As we grow spiritually, we find that our old attitudes toward our instinctual drives need to undergo drastic revisions. Our demands for emotional security and wealth, for personal prestige and power all have to be tempered and redirected.

We learn the full satisfaction of these demands cannot be the sole end and aim of our lives. We cannot place the cart before the horse, or we shall be pulled backward into disillusionment. But when we are willing to place spiritual growth first--then and only then do we have a real chance to grow in healthy awareness and mature love.

Where Have All the AAs Gone?

Remember the old Pete Seeger song from when we were young? I am reminded of that song as I sit in an AA meeting missing so many of my longtime AA friends. I worry about them, hope they're sober, and living a purposeful, joyous life. I wonder if they've gone to another home group or just left AA altogether. Some of them I see on their sobriety birthdays to collect a chip. It's a relief to see them then, but I still have a feeling of uneasiness, wondering if I'll see them again the next year. Our longstanding cliché, "meeting makers make it" seems to hold true, but offers no guarantees of sobriety. We have to work the program. We have to work the steps and be of service to others.

It seems the pandemic has dwindled AA meeting attendance, and service involvement as well. Just my own perspective as a longtime service advocate, I don't see the commitment, the passion for AA service that used to be so prevalent. I don't see nearly as many pre- and post-meeting gatherings. I don't notice as many sponsor-sponsee pairings before or after a meeting visiting, working the steps, in the next room over. It has me concerned, and wondering if our program will always be there for those who need it.

I guess all I can do is my part, meet with my sponsor, work with others, carry the message. I can pray for those friends who I don't see much of these days. And I can pray for AA, that we come through the pandemic, the apathy, and be the hand of AA that is always there. I suppose that's all we can do, our part to keep AA there for the next man and woman who seek a solution to the hopeless state of mind and body that we know as the progressive disease of alcoholism.
