Getting back out

After two years of COVID, a member wonders what the new normal will look like and what challenges lie ahead

I'll be blunt. The "reopening" of the world does not excite me, and I'm not alone in my opinion. I am joined in this sentiment by hordes of like-minded introverts, those who got comfortable working from home, as well as many of us recovering alcoholics. I don't speak for all of us, as many are perfectly comfortable at parties and gatherings. Over time in recovery these are social settings we must learn to cope with and attend with grace. After all, they do say the opposite of addiction is connection, but with whom we connect and where we connect gets tricky.

We in AA are told to stay away from "people, places, and things." To name a few, we have those friends who still drink like they're in college, that street corner we once met our dealer on, or that beer poster hanging in our bedroom. We're told the only thing we have to change is everything. For the social component of this change, the past two years handed us a reprieve from creative excuse-making to get out of social obligations.

However, for me and, I imagine, many other sober folks, the greater reprieve was the absence of any fear of missing out. As I sat in my childhood bedroom keeping busy with a virtual workday, naps, meditation, books and social media, I took a selfish solace in knowing so many others were similarly confined. Today I tremble with nerves as the world opens its doors to alcoholics and non-alcoholics alike.

I will of course acknowledge that the world is better off as it safely reopens, but I can't help feeling left out, bummed and subsequently guilty, as if my fear and sadness are unfounded. The public's joy and excitement are hard-earned and long awaited, but my heart breaks when I see a super crowded club doing group sing-alongs. I'm embarrassed that I yearn to be a part of this crowd, but sobriety in this setting means a hyper-awareness of sweat, liquor fumes and a scared inner shyness. Perhaps this is a yearning I should have grown out of by now.

For any non-alcoholic readers who haven't had their drinking privileges revoked, I ask you to think about what you most look forward to as getting back to shops, bars and social events return. I imagine an honest survey would include concerts, clubs and parties in at least the top 10.

I imagine my 12-year-old sober self, the one who used to get excited for school dances and Yankee games, and I try to summon his energy. Bars should be fun because you get to see your friends. Concerts should be fun because you hear your favorite music. Sitting in airports should be fun because, well, never mind. Twelve-year-old me would most likely tell me to suck it up and go engage with friends.

In sobriety, I have learned that my anxieties, such as those outlined above, fall into the category of "leaves in the swimming pool" problems. I'm reminded that I have plenty to be grateful for and that if the specifics of my social life are my biggest concern, then I'm probably doing pretty well.

After a recent period of so much suffering, I have plenty to look forward to as the world reopens, but my reentering into the world will look different than most. It will include in-person recovery meetings, gallons of coffee, and yes—if I'm ready—social gatherings with old friends from my previous life.

So to my fellow millennials in recovery, let's practice what we preach and fake it until we make it as we discover what the new normal will look like for us.







STORY SOLICITATION

Fifth Edition of the Book Alcoholics Anonymous —Big Book Deadline for submissions: October 31, 2022 Online submission: aa.org/submit-bigbook-english-5th

The Preface to the Second Edition of the Big Book explains that revisions to the personal history section of the book were made in order "to represent the current membership of Alcoholics Anonymous more accurately, and thereby to reach more Alcoholics." In that spirit, the 2021 General Service Conference recommended that "a Fifth Edition of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect the current membership, keeping in mind the 1995 Advisory Action:

"The first 164 pages of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, the Preface, the Forewords, 'The Doctor's Opinion', 'Dr. Bob's Nightmare", and the Appendices remain as is."

In response to the 2021 General Service Conference Advisory Action requesting the development of a Fifth edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*, the trustees' Literature Committee is seeking a wide range of A.A. recovery experience of members in the Fellowship.

The trustees' Literature Committee is searching for recovery stories of our members for possible inclusion in the Fifth Edition which are from a broad cross-section of our local communities, all stories are of value. As Bill writes on page 29 of the book Alcoholics Anonymous: "Our hope is that many alcoholic men and women, desperately in need, will see these pages, and we believe that it is only by fully disclosing ourselves and our problems that they will persuaded to say, "Yes, I am one of them too; I must have this thing."

It is the Literature Committee's shared hope that any new stories from our current membership will help future alcoholics to identify and find recovery in the pages of a Fifth edition. The suggested format for typed manuscripts is 3500 words, double spaced, in 12-point font. Handwritten manuscripts should be approximately 5 to 6 pages. Please include your complete name, address, and email/phone information on the first page of the submission. A copy of your manuscript should be retained for your files.

The anonymity of all authors will be observed whether their story is selected for publication or not. Stories will be accepted in English, French or Spanish. If you have any questions, please write to <u>5BBStory@aa.org</u>.

What if you needed a meeting and couldn't get to one?

There may be no greater population of alcoholics in need than those who live behind the walls. They don't have the option of pulling up the AA Meetings app and finding the nearest meeting to fit into a time slot convenient in their schedule. They depend upon **you** and **me** to bring a meeting to them, to offer our individual message of experience, strength, and hope.

The purpose of the Correctional Facilities Committee is to coordinate the work of individual AA members and groups who are interested in carrying our message of recovery to alcoholics behind the walls, and to set up means of smoothing the way from the facility to the larger AA community through pre-release and contacts.

How can you help? Be part of a rotation team to carry a meeting into the prison

- Minimum 1 year sobriety
- Get certified (see below)
- Commitment of 1-2 meetings per month, 2 hours per meeting
- Men and women both allowed

You do NOT have to have been incarcerated to carry the message

Correspondence/Sponsorship by Mail Program

Write and sponsor an inmate

Minimum 1 year sobriety & worked all 12 Steps

Volunteer to be a pre-release AA contact

- Minimum 1 year sobriety & worked all 12 Steps
- Get released individual to a meeting within 24 hours

Responsibility ends at this point

Donate to the CFC can in meetings to aid in the purchase of Big Books for the alcoholic behind the walls, or mail donations to CFC, PO Box 33866, San Antonio, TX 78265
