My name is Omri R., and I am honored to serve as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. As a trustee, we help ensure the Central Service Office stays open year-round, the phone line is answered 24 hours a day, the website is current, literature is stocked, and that all budgetary items are met throughout the year (among other things). I wanted to use this opportunity to talk a little about general service work.

The general service structure of A.A. is perhaps relatively known (or unknown, as it were) to members, even some who have been active in the program for a few years. Here's a slight refresher: Each group elects a General Service Representative (G.S.R) which represents the voice of the group conscience – G.S.R.'s attend district committee meetings and area assemblies where matters affecting the entire area are discussed relating to carrying the A.A. message – every area elects an Area Delegate to attend and participate in the General Service Conference in New York each April.

A.A. runs its own affairs without any outside interference, so each A.A. group needs to make its voice heard on overall A.A. policies. Each group has its say via the group's G.S.R. Through this service structure, each group can have its voice heard in Worldwide A.A. Groups send their own ideas or problems to the assembly, other groups share their experience and maybe help, and from the assembly each G.S.R. can take back to the group the experience of other groups.

There is the famous story (perhaps A.A. folklore) of the blind A.A. member who asked his group if there was a Big Book available in braille. At the time, there wasn't. The group's G.S.R. went to the district meeting to suggest this idea. Then the idea was passed along to the Delegate at the Area Assembly, then made its way to New York, and the braille Big Book was published! This is how A.A. is supposed to work. All parts of our Fellowship – group meetings, committees, offices, conferences – working together.

We all have one joint purpose: to help the alcoholic who still suffers. But in order for A.A. to run itself, we must have a system for finding out how A.A. as a whole feels about its world affairs and how it wants to operate. We need constant, honest communication from one part of A.A. to the other. If a group does not have an active G.S.R or C.S.O.R., it is isolated from the rest of the Fellowship. It does not participate in the group conscience of A.A. as a whole! We at the board of trustees are here to help in any way we can and encourage everyone to please reach out to the office with any questions or comments.



Archives Page Article

This past May 14th, the Archives Committee presented our Spring Fling Event that was hosted by The Airport Group. The meeting was held in the Christ Lutheran Church's fellowship Hall from 2-4pm on a Saturday afternoon. The planning for this event started in February. The first task for the Archives Committee was to find a group willing to host the event. As a new member to the committee, they asked if my home group, the Airport Group would host the event. The Airport Group had a group conscience and determined we did not want it to replace our normal Wednesday night meeting, so we agreed that if the church would provide the hall for a Saturday afternoon event in May then we could host the event. The church agreed and it was decided along with the Archives Committee that the event could take place on Saturday afternoon May 14th. The Archives committee also asked if one of the Airport Group's members, Shane K, would be willing to be the guest speaker for this event and he graciously accepted the invitation.

In planning this event the committee was responsible for all refreshments, a small PA system and volunteers to help set up prior and tear down after the event. The first thing I had to learn was to trust in a higher power that all the details would fall into place as planned. Set up began about an hour before the event & volunteers from the committee and the Airport Group showed up to help. Folks donated coffee and pastries for which the committee was very grateful for. The committee provide beverages, and everything was set up in the church's kitchen, which was adjacent to the Fellowship Hall. The archives committee set up various displays on tables for the attendees to peruse through.

The Spring Fling event started at 2pm with the Serenity Prayer, followed by the Archives Committee Missions Statement read by our committee member Sydney C. The first hour was comprised of Rheanna E., the committee's Group Historian, doing a presentation about the importance of documentation of Group Histories. After her presentation, it was opened to the floor for questions anyone might have about Group Histories and documentation. Rheanna's presentation was followed up by a presentation about Oral Histories by our Oral Historian, Mike C. Mike meets with people to record their oral histories on an as needed basis. In addition, Mike talked about the quarterly Oral History Workshops conducted by the Archives Committee. After a question-and-answer session a short break for refreshments occurred. At the top of the 2nd hour of the event I introduced our guest speaker, Shane K. Shane, who is originally from Australia, shared his story about how he came to be a member of AA sharing his experiences, how he found his strength in a higher power and how service work is an important part of his sobriety today. There was a memorable section of Shane's talk where he compared the fellowship akin to being a flock of sheep. The sheep that stay with the herd have a great chance of survival, but the ones who stray will get picked off by the wolves in waiting. Shane received a round of applause by the folks that attended, which was about 35 people. Afterwards, a seventh tradition basket was passed. The committee's event coordinator, Sam H., concluded the event with everyone's participation in the Lord's Prayer.

This event was a wonderful experience, and but for the Grace of God, went off without a hitch. The money collected in the seventh tradition was donated to the Church for which they were very grateful. The Archives committee is very grateful to all who helped make this a successful event.

We are now in the planning stages of our Fall Fling Event for October called the R.O.O.T.S. (Remember Our Old Timers thru their Stories). It will be a pot luck event with several old timer guest speakers.


