GSO's Accessibilities and Remote Communities desk can be a resource

This past year, due to the COVID-19 health crisis, the General Service Office's (GSO) Accessibilities and Remote Communities desk saw an increased need to reach out to senior AA members and elder newcomers. Many members shared about a rise in isolation and drinking problems among our senior members.

Local AA Cooperation with the Elder Community Committees (CEC) can be a help-line to bridge the gap and bring hope, information and resources to these members. These local CEC committees can bring AA meetings into senior centers or retirement communities and/or distribute AA literature at locations that elder members frequent, such as senior centers, health care facilities and drugstores. They can also contact ministers and geriatric physicians to raise awareness about AA.

At this time there are few CEC Committees in the U.S. and Canada. The Accessibilities and Remote Communities assignment staff member at GSO is a resource point for these CEC Committees, responding to inquiries regarding activities, sending related AA materials and packets containing shared CEC experience from U.S. and Canada members who are involved in this important AA service.

Also, early this year, following an advisory action from the General Service Conference, the Accessibilities and Remote Communities desk sent a call out to the Fellowship for stories to update the pamphlet, "A.A. for the Older Alcoholic," to include contemporary issues concerning senior members. A revision is in the works.

I recently attended the 45th Annual Hill Country Round Up in beautiful Kerrville, Texas. The theme was Unity and about 500 souls in recovery rallied for the event. The speakers had a recurring message this year. It was all about reaching out to the new-comer and continuing to carry this message of hope. This fellowship was founded 86 years ago and has come through wars, economic depressions/recessions, social and political unrest and now a pandemic. We still carry the message, one alcoholic talking to another alcoholic, in person and/or virtually. Our methods may be different, but the message is still the same. There's always a way to serve our primary purpose.

Our Central Service Office is still the axis that keeps the recovery wheels in motion. The 24-hour help line is still answered by volunteers. Communication and information is shared through monthly publications. Groups still can purchase literature and sobriety tokens at CSO. You can find speakers for your group meetings. Get your event flyers or service committee information printed professionally. Looking for the perfect recovery card or gift for a special friend or Sponsee? They've got a myriad to choose from. Just want a place to stop and feel "at home"? Stop by GSO and visit Virginia or Jim. But be careful not to stay too long cause they just might put you to work. What does that look like? How about putting together new-comer packets, update 12-step call lists and speaker lists or organize literature racks? There's always something to do at CSO. One of the best things you can do to help CSO is take a friend or Sponsee and introduce it as their **"one stop source for all their recovery literature and merchandise"**. It's the gift that will keep on giving!

The Inter-Service Committees always have need for volunteers to help carry the message. You can take meetings to treatment or correctional facilities. Sponsor a detainee by mail. Hand out information on Alcoholics Anonymous at health fairs. Give presentations to professionals on how they can help their patients or clients with our message. Gather Grapevine/La Vina magazines to distribute to anywhere problem drinkers may be looking for recovery. The avenues of service are many. All we have to do is suit up, show up and be willing to serve. You don't have to have years of sobriety. Just a few hours may be more than some have, and they want to know how you did it! Tell them!!! **Give them what you've got...experience, strength, and hope!**

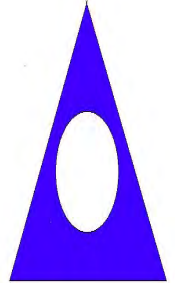
