never married or had children; drinking
took away my choice. Denial is a funny
thing; it seemed like I chose to remain
aloof and free-spirited, but the truth is, I
didn't have a choice. Alcohol always
won.

Today, I have a wonderful husband
(from the rooms of AA) and more and
more "children" that I call sponsees. God
has a plan for all of us. All I have to do
is trust in my Higher Power and, by gol-
ly; I get to see the world from His palm.

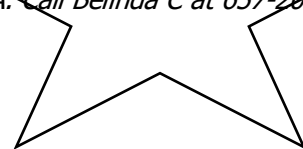
