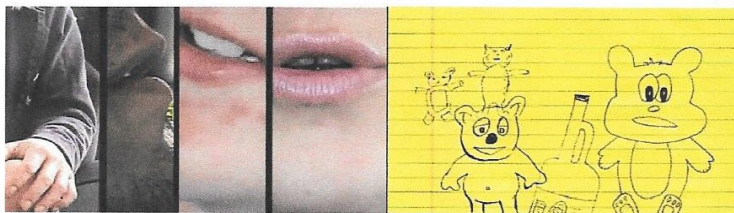

A.A. VIDEOS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE



Video submissions from A.A. members are still being sought to carry A.A.'s message of recovery from alcoholism to young people in high school and college settings.

There is no set deadline; submissions are being accepted on an ongoing basis.

- ✓ Individuals submitting videos must be at least 18 years of age and must reside within the boundaries of the U.S. and Canada A.A. General Service Structure.
- ✓ Submissions should be in English, Spanish or French, and no longer than 7 minutes in length.
- ✓ Submissions should reflect and adhere to the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Suggestions for content

- Use members' stories (what it was like, what happened and what it is like now) to help alcoholics identify.
- Focus on the experience of getting sober young.
- Emphasize what A.A. is and what it is not.
- Use your talent/imagination, modern technology, animation, puppets, etc. to make our message attractive. Search "Videos" on AA.org for examples!

Be creative and have fun!

Technical specs, how to submit, and all that stuff:

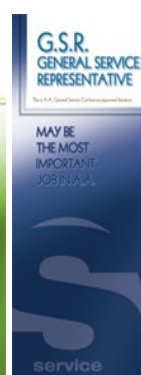

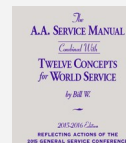
