Chairman's Corner

My name is Omri R., and I am honored to serve as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. As a trustee, we help ensure the Central Service Office stays open year-round, the phone line is answered 24 hours a day, the website is current, literature is stocked, and that all budgetary items are met throughout the year (among other things). I wanted to use this opportunity to talk a little about general service work.

The general service structure of A.A. is perhaps relatively known (or unknown, as it were) to members, even some who have been active in the program for a few years. Here's a slight refresher: Each group elects a General Service Representative (G.S.R) which represents the voice of the group conscience – G.S.R.'s attend district committee meetings and area assemblies where matters affecting the entire area are discussed relating to carrying the A.A. message – every area elects an Area Delegate to attend and participate in the General Service Conference in New York each April.

A.A. runs its own affairs without any outside interference, so each A.A. group needs to make its voice heard on overall A.A. policies. Each group has its say via the group's G.S.R. Through this service structure, each group can have its voice heard in Worldwide A.A. Groups send their own ideas or problems to the assembly, other groups share their experience and maybe help, and from the assembly each G.S.R. can take back to the group the experience of other groups.

There is the famous story (perhaps A.A. folklore) of the blind A.A. member who asked his group if there was a Big Book available in braille. At the time, there wasn't. The group's G.S.R. went to the district meeting to suggest this idea. Then the idea was passed along to the Delegate at the Area Assembly, then made its way to New York, and the braille Big Book was published! This is how A.A. is supposed to work. All parts of our Fellowship – group meetings, committees, offices, conferences – working together.

We all have one joint purpose: to help the alcoholic who still suffers. But in order for A.A. to run itself, we must have a system for finding out how A.A. as a whole feels about its world affairs and how it wants to operate. We need constant, honest communication from one part of A.A. to the other. If a group does not have an active G.S.R or C.S.O.R., it is isolated from the rest of the Fellowship. It does not participate in the group conscience of A.A. as a whole! We at the board of trustees are here to help in any way we can and encourage everyone to please reach out to the office with any questions or comments.

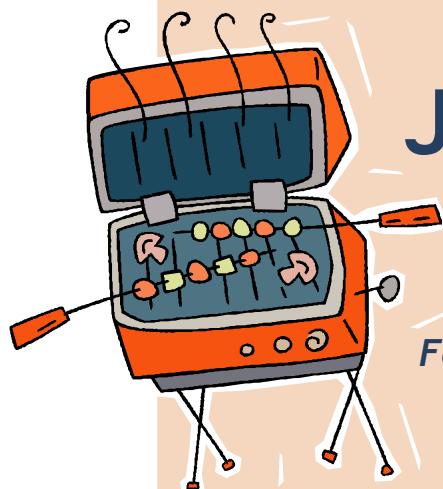

STORY SOLICITATION

Fifth Edition of the Book *Alcoholics Anonymous* —Big Book

Deadline for submissions: October 31, 2022

Online submission: aa.org/submit-bigbook-english-5th

The Preface to the Second Edition of the Big Book explains that revisions to the personal history section of the book were made in order "to represent the current membership of Alcoholics Anonymous more accurately, and thereby to reach more Alcoholics."

In that spirit, the 2021 General Service Conference recommended that "a Fifth Edition of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect the current membership, keeping in mind the 1995 Advisory Action:

"The first 164 pages of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, the Preface, the Forewords, 'The Doctor's Opinion', 'Dr. Bob's Nightmare', and the Appendices remain as is."

In response to the 2021 General Service Conference Advisory Action requesting the development of a Fifth edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*, the trustees' Literature Committee is seeking a wide range of A.A. recovery experience of members in the Fellowship.

The trustees' Literature Committee is searching for recovery stories of our members for possible inclusion in the Fifth Edition which are from a broad cross-section of our local communities, all stories are of value. As Bill writes on page 29 of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*: "Our hope is that many alcoholic men and women, desperately in need, will see these pages, and we believe that it is only by fully disclosing ourselves and our problems that they will be persuaded to say, 'Yes, I am one of them too; I must have this thing.'"

It is the Literature Committee's shared hope that any new stories from our current membership will help future alcoholics to identify and find recovery in the pages of a Fifth edition.

The suggested format for typed manuscripts is 3500 words, double spaced, in 12-point font. Handwritten manuscripts should be approximately 5 to 6 pages. Please include your complete name, address, and email/phone information on the first page of the submission. A copy of your manuscript should be retained for your files.

The anonymity of all authors will be observed whether their story is selected for publication or not. Stories will be accepted in English, French or Spanish. If you have any questions, please write to 5BBStory@aa.org.

The AA Responsibility Declaration

“When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there, and for that I am responsible.”

When was the last time you considered how this statement applies? When I said it, I thought of those outside our fellowship; but since I’ve joined the Accessibility Committee, I’m seeing it in a whole new light. This committee’s goal is so much more than just ensuring people can get into an AA meeting. It is more than addressing the need for a ramp or how to avoid stairs.

The Accessibility Committee tries to make the message of Alcoholics Anonymous available to all who need it. This applies to all who have difficulty participating in our Program, whether those limiting factors are mental, physical, geographic, cultural, spiritual, or emotional. We also need to look at issues related to changing health, age, or social norms.

Those who have been around the fellowship for any time at all know we need to share the message if we hope to keep it. We CANNOT assume everyone has the same ability to grasp this program. What are the significant obstacles preventing participation in A.A? Some issues may not be easily identified. Someone may be dealing with confusion due to changes in medication; another may have difficulty hearing because of background noise. They may choose to hide their challenges because they don’t want to draw attention to themselves or their situation.

How do we continue to support someone with a long-term illness, a member who becomes homebound, a person who moves to a retirement facility, or others who experience vision or hearing changes? Some may have difficulty learning, reading, or processing information, and others may have mobility-related needs. Literature may become hard to understand. Caregivers may have young children, a partner, or a parent with issues that make it impossible for them to attend regular meetings. What about mental health challenges associated with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) or other illnesses?

What can we do to make A.A. accessible to all? There is no one answer for every situation. Your Accessibility Committee tries to identify resources in the area, but their efforts require everyone’s participation. We are looking for new ways to educate the membership on a broader understanding of what accessibility means to AA. How is your group helping people to participate? How do we share resources in the San Antonio area? No one group needs to have all the answers for every person with a challenge; however, all groups should be able to recommend a meeting where individual needs can be met. What recommendations do you have to overcome obstacles? For example, how can changing the arrangement of the room help. Seeing a person’s face may help some “hear better”? What about using “Access to the AA message” as a topic for a discussion meeting? Ensuring A.A. remains as inclusive as possible to all alcoholics will take time, awareness, and discussing what it means to each of us.

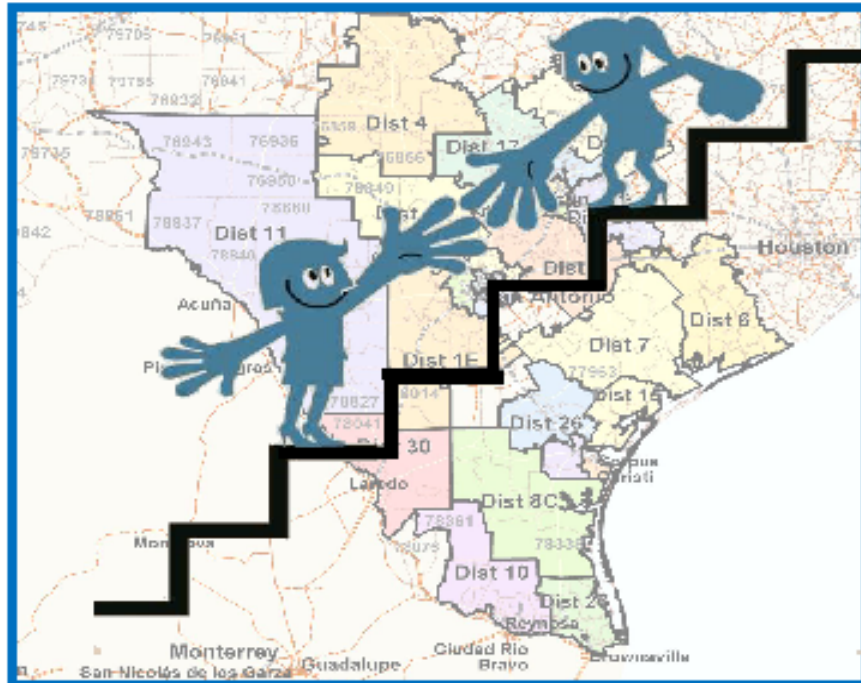

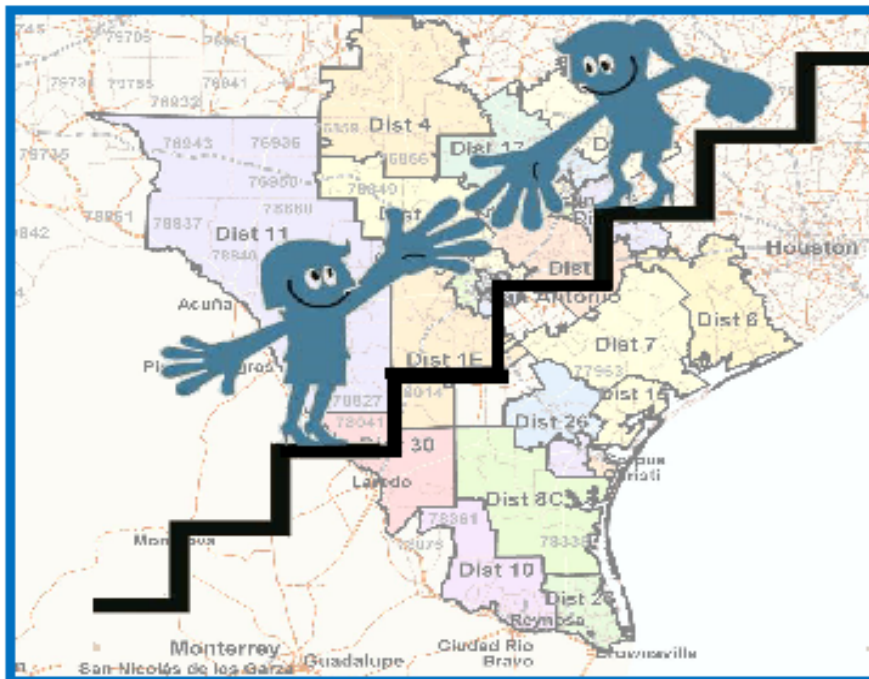
