A Deep Breath

Gratitude is a condition of the soul, she says, and the act of writing it down gives her peace

Gratitude has been a foundation for my life since July of 1996. My gratitude began the second day I stayed sober for a 24-hour period. I remember it well because that was the 4th of July, a day I would be typically drowning in liquor.

The thing that helped me the most when my husband left me after 16 years of marriage was writing a gratitude list every night, which consisted of at least five things for which I could be grateful. Some days the list consisted of very simple things like, “Grateful this day has finally ended,” and “Grateful I had enough to eat today,” and “Grateful I got out of bed today.” On other days, my list was full of amazing things like, “Grateful that I’m able to shovel the snow and enjoy the quiet hush that the blanket of snow on the ground provides,” and “Grateful that I can travel to a foreign country by myself and not be afraid of asking for directions or help.”

Staying in an attitude of gratitude is what has allowed me to finally come to a place of forgiveness toward my now-ex-husband. I realized that in order to stay in a place of gratitude, I had to let go of that burdensome resentment and anger. It weighed me down spiritually and emotionally. I realized that gratitude and anger could not co-exist in my soul. If I was vigilant in searching daily for things to be grateful for, I did not have much time left over to go to that place of anger and resentment. I just could not stay grateful and be angry at the same time.

Most of the time now gratitude wins hands down. Staying angry or resentful just takes too much out of me, while it takes very little energy to remain grateful. I find that I can be grateful and still have plenty of energy left over for participating in my life and all the things it has to offer.

Gratitude is a state of mind, an emotion, an attitude, a condition of the soul, a prayer (if you will). I find that after writing in my gratitude journal, I feel as if I’ve just taken a very deep breath and released it ever so slowly. A feeling of peace always comes over me while I’m journaling. I’ve found that no matter what life has to offer, if I stay in an attitude of gratitude, I can pretty much deal with anything.

- Currently, the reserve fund is at 6.33 months.
- (They are looking to increase this to 9-12 months of operating expense in this fund)

This is Patrick C., your 2025 International Convention Coordinator. We are exactly 268 days away from the 2025 International Convention and the excitement is palpable.

Planning is on task, and I thank you all for your loving support and your patience.

In the past weeks, Showcare has processed emails sent in by attendees. We have over 22,000 attendees who have registered.

The high demand has impacted the availability in our “official room block.” With the enthusiasm being so high for the 2025 International Convention, we sold out earlier this time around.

We are doing the following things to address the situation:

1) We are reaching back out to all hotels for additional rooms. This is what we have done for previous conventions to adjust inventory.

We are adding rooms. You can regularly check for availability in the “official room block” and book rooms if they become available by returning to your registration record online. The link is in your registration confirmation.

2) In the **Online Registration and Housing system** we have links to alternative housing that is available outside our room block and in the greater Vancouver area, including hotel rooms, Airbnb and housing at local universities. The university housing includes breakfast!

Purchase the *2025 International Convention Three Big Meetings Video Product*. It will be an anonymity-protected video recording available for viewing after the Convention is over. Cost is \$60 (USD)

To wrap up, we are now in the normal process that occurs after the major push on the first days of registration.

Remember, each attendee and their friends will have an experience. The fellowship we seek can be found from across the world. New friends are waiting to be made. First time in-person connections from so many who, to date, have only met in online groups and meetings.



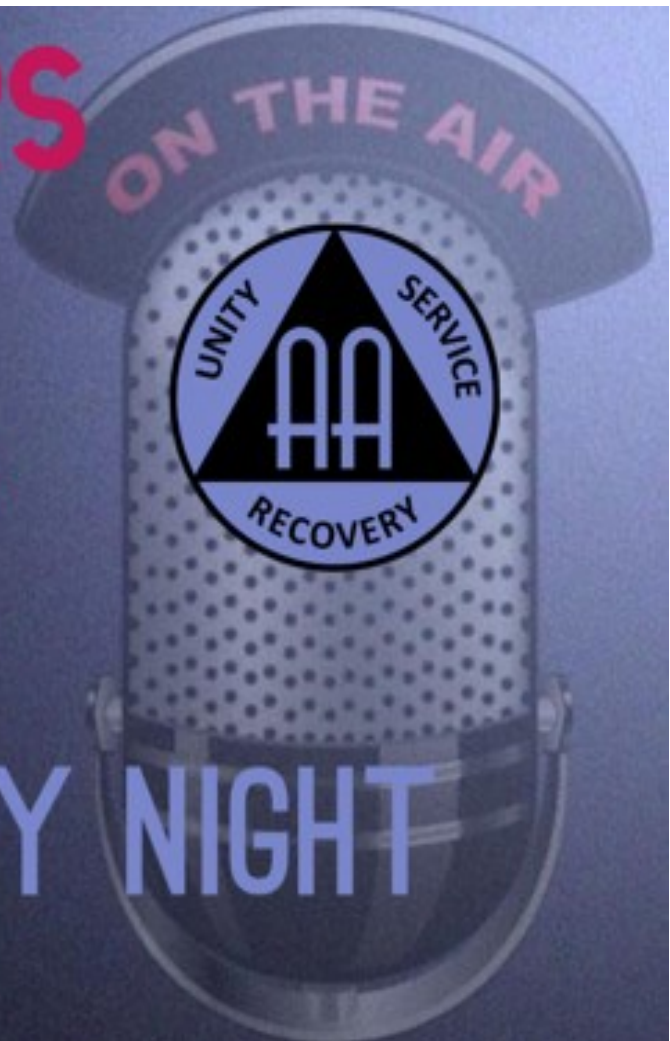
