I think that many oldsters who have put our AA "booze cure" to severe but successful tests still find they often lack emotional sobriety. Perhaps they will be the spearhead for the next major development in AA—the development of much more real maturity and balance (which is to say, humility) in our relations with ourselves, with our fellows, and with God.

Those adolescent urges that so many of us have for top approval, perfect security, and perfect romance—urges quite appropriate to age seventeen—prove to be an impossible way of life when we are at age forty-seven or fifty-seven.

Since AA began, I've taken immense wallops in all these areas because of my failure to grow up, emotionally and spiritually. My God, how painful it is to keep demanding the impossible, and how very painful to discover finally, that all along we have had the cart before the horse! Then comes the final agony of seeing how awfully wrong we have been, but still finding ourselves unable to get off the emotional merry-go-round.

How to translate a right mental conviction into a right emotional result, and so into easy, happy, and good living—well, that's not only the neurotic's problem, it's the problem of life itself for all of us who have got to the point of real willingness to hew to right principles in all our affairs.

How do you feel about your home group? I was told when I first came in that if I didn't feel that my home group was ***the best AA group ever***, then I wasn't in the right group. I was told a healthy group had lots of participation and followed the 12 Traditions I still take that to heart today, even though I participate in several groups. It's my home group that keeps me accountable and grounded in recovery. It's my home group where my vote counts on any issues inside or outside of my group. I was also told early on that I have the privilege of giving back to my group through service. It was explained to me that there was a myriad of ways to serve. Just suit up and show up to offer my experience, strength and hope through sharing and sponsorship. There are lots of group "chores" like making coffee, setting up chairs, cleaning the room or just taking out the trash. Most groups have service positions like GSR, Treasurer, CSOR and representatives on the service committees. I was particularly bitten by the service bug. Serving as a GSR is a very humbling experience. You learn really fast what "trusted servant" means at group conscious. My "great ideas" seldom were implemented. After all the opinions are heard and weighed, the best outcome is decided by everyone with a loving God at the center. If you don't attend your group conscious meetings, you give up your right to be a part of any decisions. Alcoholics Anonymous is the most democratic self-governing entity to date with each group acting autonomously. But we have a responsibility to show up and be heard and counted. In the service structure of Alcoholics Anonymous the groups are at the top of the upside-down pyramid. That means we have the ultimate voice in making worldwide decisions. That's a big responsibility! So, I guess we should all suit up and show up if we want to continue serving the alcoholic that still suffers, right? Because that is our primary purpose, no matter what!

If you want to serve all the groups in the San Antonio and surrounding area, there will be 4 vacancies on the Central Service: Office Board of Trustees next year. If you have 5 years of continuous sobriety and working knowledge of the 12 Traditions, you can make a difference in this vital service. Please call the office to find out how to submit your application for the November elections. ***You are needed!***

Your A.A. Group Treasurer – A More Important Role Than You May Think!

The position of group treasurer is one of the most responsible positions in any A.A. group! While the work of the group treasurer often involves many details, it is important to remember that the money the treasurer oversees serves a spiritual purpose: it enables each group to fulfill its primary purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers. This is the vital work of A.A.!

The traditional means of assuring that the group is self-supporting is to pass the basket in accordance with A.A.'s 7th tradition. Several groups have utilized digital payment platforms as well (Venmo, PayPal, Square, etc. – thanks, 2020). Since there are no dues or fees for A.A. membership, members attending the meeting are asked to make voluntary contributions to help cover the group's expenses and to support local services.

After the basket is passed, the group treasurer takes charge of the money collected and is responsible for paying the group's rent or other bills. But beyond that, the treasurer needs to be well informed about how the group's money is spent. After the group's basic needs are met, such as providing for rent, literature, sobriety chips, refreshments, etc., the group ought to participate in the financial support of the Fellowship as a whole by sending money to various A.A. service entities, including, very importantly: our Central Service Office on Broadway, the San Antonio Inter-Service (made up of various vital service committees: Grapevine/La Vina, Treatment, Correctional Facilities, Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community, etc.). Your A.A. District as well (all groups in San Antonio are in 1 of 6 districts) needs financial support to hold workshops, barbecues, service events, etc. The General Service Office in New York also relies on group contributions.

These essential service entities use financial contributions in several ways, always with the aim of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Online and recurring contributions to our Central Service Office on Broadway can be made online, by credit card, PayPal or Venmo via aasanantonio.org. The General Service Office in NY also accepts online donations via aa.org. The other A.A. entities receive contributions in the form of check or money orders. Treasurers should have addresses and mailing information for all A.A. service entities that the group contributes to! FYI here they are:

Many groups, including my home-group, split their 7th tradition excess proceeds via percentage to the various service entities. For example: a group may send 25% of their proceeds to Inter-Service, 25% to Central Service Office, 25% to General Service Office in NY, and 25% to the group's corresponding District. Some groups send out disbursements monthly, some quarterly, some annually. Many treasurers also keep a ledger to show the group conscience where the money is all going. Remember, the goal of an A.A. group is to be self-supporting and break even, not to earn a profit.

How does your group spend its excess funds? Where is your group sending them to? These are important questions to ask your group conscience and your treasurer! When you put money in the basket, you are not only contributing to your group, but you are also (theoretically) contributing to A.A. as a whole via your group's disbursements! If you're unsure how your group is spending its funds, ask!

- Any Trustee serving or nominated to serve shall not be an officer or director of a club where AA meetings are regularly held.
- A former Trustee may not be appointed or elected to the Board of Trustees.
- No trustee may be elected for two (2) consecutive terms of office but may serve an appointed or elected partial term followed immediately by a full term.

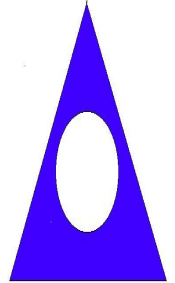
