Archives Plan of Action and Goals for the Year 2022 (revised)

Despite the pandemic leading up to and continuing through the early months of 2021 and variants appearing on the scene, the Archives Committee enjoyed an active and involved 2021. We plan to build on the exposure gained and continue to keep it going into 2022. Key items have been an explosion of interest in the oral history project, a growing desire to have groups included in the “group history binder” as some have called it, and an understanding of what the “Things We Cannot Change” project is really about. With all the enthusiasm and interest being expressed by the fellowship, our biggest task may be to recruit more members to carry out projects. The communication goal for the year is to better identify the Archives Committee as a service to groups that is provided by their Central Service Office.

Archivist The Archivist will continue with the preservation, restoration, and conservation of our documents as the primary task this year. That, and continuing to train committee members to help consolidate the repository are uppermost continuing projects.

Group History Our goal is to capitalize on the interest expressed and complete five histories of the groups already requesting our help. Ideally, each history will be planned and scheduled for a group's anniversary celebration. The process of researching, interviewing, gathering and displaying the results is arduous but worthwhile. It helps the group and it helps our archival material gathering. Win/win. We will continue to find other areas to serve groups as the need arises.

Oral History Groups are joining our efforts in growing our Audio Library by recording speaker meetings. Tricia S. remains our Boerne team lead (Boerne, Kerrville and Bandera). She is expanding her team, reaching further into the hill country, thus making more audio recording possible. Our goal for the year is to complete 20 oral histories and capture the experiences of older members.

Events and Display The committee will continue to provide quarterly workshops and participate in Weekend in SA (a huge success for us this year). Our events coordinator will make sure that all service committee event planning members know that the displays are available and offered. We will also be looking for groups to host the Spring Fling. This has been successful in the past, offering the Committee an opportunity to share with the fellowship some of our story. This event has been a long-timers panel of sorts or an evening presentation. We have an unspecified goal of carrying mini-displays to as many group meetings as possible.

Service History This new effort to capture growth and history of the service organizations in our area went well this year due to a capable and enthusiastic committee member. The project awaits a new lead who will keep it rolling.

Outgoing Chairperson Observations Working with Archives has been a great service opportunity. The committee has been a dedicated group all about serving the fellowship. I hope the new group gets as much joy out of serving on the Archives Committee as I have.

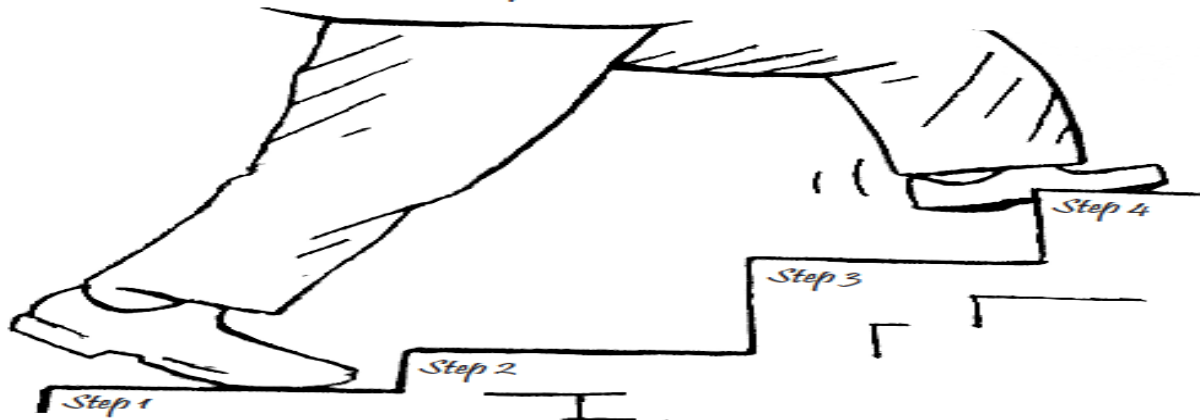

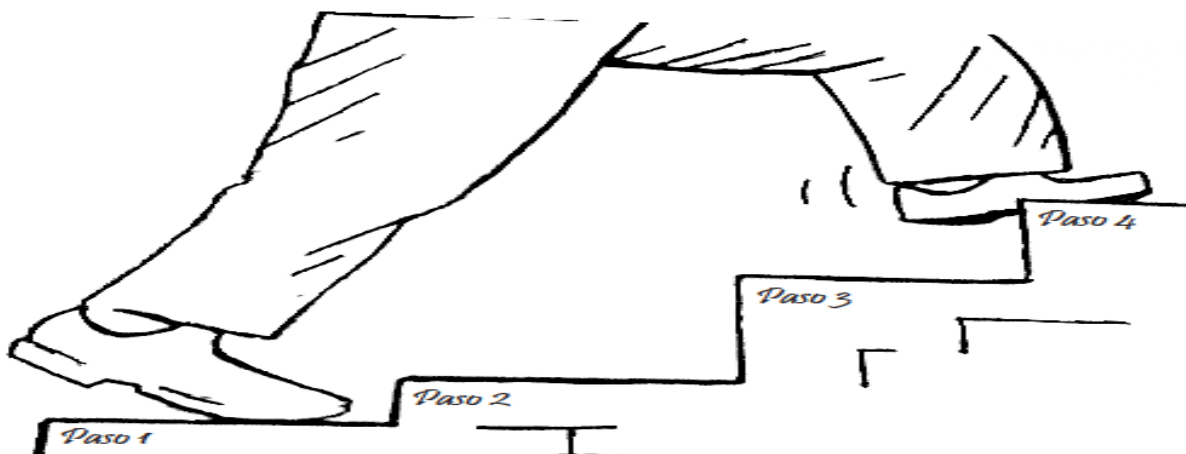
