Our primary purpose is to carry the message of AA to the still-suffering alcoholic. It is a simple charge, but it is not always easy. When I think of the lengths people went to help me when I first came into the Program, I am humbled. From answering the phone, calling me out on my BS, meeting me at a meeting every day for an entire month, working the steps with me, the list goes on and on.

I must have called my sponsor every day, multiple times a day, for a year (or more). Yet he always answered. I certainly never did anything to deserve or earn that kind of love and compassion. But he knew, as I now know, that the only way to keep my sobriety is to give it away. My responsibility is to be available and willing to do the same for the next alcoholic who needs help.

I also recognize that I often fall short of that simple and sacred charge: to help the still suffering alcoholic, ensuring that the hand of AA is always there. To live up to this responsibility, I must always put AA first, keeping my ego and pride in check and striving to build and maintain the unity of our Fellowship. Without unity, especially when disagreements arise, we risk failing in our primary purpose. And if we fail, the suffering alcoholic will go unhelped and may die (or worse).

I was recently reminded that no matter what controversy arises in AA, or what decisions are made that I may not agree with, none of it will ever stop me from opening the doors to my meeting. If I truly trust my Higher Power, what am I worried about? AA endures because of its beautiful simplicity: one alcoholic talking to another. Each of us has our own story of someone who was there for us when we needed it most, with a cup of coffee, a smile, a hard truth, or a timely suggestion. And because of that, we are compelled to be there for the next drunk who walks through the door.

And so it goes. Regardless of controversy, mistakes, or disagreements, we keep showing up. We make sure the doors of AA stay open for the next person in line, trusting our Higher Power to take care of the rest. And for that, I am truly grateful.

Most of the articles in the magazine are written by members of the Fellowship, and you can contribute stories, jokes, and more.

There are 8-10 new stories added every month; with an online subscription you also have access to the Story Archive from 1944 to the present!

In July 1996 AA Grapevine began publishing La Viña, a bimonthly Spanish magazine.

What would happen to AA’s image if no one was available to answer questions and provide information to the public. Imagine no literature quickly obtainable. Not to mention that eager 12th-step volunteers never got calls from Central Service asking them to go to the aid of an alcoholic who wants to get sober. Yet, worst of all, picture in your mind’s eye that an alcoholic is given the gift of desperation, they want help, but there is nowhere to call.....

He represents the AA’s who regularly call for information about AA activities and group information. He could be a volunteer who answers the phone, participates in monthly mailings or volunteers as a speaker. After Hours Telephone Committee- Sarah B. reported that all shifts are covered, but we always need backups. The Helpline was able to provide assistance to 269 alcoholics during the past month.

CSO Board Chairperson Report: Reviewed minutes from March Board meeting.
