Chairperson's Corner

Our primary purpose is to carry the message of AA to the still-suffering alcoholic. It is a simple charge, but it is not always easy. When I think of the lengths people went to help me when I first came into the Program, I am humbled. From answering the phone, calling me out on my BS, meeting me at a meeting every day for an entire month, working the steps with me, the list goes on and on.

I must have called my sponsor every day, multiple times a day, for a year (or more). Yet he always answered. I certainly never did anything to deserve or earn that kind of love and compassion. But he knew, as I now know, that the only way to keep my sobriety is to give it away. My responsibility is to be available and willing to do the same for the next alcoholic who needs help.

I also recognize that I often fall short of that simple and sacred charge: to help the still suffering alcoholic, ensuring that the hand of AA is always there. To live up to this responsibility, I must always put AA first, keeping my ego and pride in check and striving to build and maintain the unity of our Fellowship. Without unity, especially when disagreements arise, we risk failing in our primary purpose. And if we fail, the suffering alcoholic will go unhelped and may die (or worse).

I was recently reminded that no matter what controversy arises in AA, or what decisions are made that I may not agree with, none of it will ever stop me from opening the doors to my meeting. If I truly trust my Higher Power, what am I worried about? AA endures because of its beautiful simplicity: one alcoholic talking to another. Each of us has our own story of someone who was there for us when we needed it most, with a cup of coffee, a smile, a hard truth, or a timely suggestion. And because of that, we are compelled to be there for the next drunk who walks through the door.

And so it goes. Regardless of controversy, mistakes, or disagreements, we keep showing up. We make sure the doors of AA stay open for the next person in line, trusting our Higher Power to take care of the rest. And for that, I am truly grateful.

An A.A. member named Tom T. had another drinking dream last night. This one was different from the others. He dreamt that there was no Central Service Office in San Antonio.



Yet, worst of all, picture in your mind's eye that an alcoholic is given the gift of desperation, they want help, but there is nowhere to call......

He could be a volunteer who answers the phone, participates in monthly mailings or volunteers as a speaker. 




