Sometimes, even in the midst of an active Program, I find myself doubting my Higher Power. I believe—deeply—and I have countless examples of miracles in my life. But even with double-digit years of sobriety, there are moments when doubt creeps in. I catch myself wondering, “Maybe *this* just isn’t meant to be,” or “Maybe I just don’t get to have *this*.”

Even though I have no real reason to doubt—when I can rattle off a list as long as my arm of the gifts I’ve been given and the promises that have come true—I still do. And yet, without fail, if I continue to “trudge the road of happy destiny,” I always wake up one day and realize that the problem or worry that had consumed me has been resolved.

In these moments, I’m reminded—and deeply grateful—that my recovery isn’t about having the strongest or most enlightened spiritual life. It’s about the continued maintenance of my spiritual life. *Maintenance*—the ongoing process of caring for something with regular attention and intention.

I have a recent example. A few months ago, I found myself questioning whether my life was as rich or full as it could be. I’d scroll through social media, seeing people post about fun times and friendships, and I wondered—*Do I have that? Do those kinds of friends exist in my life?*

Yes, I know social media is the absolute last place to go looking for clarity—but this is a program of rigorous honesty, and that’s what I was feeling.

So, I did what all of you taught me. I prayed, journaled, and kept trudging. Then, not long ago, I woke up and just had to laugh. God had done it again—quietly, perfectly—without me even realizing it.

When my dog, Tati, passed away suddenly, I was devastated. But the number of people who reached out—calls, texts, hugs, cards—was overwhelming. And when those same friends showed up again to celebrate my MBA graduation, I was humbled beyond words. My family was there every step of the way, supporting me through heartbreak and joy.

So yes, my life *is* full. And I am truly grateful. None of it would be possible without my Higher Power, the Fellowship, and this Program.

March

2025

Monday March 17, 2024*

Devon opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer.

Sarah B. read from CSOR sign-in sheet & call on those joining on Zoom:

She asked the CSORs to please announce any changes in schedule, location, or events upcoming.

Sarah B. reminded everybody to please check your Group information is correct on the website.

Introduced Trustees Present including new members.

Introduced Service Committee Chairs.

Reviewed and approved February minutes.

Board Financial Report for January: Jim reported that SA CSO financials in good standing.

Contributions totalled to \$13,354 for the month of February.

Question was raised about in-store versus online sales; in-store sales are higher in general. Jim will provide an exact percentage breakdown at next meeting.

Financial Report was approved.

Service Opportunities from Inter-Service Representatives:

- Treatment/H&I- Christy reported that several treatment facilities have requested Big Books to have available for groups that take a meeting to the facilities. Treatment is working on filling those requests.
- CFC- Kikki reported that CFC is currently serving a total of 16 correctional units, and is receiving several requests for AA literature for inmates and chaplains.
- Grapevine/La Vina-
- Accessibility- Lori reported that the Safety in AA Meetings workshop held last month was a success, with a total of 25 attendees from different groups and 2 guest speakers.
- The Archives- Christy reported that the Archives currently has several open service positions that need to be filled. See flyer in What's Happening for more information. A Storage Cleanout Day is scheduled for April 19th from 9AM-3PM, volunteers welcome. Archives is working on making it so that Old Timer's recordings are available to the community, more info to come. They are also putting together a group to start digitizing old audio recordings for preservation.
- After Hours Telephone Committee- Andrina is looking for a volunteer for

the Saturday Overnight shift on the phone helpline. New information packets for volunteers are available at the Central Office; these packets include updated information since our phone service has changed.

CSO Board Chairperson Report: Reviewed and approved minutes from February Board meeting. Chris reported that site visits for the upcoming CSO Anniversary Gala are still forthcoming. More info to come.

A more efficient method of mass e-mailing has been found using our current Go-Daddy service, so the group is no longer looking at changing to MailChimp/other services.

CSO Managers Report: Jim reiterated that the new phone system is going well, please report any issues to the CSO so they can be addressed. This goes for any issues with the CSO website as well.

Microsoft is discontinuing Microsoft Publisher; CSO has about 600 Publisher files that need to be converted to PDF. Looking at software options to assist with this process, more info to come.

Old Business:

-Nominating Committee: Need a nominating committee as we will be electing 4 new Board Members later this year. Alex, Ed, Virginia, and Devon volunteered for the nominating committee. Question was raised about changing the eligibility requirements for Board Members; current Board will discuss at next meeting and report on any changes.

New Business:

-AA in SA set for October 4th. Planning Committee will be meeting on March 27th. Currently seeking volunteers to help with the AA in SA event as well as for fundraising events leading up to AA in SA.
