Chairperson's Corner

As March approaches, I've been reflecting on Tradition Two: "For our group purpose, there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern."

When I began my journey in AA service, I initially found the concept of group conscience to be limiting. I saw numerous areas for improvement and believed that if things were done my way, we could "fix" AA. Looking back, I chuckle at my own ego and self-importance.

Early in my sobriety, I was elected General Service Representative (GSR) for my home group. Eager to make a difference, I prepared a detailed agenda for our first group conscience meeting, filled with proposals I was certain would be embraced. To my surprise, after thorough discussion, every single proposal was voted down. I was shocked and disheartened; it hadn't occurred to me that my ideas wouldn't be met with unanimous approval.

After the meeting, several members approached me, thanked me for my service, and commended me on a job well done. I was perplexed—how could they think I did well when all my suggestions were rejected?

Through time and guidance from mentors in the program, I came to understand that my role wasn't to enforce my ideas but to show up, honor my commitments, ensure everyone had a chance to share their perspectives, and help the still-suffering alcoholic. The outcome wasn't my responsibility; it was up to my Higher Power, expressed through an informed group conscience.

This realization transformed my approach to service work in AA. I shifted from trying to impose my will to focusing on being present and helpful, trusting that the outcome would unfold as it should.

Applying this principle in all areas of my life has been immensely beneficial. Instead of attempting to control others' behavior, I concentrate on being present and supportive. What a relief it is not to be in charge! Chris C.





San Antonio AA Archives Committee and Archivist Mission Statement:



The mission of the San Antonio AA Archives and Archivist is to collect and permanently document the work of Alcoholics Anonymous in the San Antonio Metropolitan Area and the AA districts it serves. Archives are accessible to AA members and other researchers. The Committee and Archivist will cooperate with and support other AA archives and archivists working within the AA's services structure and the 12 Traditions.

AA Service Means Working Together.

CO-FOUNDER BILL W. summed up the attitude of AAs toward their "leaders" in this way: "Act for us, but don't boss us." Having been active in the AA service structure for some time now, I have read those words more than once. However, only now is their importance being made clear to me, out of my own experience as a trusted servant.

Especially when we are brand-new at a service job, we need to fall in step and work with those we serve, for the good of all concerned. Too often, we do not, and we are rejected by the very people we are trying to act for. As a result, the turnover in general service jobs is tremendous, especially at the group level.

The important thing is that we all work together and get the job done to the best of our ability. The more often we can sit down together and talk over our difficulties and responsibilities, the more in unity we will be, thus creating a better atmosphere for the suffering alcoholic's recovery in this great Fellowship.

With individual members, we can share, ask questions, and encourage them to be part of the whole program. With our group, we can come to meetings early and stay late, doing our part of the chores and sharing with group members. When I was using my mouth only, most were not interested in what I had to say. When I work together with others, they seem only too eager to hear what I can pass on to them.

We should always make sure the group is well informed on any matter before asking for an expression of the group conscience. No matter how good I believe a thing is for the group, if it causes disunity and is not accepted, it will affect the good of AA as a whole.

Each group's general service representative (GSR) must work constructively as part of the whole service structure, passing on the group conscience in harmony at group, district, and area levels. Whenever in doubt, it is best for him or her to go back and talk with the group, remembering that the group conscience is the only boss in Alcoholics Anonymous.

It seems to me that many of us, as individuals and as group members, are isolated from the Steps, Traditions, sponsorship, and active group membership, and especially from the service structure. Those of us who become active in service of some kind become involved in the program beyond our individual and home-group interests. We can then reap the benefits of the program at more than one level. Remember, we can keep only as much as we are willing to give away.







Gross profit was \$19,123 after deducting <u>Cost</u> of Goods Sold. Yearly expenses in January put the group in the red for the month but still <u>looking</u> good overall. There are many added expenses at the beginning of the <u>year</u> so this is not unusual. Financial Report was approved.

Service Opportunities from Inter-Service Representatives:

- Treatment/H&I- Treatment/H&I is finishing up their list of facilities that would like a meeting brough to them. <u>Should</u> be completed by the end of March. Putting together a training workshop for April, more info to come.
- CFC- CFC reported that the training event earlier in the month was <u>well-attended</u> and went well.
