Tradition Nine (long form)

Each A.A. group needs the least possible organization. Rotating leadership is the best. The small group may elect its secretary, the large group its rotating committee, and the groups of a large metropolitan area their central or intergroup committee, which often employs a full-time secretary. The trustees of the General Service Board are, in effect, our A.A. General Service Committee. They are the custodians of our A.A. Tradition and the receivers of voluntary A.A. contributions by which we maintain our A.A. General Service Office at New York. They are authorized by the groups to handle our over-all public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principle newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.

VI. BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees shall consist of seven (7) elected members. In addition, the District Committee Members of SAMSA shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting members. Four (4) trustees shall be elected in even-numbered years and three (3) in odd-numbered years. The Office Manager of the Central Service Office shall serve as secretary of the Board of Trustees, will participate in its meetings as a nonvoting member, and will maintain its official files at the CSOSA address.

The above section is the Bylaw being revised.

Business on the Agenda

At the upcoming September Central Service Office Representatives General Membership Meeting there will be two motions to vote on.

Both motions came from the Board of Trustees.

The CSORs that were at the August Meeting for CSORs were given the motions to take back to each of their respective Groups to have their Groups vote on the motions. The CSORs will bring the Groups vote back to the September CSOR meeting.

Motions to be voted on:

Motion One - "To connect the Central Service Office on-line "Meeting Schedule" to the "Meeting Guide" application.

Motion Two - This motion is a by-law change to the Central Service Office By-laws. Add the following to the Section VI. Board of Trustees.

"In addition an ex-officio, non-voting member will serve a 1 year term. This member will be a former board member who has completed a full term as a Board of Trustee and will serve in an advisory position only for historical purposes."

CHANGES, AMENDMENTS, REPEAL, AND RATIFICATION

These bylaws and any amendment, change, or repeal thereto must be approved by a majority of the trustees in a regular monthly meeting, and ratified by vote of two-thirds of the members present at a general membership meeting which follows the initial presentation of the amendment, change, or appeal by no more than sixty (60) days.

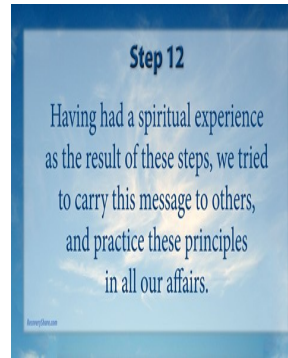

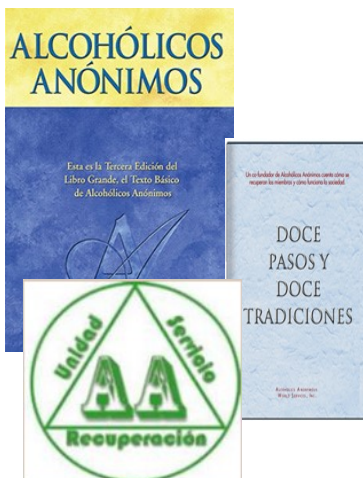
